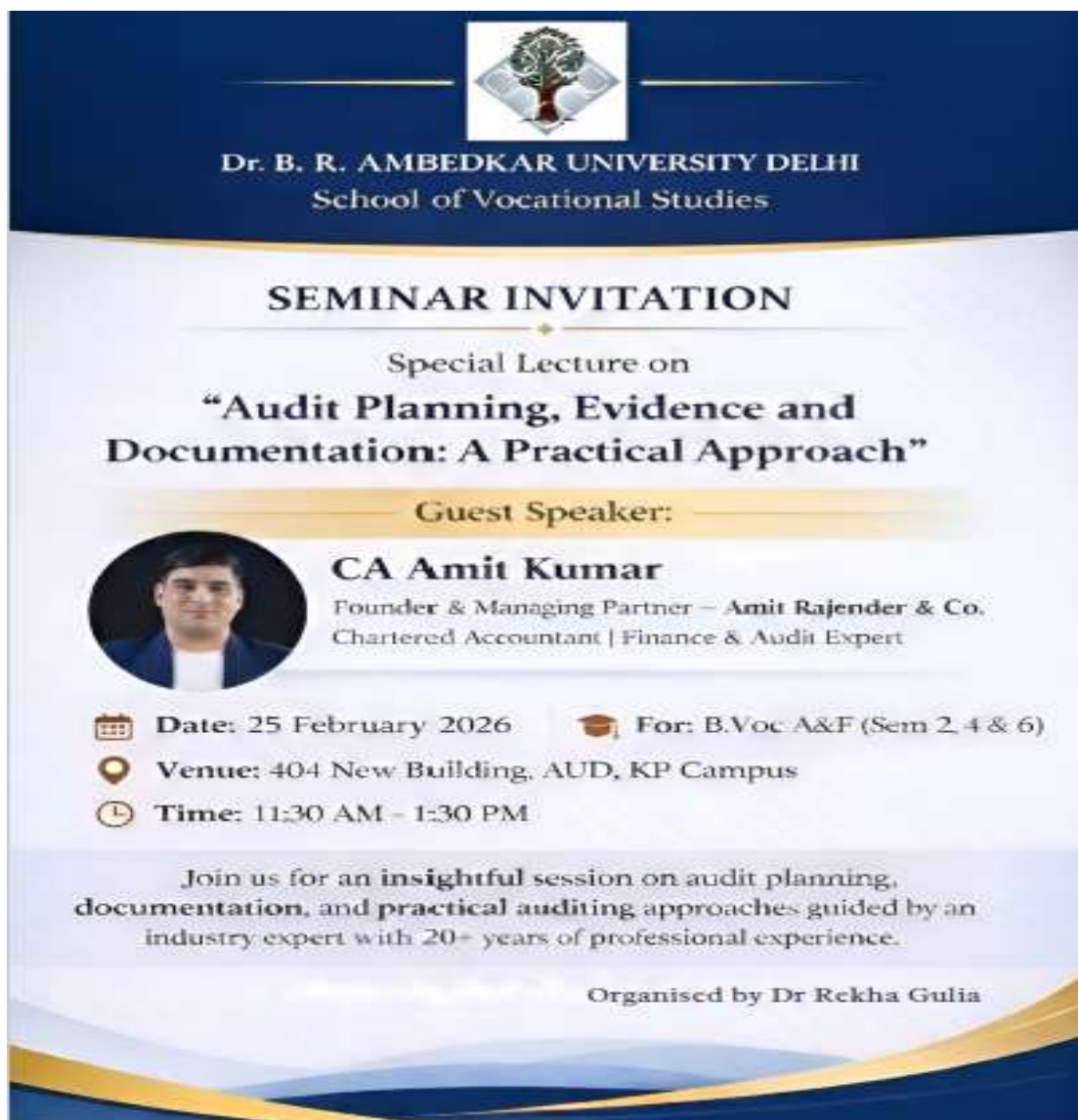


**Report on the Seminar on ‘Audit Planning, Evidence and Documentation’
(25th February 2026)**



The seminar titled “Audit Planning, Evidence and Documentation” was conducted by the School of Vocational Studies (SVS), Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi, on 25th February 2026 at Room No. 404, Karampura Campus. The programme was organized for the students of B.Voc (Accounting & Finance) as part of the School’s ongoing academic enrichment initiatives.



The seminar was delivered by CA Amit Kumar, a practicing Chartered Accountant with professional experience in the areas of auditing and financial reporting.
