A workshop titled ‘Sensitization Programmes on Understanding Impact of Climate Change on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services’ was conducted for the students and faculty of the School of Global Affairs by The Energy and Resources Institute (TERI), New Delhi, a leading think tank on environmental sustainability. This workshop aligned to the mandate of the Environment Department, Government of NCT of Delhi to sensitise students and teachers about climate change and its impact on biodiversity, and prepare an environmentally sensitive community of student and teachers. The workshop was attended by the students of BA Sustainable Urbanism, BA Global Studies, MA Urban Studies programmes of SGA and a few faculty members of the School.

As part of this workshop, Dr. Livleen Kahlon made a presentation on the Impact of Climate Change on Biodiversity in Urban Areas: Understanding the Ecological Consequences of a Warming World Within Our Cities. This was followed by the screening of a short movie titled The Story of a Red Dot: A Film on Urban Biodiversity.

Given that climate change is widely acknowledged for its impact on environment and society, and is ever evolving domain, the said workshop helped participants to gain understanding about the causes and impacts of climate change, with a focus on urban environments. The participants learnt about phenological changes in flora, bird breeding and migration, and nature-based solutions to mitigate climate change impacts.
