### (1) Brief programme description:-

The idea driving this MPhil is that a new set of *professionals*, trained in rural development/ transformational skills are needed to fulfill the bottom-up version of the Indian developmental dream, seeking to link the 'transformation of self' to the larger goals of *social justice and collective transformation*. Existing theories and practices of development have hitherto failed to fully address the

lived experiences and the livelihoods-health-education-governance related predicaments of a large segment of the Indian rural poor. The 'rural', even if in transition, continue to be seen as 'backward'. The MPhil in Development Practice (co-hosted by AUD and a reputed development sector agent, PRADAN) through an examination of the unexamined 'underdevelopment of the rural' and the equally unexamined 'royal roads to Development', and the setting up of a relationship with the rural through a eight-month long immersionbased-learning in rural contexts wishes to create a cohort of Development Sector Professional who would have the capacity to *initiate transformative social action in rural India*.
