Study Visit to the Parliament House

On 19th September 2025, the third year and fourth year students of the BA Global Studies programme and second year MA Global Studies programme, along with Dean SGA and faculty members Dr. Manisha Chaurasiya and Dr. Pavan Kumar, undertook an enriching study visit to the Parliament of India.

The educational visit was planned as an initiative designed to bridge theoretical knowledge with the practical workings of the national legislature. The visit provided a profound understanding of India's democratic processes, allowing students to appreciate and have a firsthand experience of the historical and architectural significance of the Samvidhan Sadan (Old Parliament House building) and the iconic, magnificent and grand structure of the Sansad Bhawan/ Parliament House (New building). Through an immersive three-hour long tour and an interactive session with senior parliamentary officials, the students gained critical insights into the legislative framework, the roles of the Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha, and the dynamics of debate and policy-making. The study visit also included the Parliament Library building and scrumptious refreshments for students courtesy Parliament House.
