School of Vocational Studies Orientation Programme 2025–26



The School of Vocational Studies (SVS), Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi, organized its Orientation Programme for the newly admitted students of the 2025–26 batch across BVoc and M.Voc programmes, including Accounting & Finance, Retail Management, ECCME, and Tourism & Hospitality. The programme aimed at familiarizing students with the university's academic environment, support systems, and opportunities for holistic growth.

The event commenced with a welcome address by Prof. S. S. Jena, Dean, SVS, who introduced the vision and ethos of the university. This was followed by the introduction of faculty and staff by Dr. Priya Singh, setting the tone for academic collaboration and mentorship.
