





Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi has been conceived as a unitary university focusing largely on research and higher learning in areas of knowledge broadly under the domain of social sciences, humanities and the liberal arts.

Mandated to focus on research and teaching and guided by Dr. Ambedkar's vision of bridging equality and social justice with excellence, Dr. B.R. 
#### Campuses of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi

#### Schools and Centres of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi

The schools of interdisciplinary studies offer undergraduate, postgraduate and research programmes. The idea is to focus on areas of knowledge and professional specializations which are relevant to our context, and the same time, not being given enough emphasis by other universities. At present, 14 Schools have been established and are functional at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi. These are:

The Centres on the other hand have a relatively flexible structure and comprise a group of professionals and scholars put together, more or less in the project mode, to undertake research, documentation, training and some teaching in lesser known or neglected areas of social and academic concerns. The Centres, as conceptualised at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi, are identified as distinct locations for project-based research, policy advocacy and capacity building and networking with the community. The Centres are visualised to have project staff appointed on part-time and contractual basis from time to time and can also be staffed by faculty from the various Schools of study concurrently for a finite time. ## SCHOOL OF BUSINESS, PUBLIC POLICY AND SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP



The School of Business, Public Policy and Social Entrepreneurship (SBPPSE) was launched in 2011 to impart education and promote research in the field of Business, Public Policy and Social Entrepreneurship. The school aims to engage with the latest theoretical concepts and their application in the real world. SBPPSE is committed to its vision to provide quality education through its cutting edge programmes and to develop business professionals who address the concerns of various stakeholders including investors, the economy, ecological environment and the society through their varied roles in the industry. The school offers undergraduate degree programmes- Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) and a Bachelor of Business Administration (Innovation, Entrepreneurship and Venture Development), Masters Level Programmes – MBA (General Management) and MBA-IEV (Innovation, Entrepreneurship & Venture Development) and a Doctoral Programme in Management.

#### **BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (BBA)**

BBA Programme located at SBPPSE is interdisciplinary and covers domains of Management, Economics, Liberal Studies, and Humanities with a strong orientation on cognitive skills, emotional skills and technological skills (skills recommended for workers in 2030: World Economic Forum). The programme is designed with an aim to impart requisite knowledge and skills with social commerce such that the graduate has technical knowledge with consciousness of inclusiveness. It develops skills in leadership, communications, cognitive flexibility, complex problem solving, critical thinking, creativity, emotional intelligence, judgment and decision making with a socio-technical perspective. Hence, providing a confluence of analytics with Liberal Arts and Humanities in alignment with skill required for industry 4.0.

#### BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (BBA-IEV)

The Bachelor of Business Administration (Innovation, Entrepreneurship and Venture Development), BBA-IEV Programme, nurtures the entrepreneurial talent of the participant and guides them through a progressive journey along with a special emphasis on experiential and guided teaching-learning process. Mentors guide and hand-hold students in the understanding of the basics of business, management, and entrepreneurship, acquiring the necessary skills, to refining their idea into proof of concept, to further building & testing the prototype, and subsequently developing the final product/service offering or process into a desirable commercially viable model or an enterprise. Thereby, equipping the students with necessary skills and knowledge for their future academic and entrepreneurial endeavors.

#### MASTER OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

The flagship MBA programme offered at SBPPSE is a full time two year degree programme. The curriculum has been designed innovatively including courses related to public policy, entrepreneurship, leadership, communications, critical thinking, problem solving and decision making along with functional domains of Management. The programme attempts to foster an interdisciplinary environment which has the potential to engender cross fertilisation of ideas across knowledge formations while transcending the artificial divisions between academia and the world of practice. Learning is based on a mix of reflections from academic readings, activities, case studies, field visits and simulations. Emphasis is on interactive and group learning intended to promote team-skills. Theoretical components are well complemented by the practicum, and students are encouraged to apply classroom learning to various real life situations through field based projects. The best of academic resources including the latest technologies are used in the curriculum transaction; students are provided with the relevant skills that match globally accepted standards of excellence.

### MASTER OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION IN INNOVATION, ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND VENTURE DEVELOPMENT (MBA-IEV)

The MBA-IEV Programme programme is a hands-on and practice oriented programme in with interdisciplinary inputs. The programme grooms competent entrepreneurs who explore entrepreneurship as an alternative means to address a wide variety of needs, issues and challenges and thus contribute in development of the country. The graduates of the programme are expected to become self-reliant in identifying opportunities for themselves that will ensure meaningful career paths as well as enhance livelihood possibilities for others. The contents and the approach of the programme lead to bringing out informed, confident and motivated individuals who are empowered to lead change and positively influence lives of their own as well as others.

PhD programme in Management at SBPPSE aims to facilitate meaningful research and applications relevant to business and society at large, across several domains including business, education, health, environment, sustainable development, infrastructure, tourism, sports, legal system, governance, public systems and agriculture through research. By addressing stakeholders' concerns related to culture, diversity, communication and human Relations, the programme seeks to be holistic, contemporary and integrated to the interdisciplinary approach of the University. ## SCHOOL OF CULTURE AND CREATIVE EXPRESSIONS



The School of Culture and Creative Expressions (SCCE) is visualised as a location which implements a new vision of art pedagogy and practice in the country. It is constituted by the principle of integration, creative overlap and interdisciplinary processes between varied creative practices and disciplines, including historical, theoretical and critical engagements. The School seeks to develop newer and different art-making practices and theoretical insights. Its mission is to develop interdisciplinary paradigms, engaged scholarship, and achieve a greater amalgamation between, on the one hand, theory and practice, and on the other, various arts. The School provides a nurturing ground for the development of new and different art making practices and theoretical insights across the areas of Visual Art, Literary Art, Performance and Cinematic Art.

#### **MAFILM STUDIES**

The MA Film Studies Programme is among the very few of its kind in the country. It is designed to enable students to critically engage with cinema as narrative, as an entry into broader questions of media forms (old/new), and as film and media culture. The programme allows students to develop a strong backing to become researchers in film and related fields. It also enables students to demonstrate their awareness of the intricacies of the art, historically and theoretically, to secure placements in the film, television and entertainment industry; or look at writing, publishing, editing opportunities focused on film and media art-related terrain; or by participating in film curation and preservation.

DURATION: 2 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 64

#### **MA LITERARY ART**

The programme has pioneered the pedagogy of creative writing in India with its unique insistence on inculcating in students both the practice and the theory of literary writing. It imagines the writer as inhabiting a range of historical, social and existential horizons, each of which have their bearing on the nature and depth of individual literary output. Rather than simply equip students already fluent in English with a set of supplementary skills, it teaches them to acquaint themselves with the literary idioms of the many languages of the sub- continent and of Europe. It encourages them to grapple with some of the most radical theses on the modern as they have been developed for instance by such thinkers as Foucault, Arendt and Benjamin on the one hand, and Ambedkar, Gandhi and Spivak on the other. It asks them to take seriously the political and personal stakes involved in the struggles around indigenous lands, sexuality, caste and gender.

#### **MAPERFORMANCE STUDIES**

The MA in Performance Studies at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi is a unique programme and the first of its kind in India. Performance Studies is a discipline able to study the complex contexts of globalization and consequent transformations of society and culture. Performance Studies is an interdisciplinary field of research that draws on the social sciences, the humanities, art and theatre.



It focuses on the pervasiveness of performance as a central element of social and cultural life, including not only theatre and dance but also such forms as rituals and practices of everyday life, avant-garde performance art, popular entertainment, sports, political demonstrations and potentially any instance of expressive behaviour or cultural enactment. Thus, the programme aims to contribute to the development of engaged scholarship in the field with a unique perspective given the rich and varied experience situated in and informed by the culture and heritage of India. This program allows the students to develop a unique critical thinking in the field of performance, which can be further implemented in their own practice.

DURATION: 2 YEARS, TOTAL CREDITS: 64

#### **MAVISUALART**

The MA in Visual Art is a practice-based programme designed to enable students to engage with emerging modes of artistic practices. It aims to carve out new avenues for experimentation and strengthen available spaces for alternative creative practices. The Programme also enables students to take up research— practice-based or otherwise. Along with an array of practical components which constitute the core of this programme, it inculcates theoretical and historical knowledge regarding artistic production, dissemination and reception. The School's decision to admit students from various disciplinary backgrounds for this Programme also opens up interdisciplinary and collaborative possibilities of exchange. The MA in Visual Art attempts to forge a much needed dialogue with the social and the political through modes of engaged artistic practices.

DURATION: 2 YEARS, TOTAL CREDITS: 64

### PhD FILM STUDIES / PhD LITERARY ART / PhD VISUAL ART/ PhD PERFORMANCE STUDIES

The PhD Programmes in Visual Art, Literary Art and Film Studies fork into two kinds of research possibilities. One, which is a studies-based orientation, which would produce a thesis comprising historical, theoretical, and critical analysis with a marked sensitivity to creative processes. The other would be a practice-based thesis which will allow creative practice (creative prose or poetry, performance, audiovisual work spreading across media forms) with critical, historical, and theoretical reflection on such practice. This inclusion of creative practice in research epitomizes SCCE's attempts to cultivate a composite culture of creative and critical energies.

### SCHOOL OF DESIGN



The School of Design at Ambedkar University Delhi (AUD) is visualised as both a practice and research-based School for the pursuit of design education from the undergraduate level to the postgraduate and doctoral levels. The first programme, Master of Design (Social Design) commenced in July 2013. The School is unique as it is placed in a university wholly focussed on the humanities and social sciences.

The study and practice of design here is thus focussed on bringing together the traditional attributes of design—the emphasis on form, function, aesthetics and experiences—with concerns of equity and ecology to create more accessible, inclusive and sustainable public services and systems through participatory and collaborative design methods.

The School has been associated with Royal College of Art (London) and the Glasgow School of Art, (Glasgow and Forres) through faculty exchange initiatives and continues to explore future tieups with other institutions internationally and nationally.

Faculty members at the School of Design have expertise in diverse fields including architecture, textile and accessory design, urban design, visual communication as well as art, architecture and design history. Adjunct faculty members bring in varied expertise in data visualisation, ecology, service design, social entrepreneurship, sustainability, systems thinking and user interface/user experience.

The Futures Lab at the School of Design has been initiated to undertake sponsored and self-initiated projects to demonstrate the efficacy and value of design in emerging areas of social relevance. The lab has been engaged with two projects on Last Mile Connectivity and Urban Farming as part of a Design Innovation Centre funded by Ministry of Human Resources Development. Currently, it is conducting a design audit of Mohalla Clinics, the Delhi Government's community-based healthcare initiative.

#### MDes (SOCIAL DESIGN)

The Master of Design (MDes) in Social Design is a 2-year, full-time, practice and theory-based program. Students are trained to draw from the methods and approaches of both, the design disciplines and the social sciences, to creatively address complex social issues. The emphasis is on participatory and collaborative design methods. The areas of focus are public services, shelter and systems (such as health, education,, disaster management, waste, governance interfaces), community networks and livelihoods (pertaining to crafts, informal economies, built and intangible heritage, urban and rural commons), digital technologies (social media, user interfaces and experiences, privacy). Students are also introduced to entrepreneurial competencies and



leadership to support them to establish their own enterprises while also providing internship opportunities in established organizations. The academic work includes taught courses and studio projects in real life settings, culminating in a final project of the student's choice. Internships and field studies form an integral part of learning through engagement with communities and organizations in both urban and rural settings. So far, students have interned with organizations such as Center for Internet and Society, Action Aid, Hyderabad Urban Lab, Thoughtshop, Quicksand, Hunnarshala, Seva Mandir and Center for Knowledge Societies.

## SCHOOL OF DEVELOPMENT STUDIES

SDS

School of Development Studies was one among the first Schools that were created at Ambedkar University Delhi. Over the years the School has made its presence felt in India and abroad by intensely engaging with different development questions from an interdisciplinary perspective.

#### MA DEVELOPMENT STUDIES

Since 2009, the school has been offering its MA programme, in generating pedagogies of interdisciplinary approaches to development through its faculty and in consultation with experts from the academic world as well as the world of practice. The programme includes courses that combine theoretical and conceptual understanding with substantial field based learning, along with a strong emphasis on dissertation writing, aiming at nurturing research competence at the Masters level itself. While focusing on interdisciplinary approaches, it also allows students to focus on particular disciplinary approaches, if they wish to, informed by perspectives from other disciplines.

The two-year MA Development Studies Programme is transacted through classroom lectures, workshops, seminars, and field projects. The programme emphasises research and analytical skills, oral and written communication, and exposure to development practice. The programme lays a strong emphasis on training students in social research in the broad space of development.

DURATION: 2 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 64

#### PhD DEVELOPMENT STUDIES

The PhD programme aims to promote and strengthen the social science research with an interdisciplinary approach, broadly drawing on the disciplines of Sociology, Anthropology, Economics and Political Science. The doctoral research in Development Studies, are available on the following themes - Labour Relations and Development; Entrepreneurship and Society; Peace, Conflict and Development; Gender and Development; Social Policy and Development; Social Movements and Development.

## SCHOOL OF EDUCATION STUDIES

SES

SES is envisioned to evolve as a community of professionals and scholars endeavouring to understand education in its historical and contemporary contexts through engaged scholarship and practice. The School aims to bridge the gap between the theory and practice of education in its multiple locations-in that, it attempts to foster greater convergence between the study of education as a social phenomenon and the preparation of professional educators.

While engaging with teacher education, pedagogy, curriculum, policy planning and administration, the School works toward development of a rigorous praxis-based theoretical perspective. In pursuit of this vision, SES launched the MA Education programme in 2012, MA Education (Early Childhood Care and Education) in 2014, Continuing Professional Development (CPD) courses and a PhD programme in 2019. The School prepared its second PhD programme in English language Education in 2022. This programme was developed in collaboration with the Centre for English Language Education (CELE).

#### **MA EDUCATION**

SES's MA programme is an attempt to bring together the elements of both liberal and professional preparation of educators. It is one of the few programmes in India that makes possible the study of education both as a social phenomenon and an area of knowledge, and also develops the professional skills needed for practice. This programme has intense field based components at both school and non-school sites. These field components provide a space to students to engage with critical debates in contemporary education as well as field realities and have hands-on experience with processes like textbook and curriculum development. Many graduates eventually work as teachers, teacher-educators, curriculum developers, researchers, consultants and professionals in government and non-government organisations.

DURATION: 2 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 70

#### MA EDUCATION (EARLY CHILDHOOD CARE AND EDUCATION)

The MA Education (ECCE) programme involves rigorous engagement with educational theory, practice and policies. It has been conceptualised with the aim of creating human resources to support professional upgradation of quality of planning, supervision and management of ECCE programmes for young children. It also provides a more in-depth and scholarly understanding of ECCE, anchored in various disciplines including child development, sociology, history, critical pedagogy, psychoanalytic frame, anthropology, and management. Apart from lectures, the pedagogy is planned in various modalities such as workshops, tutorials, field visits, reflection, groups and seminars. The programme will help to develop graduates who have a holistic understanding of issues in ECCE and can promote quality early childhood programmes through their teaching, research, and advocacy.

DURATION: 2 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 70



#### PhD EDUCATION

The doctoral program in education is designed to engage scholars committed to identifying challenges in education, developing newer insights and contributing to knowledge construction. The programme aims to question, study, and critique the various forces influencing the discourse of education and respond by creating alternative pathways. It intends to nurture research scholars who develop the capacity to study the changing landscape of education and the critical issues in the various sites of practice. It intends to develop evidence based approaches to promote equity and social justice.

The programme is designed to enable candidates to engage in rigorous scholarship and enhance the existing literature in the field with high quality research. The courses will encourage candidates to examine topics through multiple lenses grounded in different disciplines. SES offers specialisation in the following areas: Curriculum Studies, Educational Theory, Education Policy and Reform, Language and Literacy, Early Childhood Care and Education, Inclusive Education, Critical Pedagogy, Child and Youth Studies and Teacher Education.

#### PhD ENGLISH LANGUAGE EDUCATION

PhD Programme in English Language Education (ELE) The doctoral programme aims to contribute to the augmentation of ELE as a sub-discipline of education with the much-needed focus on Indian contexts and interests. The programme aims to converge local and global ELE principles and practices, approaching ELE as a social phenomenon informed by historical and contemporary perspectives. In broad terms, in order to serve this end, the programme will try to focus on exploring and understanding domains and practices in ELE from Indian perspectives, strive to develop effective principles and strategies for ELE practices for improved learning outcomes and create opportunities for teacher professional development. The programme also aims to work towards creation of a knowledge base for ELE with a strong relevance for India, incorporate discourses pertaining to gender, SDGs, and environmental issues in ELE and research and contribute to document and critique the Indian ELE scenario. The PhD ELE programme at SES is offered in collaboration with the Centre for English Language Education (CELE).

## SCHOOL OF GLOBAL AFFAIRS



The focus of the School of Global Affairs (SGA) is on the emerging processes and issues with potential to impact life on the planet in fundamental ways, including conflict and security, urbanization, geopolitics and geo-economics, global health and well-being, religion, migration and diaspora. The mission of the School is to equip the future generation of social actors including those in the public, private, and non-governmental sector, with the intellectual and professional tools to work in a challenging and dynamic environment. Students will gain an appreciation of the ways in which global affairs structure our lives, as well as how creative possibilities may emanate from disparate locations.

#### **BAGLOBAL STUDIES**

The BA in Global Studies (BA-GS) exists in dialogue with the several similar undergraduate programmes being offered in universities across the world. BA-GS brings together the best that these existing programmes have to offer along with students' already existing lived experience of the global, to explore and learn from in the vibrant debates, popular and scholarly, regarding the processes of globalisation and globality. The BA-GS programme will follow both the terrestrial veins of globalisation as well as engage students in questions of decoding the complex, networked infrastructure that is being increasingly studied as producing the age of the Anthropocene. Either French or Chinese as a foreign language is offered as a compulsory component in this programme. The programme offers exit options after 1 st and 2nd year with certificate and diploma in Global Studies respectively.

DURATION: 3+1 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 162

#### **BASUSTAINABLE URBANISM**

The BA in Sustainable Urbanism is designed to prepare technically strong, analytical, and socially-engaged practitioners. Graduates should be in a position to evaluate and contribute to urban processes in terms of their design, social interests, and control including the potential for democratic change. The programme draws on the broad fields of urban studies, sustainability and planning, while adapting them to the specific Indian urban context. There is an additional option for students enrolled in this programme to earn a minor in Sociology, Political Science or History. The programme offers exit options after 1 st and 2 nd year with certificate and diploma in Sustainable Urbanism respectively.

DURATION: 3+1 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 162

#### **BASOCIAL SCIENCES**

[Formerly BA Social Sciences and Humanities (BA-SSH)]

The BA in Social Sciences (BA-SS) in Karampura Campus is designed to provide a strong foundation in social sciences through an interdisciplinary route. The programme takes cognizance of the diverse interests and needs of the students pursuing undergraduate education. The BA-SS aspires to empower young students with a perspective for critical thinking, skill-based abilities and



knowledge-oriented components. There is an additional option for students enrolled in this programme to earn a minor in Sociology, Political Science or History. The programme offers exit options after 1st and 2nd year with certificate, diploma in Social Sciences respectively.

DURATION: 3+1 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 162

#### MA GLOBAL STUDIES

Key programme objectives are to illuminate the hidden histories and geographies of globality that are often subsumed within the dominant stories of colonial, postcolonial and neoliberal globalization; and to understand processes through which perceptions of 'local' and 'global' are co-produced within a multitude of locally embedded contexts. The programme is organized around the following thematic areas that build an understanding of important global debates: 1) Wealth and Poverty; 2) State and Democracy; 3) Global Environment and Society; 4) Cultures and Identities.

#### **MAURBAN STUDIES**

MA Urban Studies brings an interdisciplinary perspective to urban concerns from infrastructure to health, and from climate change to social cohesion. The programme is rooted in the realities of India and the Global South, and includes continuous interactions between the classroom and the world outside in the form of internship, studio, and research-based dissertation. Graduates are expected to contribute to research institutions, the development sector, environmental organisations, and private consultancies.

DURATION: 2YEARS

**TOTAL CREDITS: 64** 

#### MASTER OF PUBLIC HEALTH

Master of Public Health (MPH) aims to equip students with the necessary perspective, knowledge, skill-sets and societal commitment to be able to understand health and wellbeing from a population perspective as against an individualized notion of health care. This programme therefore places a strong emphasis on a social science perspective to health i.e., society, power, economy and culture and their interactions, as a determinant of population health, while preserving the presence of other key public health domains like epidemiology, biostatistics, management and public policy.

DURATION: 2YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 72

#### PhD PUBLIC HEALTH

The PhD (Public Health) programme underscores a reflective engagement with public health theory and practice and the development of research competency. Research scholars are enabled to discover and apply methodologies necessary to carry out original research aimed at an interdisciplinary engagement with public health issues. The areas of research that are encouraged in the PhD programme are health social sciences, health economics and financing, health systems, environmental health, occupational health, public health nutrition, demography and health, urban health, anthropology of health, health policy, political economy of health and others.

#### **PhD URBAN STUDIES**

The Ph.D. programme in Urban Studies is geared to familiarize students with interdisciplinary knowledge of the foundations of the field and equip them with the related methods and tools to carry out independent and original research leading to a successful dissertation. The Ph.D. scholar will be encouraged to undertake research in the areas such as urban history, urban policy and governance, urban politics and social movements, gender, sexuality and identities, urban environment and ecology, economy and livelihoods, space and experiences, housing, infrastructures and energy, urban wellbeing, rural-urban interactions/linkages and others.

## SCHOOL OF HERITAGE RESEARCH & MANAGEMENT



School of Heritage Research and Management was formed in 2021, by the merging of the Delhi Institute of Heritage Research and Management with Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi. The curriculum at the School is directed towards dissemination of knowledge and practices of maintenance, conservation, preservation and management of the heterogeneity of the heritage products, through stimulating study and research for a multi-segmented higher education stratum. The School has two post-graduate Programmes under the umbrella discipline of Heritage Management. Both the Programmes are supported through enhanced exposure to a variety of sites such as the Visit by the students to the Parliament Museum, New Delhi, as an insight into museum curatorial and management practices. The students recently visited the Partition Exhibition at the National Gallery of Modern Art, New Delhi as part of the interpretative processes which guide our history and heritage. Not to mention internship and training with organizations such as Department of Archaeology, Delhi Archives and the Rail Museum, New Delhi.

#### MAArchaeology and Heritage Management (MAHM)

History as a discipline deals with written records, their assessment and interpretation. Archaeology as a discipline substantiates these historical texts and written records with excavated sites, epigraphical records, numismatic finds and evidence of city planning and urban design.

Courses on India and the World through the Ages, Heritage Tourism: Concepts Planning and Marketing, Heritage Museum Heritage Museum Management Concept, Planning and Presentation, Cultural Heritage of India are a few core courses. The specialized courses for archaeology are Archaeology Method and Theory, Prehistory and Human Evolution, Epigraphy and Numismatics, Protohistoric Cultures and Vedic Age and Protohistoric Cultures and Vedic Age, to list a few. The Submission of a Dissertation Report in the last Semester is an essential prerequisite towards the award of the Post-Graduate Degree.

DURATION: 2 CREDITS: 64

#### MA Conservation, Preservation and Heritage Management (MCPHM)

The genesis of the Programme in Conservation emanates from the acknowledgement that cultural property, natural and man-made, deteriorates with the passage of time. Cultural Property, as our collective inheritance has to be handed down to the future generations and hence they need to be preserved, both by legislation and treatment, to prolong their life. This is imparted through courses as: Principles Guidelines and Laws: National and International, Survey, Inspection, Assessing Deterioration and Preparation of Status Reports, Conservation, Preservation and



Restoration of Heritage components and Conservation technique and Chemical Treatment and Preservation of Painting, Manuscripts, Organic and Inorganic Materials, to list a few.

India and the World through the Ages, Heritage Tourism: Concepts Planning and Marketing, Heritage Museum Management, Concept, Planning And Presentation, Cultural Heritage of India are a few core courses, which are taught in this Programme. The Submission of a Dissertation Report in the last Semester is an essential prerequisite towards the award of the Post-Graduate Degree.

DURATION: 2 CREDITS: 64

#### **PhD Heritage Studies**

Interdisciplinary PhD in Heritage Studies with specialization in archaeology, conservation, tourism, museology will be in sync with NEP 2020. The objective of the doctoral programme will be to encourage research scholarship in heritage studies, linking cultural and natural heritage backed by conservation techniques and an updated conservation laboratory. It will enable in developing appreciation, interpretation and intervention towards conserving nature's splendour, richness in biodiversity and plural living traditions comprising tangible and intangible manifestations in natural habitat and environment.

Post PhD students will have opportunities in post doctoral and academic hobs, but also in starting heritage entrepreneurship, being engaged in the corporate sector, or be part of government and autonomous organisations related to heritage preservation and conservation.

## SCHOOL OF HUMAN ECOLOGY



Human Ecology is the interdisciplinary study of complex social-ecological issues at multiple spatial scales. Research and teaching at the School of Human Ecology brings together ideas, methodologies and toolkits from disciplines in thenatural sciences and social sciences to understand interactions between the biophysical environment and human society. The School's thematic focus areas include environmental change, biodiversity conservation, ecological restoration, rural and urban transformations, environmental and social impact assessment and public health.

The School offers a full-time MA programme in Environment and Development (MAED) and a full-time PhD programme in Human Ecology. Faculty and scholars at the School employ quantitative, qualitative and geospatial methodological frameworks to study complexity and causality in the intertwined lives of humans and other species. The School deploys careful field-based enquiry to study the 'big questions' of justice, well-being and sustainability in local, empirical contexts. The agency of humans and nonhumans is explored in ecological and social transformations in South Asia, in the present as well as in the past.

#### **MA ENVIRONMENT & DEVELOPMENT**

The MAED is a rigorous, full-time, interdisciplinary programme with strong emphasis on reading, writing and field-based research. It is unique in India given its orientation and scope, which is guided by the idea that ecological challenges such as atmospheric pollution, resource depletion, and the attendant threats to ecosystems and biodiversity, result from a complex interaction of socio-political and biophysical factors. Students are exposed to core ideas and approaches from the ecological and social sciences to understand issues at the intersection of human society and the biophysical environment. The programme aims to create change makers who can contribute to sustainability and social justice at the national and global scale through research, advocacy and practice.

DURATION: 2 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 64

#### PhD HUMAN ECOLOGY

The School of Human Ecology aims to foster interdisciplinary research in areas at the intersection of human society, non-human beings and the biophysical environment. The research programme at the School is guided by the idea that environmental concerns and challenges such as resource



depletion, ecological degradation and conflicts result from complex interactions of social and environmental factors, and therefore meaningful intervention in these debates should be informed by knowledge and skills on a wide range of subjects. The uniqueness of the PhD programme stems from its proposal to synergistically link the natural sciences and social sciences to explore and understand environmental issues as well as its emphasis on field-based learning and research. The aim of PhD coursework and the dissertation is to create multi-disciplinary range of knowledge as well as to create depth in a core discipline. A successful PhD candidate at SHE is thus expected to develop understanding of a specialised subject area which is enriched, strengthened and informed by other disciplines that may have a bearing on her/ his research question.

# SCHOOL OF HUMAN STUDIES



This School is an explorative, interdisciplinary space for thinking and reflecting on the myriad meanings of being human. Its academic programmes focus as much on the promise and potential of the human, as on the actual historical exclusions and marginalisations that human have led to. The School offers an MA in Psychology (Psychosocial Clinical Studies) and an MA in Gender Studies. Since 2012, SHS has also offered a PhD Programme in Psychology.

#### MA GENDER STUDIES

The programme is an integral part of the inter-disciplinary, intersectional and dynamic vision of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi, which conceives of academic learning as providing students with a critical conceptual framework in its engagement with social realities and issues. Consistent with this ideal, the MA Programme is envisaged as a thoroughly interdisciplinary one, drawing upon gendered analyses primarily from the social sciences and the humanities.

DURATION: 2 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 64

#### MAPSYCHOLOGY (PSYCHO SOCIAL CLINICAL STUDIES)

The programme attempts to inculcate in students a capacity for clinical and critical thinking that will facilitate a nuanced sensitivity to diverse states of emotional experience, a regard for the margins of 'Indian' society and a capacity to theorise the same. It may be thought of as a first attempt in India to redefine and provide a new direction to the disciplinary orientation of Psychology. We expect our students to engage effectively in academic and research fields. In addition, our focus on clinical thinking and related processes will, we hope, enable students to effectively respond to and work in contexts such as counselling and psychotherapy, which require engagement with the nuances of feeling states and the richness of human subjectivity.

DURATION: 2 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 70

#### PhD WOMEN'S AND GENDER STUDIES

The Ph. D programme creates a space for questioning silences around gender that steer the workings of caste, class and community in contemporary and historical societies, and in the social sciences. The programme will assimilate analytical understandings of the significance of gender (relations) and foster study of conduits and configurations of power, causes, contexts and consequences of women's subordination.



#### PhD PSYCHOLOGY

The doctoral programme in Psychosocial Studies is guided by a vision. Its method is to retain ethical engagement with forms of life and cultural modes of being that are rendered invisible and voiceless by the dominant discourses and politico-social structures and processes. Moreover, a psychosocial framework of research is facilitated by a concern about relating to nuances of human subjectivity and an attempt to feel the psychic recesses, dilemmas, resilience, life choices and conflicts in the participant's inner world. Guided by a critical perspective that constantly seeks to question both knowledge and power--questioning given structures within the discipline of psychology as also outside, historicizing/sociologizing knowledge, and orienting towards an intersubjective world view within which affects, feelings and the phenomenological flow of life are received—the programme seeks to generate in the participants a nuanced sensibility to facilitate their clinical-critical, participatory and dialogical work.

## SCHOOL OF LAW, GOVERNANCE AND CITIZENSHIP



The School offers an interdisciplinary approach to the productive and complex interaction of law, culture, politics and social structure. It offers a BA programme in Law and Politics and MA programme in Law, Politics and Society, which is designed with the premise that a focus on the intersection of law and politics is of crucial importance in shaping a better understanding of modern India. The programme is oriented towards those interested in deepening their understanding of law towards a career in research, teaching and legal practice.

#### **BALAWAND POLITICS**

The BA programme in Law and Politics at Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi introduces students to aholistic study of law and politics. It is premised on the idea that the two fields are inseparable, and the program looks at the productive entanglement of both domains. Students will be taught core courses in law as well as in politics along with interdisciplinary courses that bring the two disciplines together. At the end of the program, students will be uniquely positioned as they will be equipped with analytical skills that allow them a unique perspective on legal and political events in the country.

DURATION: 3+1 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 162

#### MA LAW, POLITICS AND SOCIETY

TOTAL CREDITS: 162The M.A. Programme in Law, Politics and Society at the SLGC is designed with the premise that a focus on the intersection of law and politics in the context of societal structures is of crucial importance in shaping a better understanding of modern India. Students from a wide range of disciplines, including but not limited to, law, sociology, political science, literature, economics or history will find this programme attractive.

DURATION: 2 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 64

#### **MACRIMINOLOGY**

Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi in collaboration with RGNLU is commencing an innovative Post graduate program in the domain of Criminology. Drawing from diverse disciplines such as sociology, psychology and law, the domain of criminology attempts to provide a *critical perspective* on issues of crime, justice, law and society. The collaboration between the two universities will bring the best of their cutting edge knowledge and competence both in the field of social sciences and legal subjects to make this programme unique and stimulating.



MA Criminology is a challenging two year programme which provides students an advanced understanding of crime and criminal justice. The M.A. comprises thought-provoking courses in criminological theories, the study of criminal justice and punitive practices, psychology behind a crime and the criminal, victimology, criminal investigation and prevention, training in research design and methodology and cyber criminology to name a few. This programme will focus on the critical perspectives of criminology, and will be a blend of conventional classroom learning (which provides theoretical and conceptual inputs) along with extensive non-classroom learning, interactions, field visits and internships to Criminal Justice Organizations which in turn will facilitate the development of the right attitude, skills and knowledge base of the students.

SoL

The School of Letters, established in March 2017, offers a range of interdisciplinary courses and programmes in the literary humanities that support, encourage and redefine the meanings of literature, culture, language and humanisms in historical and contemporary perspectives.

#### **BAHINDI (Hons.)**

अंबेडकर विश्वविद्यालय दिल्ली (AUD) में बीए (हिंदी) आनर्स प्रोग्राम सीबीसीएस–यूजीसी की अनुशंसाओं के अनुरूप है। इसमें विद्यार्थियों को पारंपरिक शिक्षण का लाभ प्राप्त होगा साथ ही ज्ञान और व्यवसाय के क्षेत्रों में विकसित होते नए अनुशासनों से भी जोड़े जाने पर बल रहेगा। सीबीसीएस—यूजीसी के द्वारा प्रस्तावित पाठ्यक्रम में हिंदी साहित्य के जिन पक्षों पर बल है, उसका अनुसरण करते हुए साहित्य–शिक्षण की योजना पर अमल किया जाएगा। साहित्य के आदिकाल से लेकर आधुनिक काल तक फैले कालखंड का सिलसिलेवार तरीके से अध्यापन होगा तथा विद्यार्थियों को विभिन्न उपागमों से अवगत कराया जाएगा। यह अपनी प्रकृति में अंतरानुशासनिक, इतिहासमूलक तथा तुलनात्मक होने के साथ-साथ आधुनिक संवेदना से भी लैस रहेगा। विश्वविद्यालय के अन्य पाठ्यक्रमों एवं कार्यक्रमों के साथ यह तालमेल रखेगा। चार वर्षीय [3+1] पाठ्यक्रम के रूप में परिकल्पित यह हिंदी बीए (आनर्स) प्रोग्राम भाषागत योग्यता एवं व्यवसायिक कौशल के विकास पर भी विशेष ध्यान देगा। दक्षता संवर्धन के पाठ्यक्रम (Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses & AECC) के अंतर्गत हिंदी व्याकरण और संप्रेषण तथा हिंदी भाषा और संप्रेषण व पर्यावरण संबंधी चेतना को केंद्र में रखा गया है। इसी प्रकार कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम के अध्यापन (Skill Enhancement Courses & SEC) के अंतर्गत विज्ञापन, रचनात्मक लेखन, भाषा–शिक्षण, साहित्य–सिनेमा, अनुवाद, पाठालोचन) आदि को साहित्य–शिक्षण में सम्मिलित किया गया है। प्रोग्राम से संबंधित पाठ्यक्रमों में हिंदी की विविध बोलियों, भारतीय भाषाओं तथा विश्वचिंतन पर भी बल रहेगा ताकि विद्यार्थियों के सामाजिक–सांस्कृतिक सरोकार और उनके मानसिक क्षितिज विषय–विशेष की सीमाओं में कैद न रहकर एक विश्व– नागरिक के बोध से संपन्न हो सकें। इसके लिए पाठ्यक्रम में सामान्य वैकल्पिक (Generic Elective Courses & GEC) को भी विशेष रूप से स्थान प्रदान किया गया है ताकि विद्यार्थी कला और साहित्य, संगीत और साहित्य तथा पाश्चात्य दर्शन और साहित्य आदि के अंतर्संबंध तथा पूरक संबंध से परिचित हो सकें। यह प्रोग्राम अपने पाठ्यक्रमों को विद्यार्थियों के जीवनानुभवों तथा उनकी सामाजिक आवश्यकताओं के अनुरूप निरंतर विकसित करेगा और सर्जनात्मक लेखन व सांस्कृतिक पत्रकारिता आदि के शिक्षण के जरिए उनकी कल्पनाशीलता को भी प्रोत्साहित करने की चेष्टा करेगा ।

#### **MAENGLISH**

The Masters Programme in English proposes to dismantle the hierarchy between British Literature and other literatures in English, including literatures in translation. It seeks to bring into focus the significance of literatures belonging to lesser known languages and regions. Strengthening the overall vision of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi, this programme hopes to orient students towards engaged and reflective scholarship. A concern with social and literary



margins will consistently guide the programme's overall vision, philosophy and content. It is hoped that the programme's ethical concern with linking education to the lives and struggles of individuals and communities will enable the students to form a holistic understanding of literature. It will also help them to develop deeper psychic, social and creative sensibilities. It is further envisaged that through this programme the students will develop a critical sensibility towards the larger politics of culture, society and state so that they actively and artistically interrogate and intervene within the givens of the hegemonic political and cultural order.

The programme integrates interdisciplinary paradigms to facilitate a greater amalgamation between various literatures, theory and practice on the one hand, and between music, dance, theatre, cinema, visual arts, and folklore on the other. Students will be offered a wide range of interdisciplinary courses which will help them situate literature in the context of other disciplines. To that end, some courses have been designed or envisaged as bilingual and/or multilingual.

In order to enable critical thinking, intervention and praxis, the programme will encourage engagement with the lesser known literatures and cultures in India and elsewhere. Students from a wide range of disciplines and not necessarily from humanities are encouraged to apply.

The two-year full time programme will comprise 16 courses of 4 credits each, amounting to a total of 64 credits, including an optional dissertation. The English Programme does not follow a coreoptional model. In keeping with Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi's emphasis on interdisciplinary studies, students will be encouraged to opt for up to four courses from other programmes within the School of Letters or from any other schools of the university. Assessment will include term papers, class presentations, class discussions, class participation, workshops, tests and assignments. Students will be provided with a detailed reading list for each course. Students will be strictly expected to attend and participate in all class discussions.

DURATION: 2 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 64

#### **MA HINDI**

The MA programme in Hindi will follow a comparative, interdisciplinary and experimental approach. It seeks to establish an academic alignment with other such programmes of the University, masters in Hindi in other universities, and the UGC's guidelines. One objective of the programme is to develop both the social and the aesthetic sensibilities among the students. It would also endeavour to promote creative imaginative capacities among students.

The programme will create some openings towards other official languages of Delhi such as Urdu and Punjabi. Apart from a critical study of Hindi literature, the programme will also incorporate the literary traditions of other Indian languages and speech forms. The main focus will also be on the Interrelations among teaching, research and social concerns. Apart from developing their literary knowledge, the programme also seeks to develop various skills and specialties among a students. The programme will pay special attention to processes of social change and movements and the ways in which they relate to literature. In other words, the programme will focus on the dialogical relationship between social movements and literary articulations. The programme intends to prepare and train students who would be both trained with employable skills as well as be socially sensitive.

DURATION: 2 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 64



#### MASTERS IN COMPARATIVE LITERATURE

The Masters Programme in Comparative Literature is envisioned as an innovative Programme consistent with the vision of Ambedkar University Delhi. It aims to promote engaged and socially responsible scholarship, making students aware of the links between literature and broader questions of identity and difference, language and culture, local/national/global interfaces, culture and politics, authority and authorship, reading and interpretation, and translation as cultural mediation.

The Programme is constituted around the principle of integration of various literatures, and interdisciplinary processes between varied practices and disciplines, including historical, theoretical and critical engagements. Thus, the Programme is directed towards finding interdisciplinary paradigms, greater amalgamation between various literatures, theory and practice on one hand, and between music, dance, theatre, cinema, literature, visual art and so on, on the other. A major focus of the Programme is literature and its relation to the community; in other words, to critically engage with literature in terms of its contemporary relevance, interpretation, socio-political affect, social change and transgression.

The Programme seeks to develop the profile of the student as a comparatist capable of thinking beyond boundaries in ways that are creative, innovative, interdisciplinary and socially relevant. Such a scholar is expected to think comparatively about national and cultural plurality, and participate in current debates shaping literary humanities: world literature, universalism, alternative modernities, meanings of the human. Medium of Instruction is English.

DURATION: 2 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 80

#### PhD COMPARATIVE LITERATURE AND TRANSLATION STUDIES

The School of Letters, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi, offers a range of interdisciplinary courses and programmes in the literary humanities that support, encourage and redefine the meanings of literature, culture, language and humanisms in historical and contemporary perspectives. Tagore translated "Comparative Literature" into Bengali as "visva sahitya" or world literature. The choice of sahitya for literature reveals the possibilities of comparative studies of literature in our part of the world. Comparison is not just comparing disparate objects but nurturing a conceptual space in which the imagination can be confronted with otherness. The aim of the research programmes in CLTS in SOL is precisely to turn literature into an experience of that otherness, which both questions and redraws the sense of culture, nation and identity. While close-reading skills in the original will be a key aspect of the comparatist-translator's brief, researchers in our integrated PhD programmes may also choose to bring literary studies in close dialogue with other disciplines from the humanities and social sciences. The programme encourages the practice of translation and recognizes its significance in ways that will promote the reading and dissemination of literatures in as many languages as possible, with a focus on Indian and South Asian literary cultures. Currently supervision in the following research domains is available: theories of comparative literature, South Asian literary cultures (Bengali and Urdu), politics and aesthetics of translation, and minor literatures.

#### **PhD HINDI**

The interdisciplinary and eclectic approach in terms of pedagogical experiments and methodological interventions that form the crux of the visions of the School of Letters has also been the guiding principle for the research programmes facilitated by the Hindi faculty of the



school. Any student enrolled in either of the two research programmes, i.e. PhD in Hindi, is encouraged to participate in and contribute to this vision.

The PhD in Hindi is of three years, extendable by two years, and comprises both the course work as well as the thesis writing. Candidates are provided due guidance through the supervisor and Research Advisory Committee assigned to her/ him. They are subjected to the requirements and guidelines of the university for presenting their research progress in front of the concerned committees. All researchers in Hindi programme are encouraged to participate in conferences and seminars, along with getting their research papers published in recognised journals as part of their research engagements in the programme.

#### PhD ENGLISH

The distinguishing feature of the Research programme offered by the English faculty of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi is that students shall be encouraged to pursue inter- or multidisciplinary research based on the assumption that concerns raised in literary texts often find resonances or analogies in other disciplines. The faculty shall make every effort to create an intellectual environment in which a researcher has the confidence and freedom to challenge canonically accepted critical positions and methodologies. The rationale behind any research undertaken in this programme shall be to understand how a literary or cultural text is profoundly influenced by art, politics, style, history, psychology, image-making, translations and technologies that define the spirit of the age in which literary production happens. Literary research in the contemporary world should, therefore, be inspired sometimes by present anxieties and discontents, sometimes by new areas of knowledge and visions of a different future; it should reestablish, for its own time and location, the truth or the enigma of any text; and, finally, it should claim its place in the same cultural and moral habitat in which other acts of reason and imagination take place.

## SCHOOL OF LIBERAL STUDIES



The School of Liberal Studies (SLS) offers a range of interdisciplinary and overlapping programmes that support, encourage and redefine liberal arts education through cutting-edge interdisciplinary courses, interactive pedagogy and learning that goes beyond classroom spaces.

#### **MA ECONOMICS**

The Masters Programme in Economics provides students with a rigorous and in-depth advanced training in economic analysis, with a particular emphasis on equipping them with the ability to comprehend and think about contemporary economic issues including the challenges confronting developing countries like India.

The programme draws on different theoretical perspectives and traditions within the discipline, brings in perspectives from outside the discipline on contemporary social phenomenon, and uses creative pedagogical approaches to offer a well-rounded training that would enable students to achieve a variety of objectives simultaneously; in keeping with the University's vision, develop a socio-political and historical perspective on the economy and the discipline which analyses it; master the quantitative techniques which are used extensively in economic analysis; understand and learn to analyse contemporary economic issues at the global and national levels; and acquire skills for absorbing and communicating economic ideas.

DURATION: 2 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 64

#### **MAHISTORY**

The MA History programme is designed to impart understanding of historical phenomena and processes as well as to transmit skills of historical analysis and encourage the historical imagination.

The programme teaches students to inquire historically while making use of insights and interpretive techniques of other disciplines, and it seeks to encourage a spirit of critical thinking about contemporary social questions. Skills acquired through the programme shall serve programme graduates well not only in academic but in such careers as journalism, publishing, educational administration, museum/archive management, tourism/heritage management and government service (among others).

DURATION: 2 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 64



#### **MASOCIOLOGY**

The Masters (MA) Programme in Sociology at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi is designed to equip students with the knowledge and skills that will make them engaged citizens of the world capable of critical thinking and reflexive action. The unique approach of the program is its focus on orienting students to the relationship between text and context, self and society, and the past and present. Over the course of their program, students develop a reflexive awareness of the historicity of the social and the ability to locate the history of the discipline within the sociology of knowledge production. The MA programme in Sociology envisages its students as compassionate, engaged researchers and active learners committed to principles of social justice. Graduates from our programme are thus taught to think across disciplines and to ask questions from multiple vantage points while maintaining a firm sociological 'grounding' when exploring specific research issues.

DURATION: 2 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 64

#### **PhD HISTORY**

The School of Liberal Studies offers admission on an annual basis to PhD Programmes in History. Both the programmes emphasizes development of research competency. Research scholars shall acquire or improve skills for effective review of and engagement with scholarship (professional or expert literature) in their chosen areas of research. They are helped to discover and apply methodologies necessary to carry out original research through a variety of sources, be they written, oral, visual or material, with a view to evolving interdisciplinary and connected engagement with historical studies. Research scholars will actively contribute to the intellectual life of the University through regular communication about research work with faculty and fellow students. The main output of history research scholars' efforts will be a thesis (dissertation). PhD History scholars must submit theses within five (5) years of enrolment. Enrolment periods can be extended under conditions identified in the Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi PhD regulations.

#### **PhD MATHEMATICS**

The existence of post-graduate programmes at a University is a must for the academic growth of faculty members and also for the academic growth of the discipline. It is therefore natural that research programmes in Mathematics are being envisaged. Guiding students and teaching courses in their areas of specialisation will not only ensure an organic development within their area of research for faculty members but will also ensure that the PhD programme a pool of well trained mathematicians is created. The minimum period for completion of PhD, including coursework period is three years, and maximum is 5 years. More details regarding rules governing PhD programmes at Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi are available in the PhD regulations.

#### PhD ECONOMICS

The Ph.D. programme in economics aims to provide a well-rounded and rigorous training in economics which will enable research scholars to address substantive question using economic theory and empirical methods. It aims to produce scholars alive to the multiplicity of disciplinary traditions in economics and the connections of these traditions to each other and to other branches of human knowledge. The normal duration of the programme is five years from the date of enrolment of the student.

The programme is designed to be a full-time engagement for the students. No other degree will be



awarded to students not successfully completing the programme. In the first-year students take the required course on research methods and elective courses in their areas of interest. Thereafter the student is required to produce a thesis presenting his/her original research with the help active supervision / mentoring from the programme faculty.

#### PhD SOCIOLOGY

The Ph.D. programme in sociology resonates with the larger envisioning of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi, which seeks a dialogue between the ideal of equality, social justice and critical thinking. Through a doctoral degree in Sociology at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi, a scholar will be able to map the social reality in its complexities, arriving at a research question with the help of the taught courses as well as guided readings to actually doing the research-engaging with the field. Recently, the understanding of multi- sited- ness of the field has evolved new methods of both choosing the field and engaging with/in the field. It has resulted in the transformation of the discipline from within. The doctoral programme at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi intends to sensitize the scholars to these new explorations, changes and challenges. The PhD research scholars in sociology will benefit immensely from the inter-disciplinary focus of research and teaching that Ambedkar University encourages.

The PhD programme in sociology aims to produce research scholars, who are capable of creative and critical engagement with the contemporary world through their research, transforming the way one engages with and re-imagines the social. The faculty intends to create an environment for cutting edge research in social sciences, with a disciplinary focus in sociology with an inter and trans-disciplinary orientation. Our research students will be able to draw from the varied academic interests and specializations of the faculty, not only in the School of Liberal Studies but from across the university. In keeping with the inter and trans- disciplinary focus of the university, the students will be encouraged to take courses, do research/seminar papers and generally participate in the vibrant academic pursuits of the Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi campus.


















## SCHOOL OF UNDERGRADUATE STUDIES



School of Undergraduate Studies aims to offer its students a unique liberal arts education that acquaints them with diverse approaches to knowledge. The undergraduate programmes at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi encourage students to think critically and creatively, to analyse and reason, to communicate effectively, and to draw evidence-based conclusions. The aim of undergraduate education at Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi is not merely to provide specialised disciplinary knowledge, but to help our students in evolving as thoughtful citizens capable of understanding, analysing and communicating.

The unique aspect of undergraduate programmes at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi is that there are common modules for foundational skills comprising language, writing skills, communication skills, analytical reasoning and a core module in social sciences. This is done through a blend of common foundational courses, languages, core discipline courses and a wide range of elective courses. Students experience the flexibility of choosing courses from more than one disciplinary area, thus exploring not merely their chosen disciplines but also relationships between disciplinary paradigms.

The School offers compulsory language courses in English and Hindi. These courses are aimed at enabling students to understand and use these languages academically, as suited to the requirements of the programmes that they register in. Both, English and Hindi courses are offered at several levels, decided upon through a Language Proficiency Test, held soon after the end of the admissions process. The School offers seven BA (Honours) programmes.

#### **BA (HONOURS) ECONOMICS**

The BA (Honours) programme in Economics is designed to provide students a rigorous undergraduate training in economic analysis, with an emphasis on issues confronting developing economies like India. The aim is to expose students to multiple perspectives within the discipline and also be familiar with the social, historical, and political dimensions of economics.

DURATION: 3+1 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 162

#### **BA (HONOURS) ENGLISH**

The BA (Honours) programme in English introduces students to all aspects of the study of literature. Along with literature written in English, the course has a strong component of translations into English of Indian and all other significant literatures across the world. The study of literature is considered as the entry point for students to critically examine the world. The programme attempts to impart to the students an understanding of literature as a cultural and linguistic practice and arm them with tools to dismantle accepted and forced hierarchies in literary



and cultural practices. The English programme consists a host of elective courses from which the students are required to choose a fixed number each semester.

DURATION: 3+1 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 162

#### **BA (HONOURS) HISTORY**

The BA (Honours) programme in History is designed to stimulate students' interest in India's varied pasts in relation to wider global trends. The programme aims to introduce students to different ways of accessing the past that make the study of history exciting and rewarding. The programme focuses on five important areas that is Indian history, world history, Delhi as an area of study, history and its methodology, and a wide range of themes drawn from Indian and world history like race, caste, wars, revolutions, decolonisation, art, architecture etc.

The History programme strives to inculcate in its students, the basic question of study of history, that is, 'how do we know what we know'. Along with studying chronology, events and personalities, the programme lays an emphasis on the study of long term processes in history. Various courses taught in the BA History programme introduce students to sources, like archaeological evidences, inscriptions, coins, maps, historical biographies and autobiographies, paintings, historical monuments etc. and their role in history-writing.

DURATION: 3+1 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 162

#### **BA (HONOURS) MATHEMATICS**

An Honours programme in Mathematics at the Undergraduate level is one of the most versatile degrees in terms of skills, knowledge-base and career options. The BA (Honours) in Mathematics at Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi will provide the opportunity to develop all the above abilities and at the same time greatly enhance computational skills. The flexible framework of the credit-based semester system at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi provides a perfect opportunity to build a strong foundation in modern Mathematics as well as ability to explore other disciplines. The core courses in Mathematics will cover abstract algebra, real analysis, numerical analysis, probability and statistics, differential equations, linear optimization, number theory and cryptography.

A wide variety of elective courses in Mathematics will cover topics like mathematical finance, actuarial mathematics, mathematics for computer sciences, discrete mathematics, advanced algebra, advanced analysis and mathematical modelling. Computational skills and programming skills will be taught through extensive practical classes. Tutorials, lab sessions, workshops and seminars are some of the pedagogical hallmarks of the programme.

The Mathematics programme at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi does not have a compulsory internship. However, students are encouraged to apply for internships that require training in Mathematics in companies or in other reputed institutions. They are also encouraged to participate in summer schools and other programmes of mathematical nature. A strong project component will seek to augment their understanding of the discipline and its many applications. Some of the Mathematics courses may also have this component.

DURATION: 3+1 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 162

#### **BA (HONOURS) PSYCHOLOGY**

The BA (Honours) programme in Psychology hopes to provide to the student a comprehensive overview of the discipline of Psychology. It aspires to enable the student to think critically and creatively as s/he engages with complexities of human behaviour and experience across diverse locations. Catering to developing in the student an understanding of Psychology that is both



theoretical and applied, the programme offers both core and elective courses. social and abnormal psychology, statistics and the theories of personality. Elective courses blend psychological knowledge with pragmatic use showing the applicability of psychological understandings in different areas like counselling, organizational behaviour, psychological testing, experiments, case study etc. Innovative courses like 'Psychology in Action' and 'Psychology for India' are offered as well. In the final semester, students may opt for dissertation as an elective and undertake research in an area of their interest under the supervision of a faculty supervisor.

DURATION: 3+1 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 162

#### **BA (HONOURS) SOCIOLOGY**

The BA (Honours) programme in Sociology is designed to develop students' critical awareness of the relationship between self and society, and to question common sense assumptions about their everyday world. The programme aims to cultivate reflexive orientation through a combination of innovative courses that are theoretical, methodological and topical.

DURATION: 3+1 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 162

#### **BA (HONOURS) SOCIAL SCIENCES AND HUMANITIES**

The BA (Honours) Programme in Social Sciences and Humanities (SSH) can best be described as an immersion in interdisciplinary humanities. It allows students to explore three disciplines/disciplinary areas of the School in some depth over three years while obtaining the wider benefits of a liberal arts education.

Students admitted to Social Sciences and Humanities complete their core course requirement by choosing four core/ elective courses each from any three of the other honours disciplines described above. In addition, they can also choose Political Science and Hindi as their disciplines. Apart from the three discipline course component, the rest of the graduation rules remain the same as any other Honours programme.

DURATION: 3+1 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 162

#### **BA (HONOURS) POLITICAL SCIENCE**

Four year BA in political science at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi draws on the best traditions in the country and globally to offer students a rich experience of the subject. Starting with foundational courses on what political theory and thought are and moving on to cover all the major sub disciplines of Indian politics, comparative politics, public administration and international relations over the next 3 years, the BA in political science seeks a blend of the global with the local and immediate.



At the end of the course, the student will be trained to raise relevant questions of power, individual and group dynamics, and collective decision making in multiple contexts. The degree will prepare students for a range of dynamic and exciting careers in law, media, public policy and international and national organisations; and become thought and action leaders in their chosen fields.



# SCHOOL OF VOCATIONAL STUDIES



Delhi's changing demography and the resultant emergence of a large number of first-generation high school graduates who are keen to pursue full-time or part- time tertiary education for getting prepared to participate effectively in the fast- growing economy through acquisition of quality livelihood skills is the broad rationale for establishing the School of Vocational Studies (SVS) at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi. As part of the university's vision to reach ut to the people of Delhi, the School of Vocational Studies (SVS) was launched in 2017.

The B.Voc programmes offered by SVS are unique because the curriculum for each vocational programme has been designed in consultation with industry experts, industry associations, Sector Skill Councils, various Schools and Centres of the University and National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) as well as professionals and academics. SVS has explored and developed programmes and courses that provide students with the required skill-set and academic background for meaningful employment. These programmes are envisaged to enable learners to become self-employed, entrepreneurs, creators and generators of job for themselves and for many more educated youth in the society.

All programmes have mandatory component of internship/on-the-job-training to provide students with hands on learning on the real job floor. The skill courses are linked to the 'job roles' already identified by the concern sector skill council and aligned with the National Occupation Standard (NOS) as prescribed under the National Skill Qualifications Framework (NSQF) levels. Each vocational programme has both skills and general education components. The Skill components has both theory and practical component which prepare student for on- job- training and thereby facilitate to acquire such skills as required by the industries.

SVS currently offers four vocational programmes with multiple entry and exit options that lead to Certificate, Diploma, Advanced Diploma and Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc) and BVoc with Research/ Vocational Pedagogy degree in respective specialisations. The details on the programme components are presented as below:-

## BVOC EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTRE MANAGEMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP (ECCME)

BVoc. in ECCME programme has been conceptualised keeping in view to meet the need for preparation of day care professionals in the university system as well as in institutional set-up as a



degree programme. It is to be noted that the programme is not meant for preparation of preschool teachers. While a day care could have children from six months to 11 years, the specific focus in this degree programme would be two-fold—(i) on day care services for children from six months to three years and (ii) after school care for children up to elementary. A centre based day care with trained professionals would typically address issues of not just health and safety, but also create an environment that fosters cognitive and social-emotional development.

DURATION: 3+1 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 176

#### **BVOC RETAIL MANAGEMENT**

Retail Sector has been at the helm of India's growth story. The retail industry in India is vibrant and one of the fastest growing markets in the world especially in the sectors such as modern retail, traditional retail, e-commerce, direct selling, direct marketing etc. The BVoc. in Retail Management is a specialised undergraduate bachelor's degree programme which prepares the graduate to acquire such skills so that they become trained skilled manpower in the retail sector.

This programme is aimed to equip students with all the desired skills to meet the needs of today's customer by procuring the desired merchandise from the retail stores for their personal use. This programme helps students in developing skills required to bring the customers into the store and respond to their buying needs.

DURATION: 3+1 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 176

#### **BVOC TOURISM AND HOSPITALITY**

The Tourism & Hospitality programme aims at preparing students to the broad categories of fields within the service industries which includes lodging, event planning, theme parks, transportation, airline, cruise line, and such other employment opportunities within the hospitality & tourism industry. Today, the service industry is a major source of income for many countries, and brings impact on the economy of both the source and host countries; and in some cases being of vital importance.

The BVoc. in Tourism & Hospitality programme is a specialised undergraduate bachelor's degree programme which prepares the graduate to acquire such skills so that they become trained skilled manpower for this sector.

DURATION: 3+1 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 176

#### **BVOC ACCOUNTING & FINANCE**

Accounting & Finance is one of the important components of almost every business establishment, institution, organization, industry, etc. There are huge job opportunities and takers in Accounting & Finance sector in Delhi and around the National Capital Territory of Delhi. The B.Voc. in Accounting and Finance is a specialised undergraduate degree programme which prepares the graduates to acquire industry-relevant skills. This programme aims to develop competencies in students so that they participate in accelerating India's economy by gaining appropriate employment or becoming entrepreneurs.

DURATION: 3+1 YEARS TOTAL CREDITS: 176

All B.Voc. programmes of School of Vocational Studies are designed based on the University Grants Commission (UGC) guidelines. The programmes are designed to develop such skills



based on a specific job role as prescribed by the relevant industry body in commensuration with NSQF levels. The industry interface based on the job roles are presented as below:

#### M.VOC (Tourism & Hospitality Management)

M.VOC (Tourism & Hospitality Management) programme was launched in 2021 by the University. It aims to develop such skills for students in assuming managerial responsibility in the tourism, travel and hospitality industries. It also focuses to promote research activities in the field of tourism and hospitality sectors. The two year M.Voc (full time) programme comprises of four semesters. Each Semesters will have 30 credits of courses with mandatory Industrial Internship/Field Visit. The student successfully completing the four semesters will be awarded the master degree. Being an industry-driven programme, students graduating from this M.Voc programme will be able to find opportunities in the various formats of the organised tourism and hospitality sector such as Travel Agencies, Tourism operators, Airport Management, Tour Managers, Travel Consultants, Hospitality Managers etc. They will also be able to pursue higher level of research degree such as PhD in the field of Tourism and Hospitality.


































#### **NATIONAL CADET CORPS AUD (NCC)**

To inculcate leadership, camaraderie, discipline, a secular outlook, the spirit of adventure and ideals of selfless service amongst students, the university instituted a Senior Division Boys (Army) Sub-Unit of National Cadet Corps under 5 Delhi BN NCC, Kashmere gate, Delhi- 110006. In future, Senior Division Girls sub-unit for Female students will also be instituted.

In the three years of the training programme, NCC provides the cadets with basic military training, exposing them to the regimental way of life, leading to 'B' and 'C' certificates. The cadets will be able to attend various annual training camps and even be qualified (in the final year) for an Attachment Camp at the Indian Military Academy (IMA), Dehradun. In addition, cadets will be able to avail the opportunities for participation in various adventure activities, like Rock Climbing, Trekking, Cycle Expeditions, White Water Rafting, Para-trooping, Civil Defence, Self Defence, and Horse Riding etc.

#### COMPETENCE ENHANCEMENT SCHEME

The university has launched the Competence Enhancement Scheme across all the Schools of the University. - Co-Organized round table with feminist publishers and journalists titled 'Women's Voices, Visions of Democracy and Publishing' This was part of a workshop series under the UGC UKEIRI research project Teaching Feminisms Transforming Lives: Questions of Identity, Pedagogy and Violence in India and UK jointly conducted by Ambedkar University Delhi and University of Edinburgh https://feministtaleem.net/
- Co-organized International Conference on Childhood, Youth and Identity in South Asia jointly with Department of History, Shiv Nadar University



 The Centre intends to start short programmes on print and online publishing and editing.

#### **INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE (ICC)**

The Committee for Prevention of Sexual Harassment (CPSH) at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi has been rechristened as internal Complaints Committee (ICC). The composition of the ICC is as under:

(a) A Presiding Officer who shall be a woman faculty member employed at a senior level (not

below a Professor in case of a University, and not below an Associate Professor or Reader in case of a college) at the education institution, nominated by the Executive Authority;

Two faculty members and two non-teaching employees, preferably committed to the cause of women or who have had experience in social work or have legal knowledge, nominated by the Executive Authority;

- Mr. Bipul Kumar Srivastava, Deputy Registrar, Administration

- (b) Three students, if the matter involves students, who shall be enrolled at the undergraduate, master's, and research scholar levels respectively, elected through transparent democratic procedure;
  - To be notified in due course.
- (c) One member from amongst non-government organisations or associations committed to the cause of women or a person familiar with the issues relating to sexual harassment nominated by the Executive Authority.
  - Professor Arvinder Kaur, USICT, GGSIP University Delhi.

#### ZERO TOLERANCE FOR RAGGING

No form of ragging shall be tolerated in the University campus. Fresh students are advised to desist from doing anything, willingly or against their will, even if ordered to rag another student by a senior or any other student. Any attempt at ragging should be promptly reported to the Anti-Ragging Squad or to the Dean or to the Head of the University. All students are required to submit a signed affidavit in the format which can be downloaded from the website, <a href="http://antiragging.in/">http://antiragging.in/</a> at the time of admission(Annexure 8).

#### ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

As per the directions of the Supreme Court of India, ragging within or outside any educational institution is prohibited. "Ragging means doing an act which causes or is likely to cause insult or annoyance or fear or apprehension or threat or intimidation or outrage of modesty or injury to a student". If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his/her explanation is not found satisfactory the authority would expel him/her from the university. As per UGC Regulations, 2009 on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions under para6.3 (a & c) the University has constituted an Anti-Ragging Committee, as well as Anti-Ragging Squad. #### **CODE OF DISCIPLINE**

## PROGRAMMES AT DR. B. R. AMBEDKAR UNIVERSITY DELHI UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES

#### RESEARCH PROGRAMMES

Admissions to the PhD programmes generally happen twice a year, in July–August and January–February. The number of seats available in each School for research may vary. Cutting-edge, unconventional and interdisciplinary research in new and established fields is encouraged at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi.

#### ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION

The purpose of assessment and evaluation at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi is to facilitate and promote continuous learning with experiential understanding. Work done by students during the teaching semester will count for more than the end-of-course examination. Grades will be given to students for performance in tests, classroom presentations, group discussions, field work/project work, term papers and other exercises designed by teachers. The ability to work in a group or design a research project may be tested and evaluation may include peer assessment. Results of assessment will be communicated to students in a timely manner so that they have adequate opportunity to improve their subsequent work. Tutorials and mentoring will be important features of all programmes. For detailed Assessment and Evaluation Policy, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi website may be followed.

#### INDUSTRY INTERNSHIP

The programmes offered by SBPPSE have a credited Summer Internship Programme. The BVoc programmes offered by the SVS has a mandatory course work of intense engagement with relevant industries in the form of internship/On the Job-training (OJT) in each semester for minimum of 240 hours. This facilitates the students to understand the professional dynamics in the industries and thereby to make them job ready.

#### **MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION**

The medium of instruction at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi is English. However, we encourage students from different linguistic backgrounds to apply for admission to the different programmes at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi. Specially designed courses in English are organized to help students improve their language proficiency. The broad intent behind the policy is to help students progress from language deficiency to language proficiency and become a truly global citizen.

National Capital Territory of Delhi - 85% seats are reserved for Candidates belonging to National Capital Territory of Delhi, i.e. those who have passed the qualifying examination from any School/College/University located in NCT of Delhi. The candidates who have passed the qualifying examination through Distance/Open Education system of any recognized School/College/University and had his/her Study Centres in Delhi will be considered as NCT of Delhi Candidates but the responsibility to provide proof of his/her study centre in Delhi will be of the candidate only. The candidate must bring in writing the certificate issued by the concerned School/College/University imparting Distance/Open Education stating clearly that the study centre of the candidate is/was in NCT of Delhi or Outside NCT of Delhi. The I-card or any other document will not be considered as proof of study centre.

Outside National Capital Territory of Delhi - 15% seats are reserved for Candidates Outside National Capital Territory of Delhi, i.e. those who have passed the qualifying examination from any School/College/University located outside Delhi. The candidates who have passed the qualifying examination through Distance/Open Education system of any recognized School/College/University and had his/her Study Centres Outside Delhi will be considered as Outside Delhi Region Candidates but the responsibility to provide proof of his/her study centre outside Delhi will be of the candidate only. The candidate must bring in writing the certificate issued by the concerned University imparting Distance/ Open Education stating clearly that the study centre of the candidate is/was in Delhi or Outside Delhi. The I-card or any other document will not be considered as proof of study centre by the Admission Officer.

#### RELAXATION IN ELIGIBILITY

Candidates belonging to Persons With Benchmark Disability/ Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes/ Delhi Other Backward Classes {D-OBC (NCL)}/ Widows or Wards of Defence Personnel/KM will be allowed 5% relaxation of marks in the minimum eligibility requirement or as specified by the statutory body governing the programme of study, irrespective of the fact whether there exists any reservation for any category of such candidates or not.

The merit list for the unreserved category (UR) seats will comprise all the applicants in order of merit. No one will be excluded from the same. In other words, the merit list will also include SC / ST/D- OBC (NCL) applicants, irrespective of category, if they meet the criterion of merit for UR category.

No applicant can be excluded from the UR category merit list just because the applicant belongs to or has applied under SC/ST/D-OBC (NCL) category. Such an applicant is entitled to be considered under the UR category, as well as under the reserved category. Admission to UR category seats will be strictly in order of merit without excluding SC/ST/D-OBC (NCL) applicants.



#### **ECONOMICALLY WEAKER SECTION (EWS)**

Implementation of 10% reservation of Economically Weaker Sections is followed, as per letter no.F.DHE.1(119)/Estt./2018-19/2549-76 dated 17.06.2019 in terms of OM No. F No. 12-4/2020-U1 dated 17.01.2020 issued by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education in this respect to give effect to the provision of the Constitution (One Hundred and third Amendment) Act, 2020 for all higher educational institutions funded/aided, directly, or indirectly, by the Government of NCT of Delhi. The candidates shall be granted admission in EWS category subject to fulfilment of all the conditions as per rules of Govt. The Certificate for claiming reservation under EWS category needs to issued by the competent Authority as per the Annexure 1.

#### OTHER BACKWARD CLASSES

27% seats are reserved for Delhi OBC Category belonging to the list of OBC castes in Delhi. Students will be admitted in this category on the submission of a certificate to this effect from the Competent Authority of the Government of NCT of Delhi. Certificate issued by Govt. of India or any state government will not be accepted under any circumstances. A certificate issued by a Competent Authority of Delhi to an individual on the basis of Caste Certificate of his/her parents from another state will be accepted for claiming a seat under OBC Category if and only if the caste is in the list of notified OBC list by Govt. of NCT of Delhi (Annexure 9). The non-creamy layer certificate should be issued after 31st March, 2023. The caste certificate based on which reservation is sought must be issued with the Competent Authority of Delhi. #### PERSONS WITH BENCHMARK DISABILITIES (PWBD)

PwD seats shall be 5% (horizontal reservation) in accordance with the provisions of 'The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016' (PWD ACT). All the candidates who furnish PwD certificate from any Government Hospital located in Delhi or Outside Delhi under the provisions of 'The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016, shall be eligible for claiming reservation on NCT and ONCT seats (based on the seats availibilty & on the merit basis). Person with a Benchmark Disability Certificate (in the name of the applicant) issued by the Competent Authority will be accepted. Persons with Benchmark Disability must ensure that the Disability Certificates issued after 01.06.2021 must be as per the Gazette Notification no.1736 (E) dated 05.05.2021 issued by the Department of Empowernment of Persons with Disabilities and applied through the UDID portal. However, Disabilty Certificates issued before 01.06.2021, will be considered as per other existing applicable rules and notifications of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities. The Certificate for claiming reservation under PwD category needs to be issued by the competent Authority as per the Annexure 2.



The following specified categories of disabilities as mentioned in the Schedule to the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 [See clause (zc) of section 2 of Act of Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016] are eligible to get the benefit of the said reservation.

#### I. Physical

#### A. Locomotor disability

- 1. Locomotor disability (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including—
- 2. "leprosy cured person" means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—
  - (i) loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifestation of deformity;
  - (ii) manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
  - (iii) extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/ her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall construed accordingly;
- 3. "cerebral palsy" means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;
- 4. "dwarfism" means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimetres) or less;
- 5. "muscular dystrophy" means agroup of her editary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterised by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;
- 6. "acid attack victims" means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

#### B. Visual impairment

- 7. "blindness" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after bestcorrection -
  - (i) total absence of sight; or
  - (ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or
  - (iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.
- 8. "low-vision" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:
  - (i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or
  - (ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 10 degree.



#### C. Hearing impairment

- 9. "deaf" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
- 10. "hard of hearing" means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
- 11. "speech and language disability" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.
- II. Intellectual disability, a condition characterised by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—
- 12. "specific learning disabilities" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;
- 13. "autism spectrum disorder" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.

#### III. Mental behaviour

14. "Mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognise reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterised by sub normality of intelligence.

#### IV. Disability caused due to

- (a) Chronic neurological conditions, such as—
- 15. "multiple sclerosis" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are dam- aged, leading to demyelination and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;
- 16. "Parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.
- (b) Blood disorder—
- 17. "haemophilia" means an inheri1table disease, usually affecting only male but trans- mitted by women to their male children, characterised by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding;
- 18. "Thalassemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterised by reduced or ab- sent amounts of haemoglobin.



19. "Sickle cell disease" means a haemolytic disorder characterised by chronic anaemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "haemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of haemoglobin.

#### V. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities)

- 20. Multiple disabilities including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a per- son may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.
- 21. Any other category as may be notified by the Appropriate Government.

#### **SCHEDULED CASTE**

15% of seats are reserved for candidate belonging to SC Category. The format for Certificate claiming reservation under SC category needs to be issued by the Competent Authority and for Delhi SC seats the list of caste as per the Presidential order 1951 as updated time to time (Annexure 10).

#### **SCHEDULED TRIBE**

7.5% of seats are reserved for candidate belonging to ST Category applicants. The Certificate for claiming reservation under ST category needs to be issued by the Competent Authority.

#### NOTE:

The policy as stated in this document is subject to the change in compliance of the University and/or Government of NCT of Delhi policies as notified from time to time, on or before the date of commencement of Admissions.

A list of approved Competent Authorities for the issuance of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe certificates is as under:-

- District Magistrate, Additional District Magistrate, Deputy Commissioner, Collector, Additional Deputy Commissioner, Deputy Collector, 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate, City Magistrate (not below the rank of 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate), Sub-Divisional Magistrate, Taluk Magistrate, Executive Magistrate and Extra Assistant Commissioner;
- Chief Presidency Magistrate, Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate and Presidency Magistrate;
- Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar;
- Administrator, Secretary to the Administrator or the Development Officer (Lakshadweep & Minicoy Islands)
- The candidates belonging to the communities, which are not included in the list of Scheduled Castes for Delhi, in the Presidential order, will not be entitled to admission in the University against the seats reserved for Scheduled Castes candidates of the NCT of Delhi. The candidates, belonging to the communities, included in the list of Scheduled Castes, in the Presidential order, in relation to Delhi will be entitled to be considered for admission in the University, against the seats reserved for SC candidates, in terms of the Presidential order dated 20th September, 1951, as amended time to time, by the law made in this regard.



- The required certificate (s) for reserved categories/ classes will be essential at the time of the admission / documents verifications and no provisional admission shall be admissible for want of caste/category certificate from the local competent authority. Further, the caste/category certificate should invariably be in the name of candidate himself/herself and not in favor of respective parents/ guardians. The candidate shall not be entitled / eligible for admission against reserved seat, even on the basis of any undertaking
- In case of married woman, applying to any course under reserved category, the applicant has to produce the caste certificate in her name. Certificate in the name of husband/ mother /father is not acceptable.

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- 1. Reservation policy as enumerated above may be modified in light of instructions received from Statutory bodies governing specific programmes of studies, Govt. Of India, Govt. of NCT of Delhi, Hon'ble Court(s) and / or the University, on or before the start of admissions. If any change in the reservation policy is made by the Government, the same will be announced on University's Website (www.aud.ac.in) and implemented. Admissions will be made in accordance with the reservation policies of the Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi in respect of various social groups and other categories as applicable to institutions of higher education.
- 2. Clarification for Admissions under Reserved Category: Admission will be permissible to qualified candidates in any programme in the following conditions: -
  - If qualifying examination is passed from Delhi and Reservation certificate issued from Delhi for SC/ST/OBC categories, then admission is permissible under NCT Reserved category.
  - If qualifying examination is passed from Outside Delhi and Reservation certificate issued from anywhere in India, including Delhi for SC/ST categories, then admission is permissible under ONCT Reserved category.
  - If qualifying examination is passed from Delhi and Reservation certificate issued from Outside Delhi for SC/ST/OBC categories, then admission is permissible only under NCT Unreserved category.

### ARMED FORCES / DEFENCE (CW)

The University reserves 5% (horizontal reservation) of the total number seats in all programmes under CW category. The applicants seeking admission under this category need to upload Certificate (Annexure 3) issued by any of the following authorities:

- Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board, Delhi
- Secretary, Rajya Zila Sainik Board
- Officer-in-Charge, Record Office
- 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate
- Ministry of Home Affairs (For Police Personnel in receipt of Gallantry Awards)

Admission may be offered to the Children / Widows of Officers and Men of the Armed Forces including Para-Military Personnel, in the following order of preference:



- I. Widows / Wards of Defence personnel killed in action/ Para Military Personnel killed in action. Required Certificate: Proof in Original
- II. Wards of Defence Personnel and ex-servicemen/Para Military Personnel disabled in action and boarded out from service with disability attributable to military service. Required Certificate: Original disability certificate clearly indicating the disability is attributable to Military Services in action and was boarded out
- III. Widows / Wards of Defence personnel /Para Military Personnel who died while in service with death attributable to military service. Required Certificate Proof in Original.
- IV. Wards of Defence personnel / Para Military Personnel disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to the military service. Required Certificate: Original disability certificate clearly indicating the disability is attributable to Military Services and was boarded out.
- V. Wards of Serving / Ex-servicemen / Para Military Personnel/Police personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards. Required Certificate: Proof in Original
  - 1) Param Vir Chakra
  - 2) Ashok Chakra
  - 3) MahaVir Chakra
  - 4) Kirti Chakra
  - 5) Vir Chakra
  - 6) Shaurya Chakra
  - 7) Sena, Nau Sena, Vayusena Medal

  - 10) Police Medal for Gallantry
- VI Wards of Ex-Servicemen Required Certificate: Original ex-servicemen Identity Card/discharge book supported by PPO (Pension Payment Order).

#### VII. Wives of:

- Defence Personnel disabled in action and boarded out from service. Required Certificate:
   Original disability certificate clearly indicating the disability is attributable to Military Services
   in action and was boarded out.
- Defence Personnel disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service. Required Certificate: Original disability certificate clearly indicating the disability is attributable to Military Services and was boarded out.
- 3) Ex-Servicemen and Serving Personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards. Proof in Original. Only the Gallantry Awards specified in Priority V shall be considered.
- VIII. Wards of Serving Personnel. Original Service Identity Card and Dependent Card/ Certificate issued by the Competent Authority
- IX. Wives of Serving Personnel. Required Certificate: Original Service Identity Card and Dependent Card/ Certificate issued by the Competent Authority.



Entitlement card in original issued by the Record Officer of the concerned unit or the regiment of the armed forces in case of personnel of the armed forces is to be produced as proof for claiming reservation in a particular category at the time of admission/document verification.

In addition, the candidate will also have to submit undertaking as per Annexure 3 duly completed in original and signed by the competent authority at the time of admission/document verification.

#### Note:

- For the purpose of reservation, only notification which states that the Sena Medal has been awarded for Gallantry will be accepted and the Sena Medal for Distinguished Services will not be considered.
- 2. For admission to a seat reserved for Defence Category: i. Entitlement card in original issued by the Record Officer of the Unit/ Regiment of Armed Personnel of the Armed Forces in case of Armed Personnel. ii. The Children/ Widow of the officers and men of Armed forces who died or were disabled on duty must submit a certificate to that effect from the following authorities. i. Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board. ii. Secretary, Rajya/ ZilaSainik Board. iii. Officer-in-Charge, Record Office.

#### SINGLE GIRL CHILD

One supernumerary seat is reserved for a Single Girl Child in each programme. The daughter should be the only Single Girl Child/Twin Daughter/Fraternal Daughter of the family and there is no other male and female child in the family. Affidavit must be uploaded/produced in the form as per the attached Annexure 4

#### **KASHMIRI MIGRANTS**

One supernumerary seat in each programme is allocated to Kashmiri migrants. The certificate issued by the Competent Authority needs to be uploaded/produced as per the Annexure 5.

#### **FOREIGN STUDENTS**

Every undergraduate and postgraduate degree programme has a Foreign Student (FS) supernumerary quota of 15%. The numbers of FS seats in those programmes are indicated in the tables above. For the numbers of FS seats in PhD programmes, see the separate bulletin for foreign student admission. Note that the FS admission category is a unitary category separate from other admission categories. An applicant who applies under the FS category cannot be considered for admission under any other category, and vice versa. There are no other admission categories within the FS admission category. It should be noted that FS admission is 'in absentia', and in all programmes there are different eligibility requirements, application fees, admission procedures and tuition charges for applicants under the FS and the Indian categories. For information about FS admission, see the separate bulletin and information on the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi website ('Admissions 2023').



#### CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITY (CCA) CATEGORY & SPORTS

Candidates seeking admission in Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi who have special talent and achievements in the areas of Sports, Dance, Debating, Fashion, Fine Art, Literary, Music, Quiz, Theatre, Visual Culture can apply under the Sports & CCA category for admission. For School of Culture and Creative Expressions, CCA seats are not applicable.

In view of the challenges brought about by Covid-19, the detailed policy or any change in the procedures for personal appearance of applicants for entrance examinations/trials for CCA and Sports, as well as for verification of certificates shall be notified in due course by the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi on its website: www.aud.ac.in. Applicants are advised to monitor the same and act as directed.

# Guidelines for Co-Curricular Activities (CCA) Quota Admission (Supernumerary) in 2023-24.

There will be one seat under the Co-curricular Activity (CCA) quota in each BA and MA programme excluding some programmes in MA. For admission under the CCA quota, the following criteria will be maintained.

- 1. Applicants under the CCA quota need to register on the official website of AUD (those who have registered for Common University Entrance Test (CUET) in case of UG programmes), similar to the AUD admission procedure for other candidates.
- 2. Benefits on the basis of CCA shall be given to candidates who apply for admission under the reserved/supernumerary category of CCA.
- 3. At the time of filling the application form for AUD admissions, candidates also need to upload their CCA Certificates on the AUD admission portal.
- 4. There will be one seat allocated to the CCA quota in each BA and MA Programme offered by the University.
- 5. List of **Undergraduate Programmes and** total number of seats under CCA Quotas (Supernumerary) **at AUD** is mentioned in this document for 2023-2024.
- 6. List of CCA areas eligible for admission under the reserved/supernumerary Category of CCA:

CCA areas to be considered for admission under the reserved/supernumerary category of CCA for (2023-2024) will be based on the facilities available at AUD. The following nine areas will be considered this year. Preference for admission will be given to CCA areas in which AUD University inter-college and inter-university competitions are held.

- vi. Fashion
- vii. Literary
- viii. Quiz
- ix. Debate



#### 7. Guidelines for Admission on the basis of CCA and Allotment of Programmes

- i. 25% weightage will be given to the marks obtained through academic performance in CUET/Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi entrance examinations. 25% weightage will be given to the marks calculated on the basis of an aggregate of 3 certificates submitted by the applicants of three preceding years beginning from 01.07.2020 to 30.06.2023. Top 10 applicants (based on score obtained by adding 25% weightage of CUET score and 25% weightage of certificate score will qualify for the trials. Performance trial-cuminterview will have 50% weightage of the total marks obtained.
- ii. The CCA committees may follow the parameter of marking on certificates as follows: At the levels of International, National - Government recognized, and Inter university or Inter school:

1<sup>st</sup> position 40, 2<sup>nd</sup> position 36, and 3<sup>rd</sup> position 30.

At the levels of State - government/ national-non-government/ Inter-colleges or Inter-schools:

1<sup>st</sup> position 24, 2<sup>nd</sup> position 20, and 3<sup>rd</sup> position 16.

At the levels of District - government / State - non-government / Inter-colleges or inter-schools:

1<sup>st</sup> position 12, 2<sup>nd</sup> position 8, and 3<sup>rd</sup> position 4.

- iii. The CCA Selection committee for each CCA area will comprise the members as follows:
  - a. Dy. Dean of Students Services for CCA
  - b. Faculty Co-conveners of each CCA area from KG campus
  - c. Faculty Co-conveners of each CCA area from other campuses of AUD
  - d. Any other member appointed by the HVC.
- iv. 50% marks on trial in one of the CCA areas. A minimum of 50% of this criterion will be the qualifying marks.
- v. Applicants securing higher marks in CCA merit of each CCA area will be given higher preference.
- vi. If there is a tie between two candidates to have secured the top merit in two different CCA areas and these candidates are looking for a place in the same programme, the tie shall be resolved by considering the "academic merit," i.e. as per admission criteria of the concerned school. And, even then, if there is a tie, such a tie will be resolved by the CCA Committee in a manner that these two applicants may get admission to one of the programmes from their preference list.
- vii. The grievance related to the allocation of marks for Merit/Participation Certificate, CCA Trial and allocation of a programme shall be redressed by the AUD Grievance Committee headed by the Deputy Dean of SS for CCA and comprising concerned faculty co-conveners. The AR of SS division will be Secretary of this Grievance Committee.

- 3. At the time of filling the application form for AUD admissions, candidates also need to upload their Sports related Certificates on the AUD admission portal.
- 4. There will be one seat allocated to the Sports quota in each BA and MA *Programme offered by the University.*

- vi. If there is a tie between two candidates to have secured the top merit in two different Sports areas and these candidates are looking for a place in the same programme, the tie shall be resolved by considering the "academic merit", i.e. as per admission criteria of the concerned school. And, even then if there is a tie, such a tie will be resolved by the Sports Committee in a manner that these two applicants may get admission in one of the programmes from their preference list.
- vii. The grievance related to the allocation of marks for Merit/Participation Certificate, Sports Trial and allocation of programme shall be redressed by the AUD Grievance Committee headed by the Dean SS and comprising of sports committee members.

Note:- The above mentioned policy of Sports and CCA Trial is subjected to any change further which will be notified separately.

#### **Caution Deposit**

The component of Caution Deposit (refundable) of the total fee has to be claimed by the student within 3 years from the date of completion of degree/withdrawal, otherwise all unclaimed Caution Deposit shall be credited to the Govt. fund after three years.



#### **PAYMENT OF FEES**

All candidates who are provisionally offered admission to a programme will be required to deposit the fee within the time stipulated in the admission notice. Students will be required to pay the fees of the subsequent semester/s within four weeks of the commencement of classes. A penalty of Rs. 100, will be imposed per week for late payment and after four weeks of non- payment, the name of the student shall be de- enrolled from the programme.

#### **FEE-WAIVER**

It is the stated policy of the University that no deserving applicant, as far as possible, is denied the opportunity of studying at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi merely due to her/his inability to pay the fees. To implement this comprehensive fee-waiver policy is adopted.

The University offers full and partial tuition fee-waivers to students who are in need of support given their economic background. Students with an annual family income of less than Rs. 6 Lakhs will be considered for tuition fee-waiver. The University extends full waiver of Tution Fees to all students belonging to SC, ST and PwBD Category.

The gross annual family income ceiling (slab-wise) for availing tuition fee-waiver from the economically backward students (other than SC, ST and PwBD), is given below:

**Note:** The University extends waiver of tuition fees to all eligible students as per the policy as applicable and duly notified on Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi website at the time of admission/document verification for the session 2023-24.

#### PROCEDURE FOR APPLYING FOR FEE-WAIVER

At the time of admission, a student can apply for Tuition Fee Waiver by submitting suppoting documents as below: -

#### SC/ST/PwBD Students: -

Self undertaking for availing the fee waiver in the prescribed format (to be filled by all applicants) as per annexure 11C subject to the submission of valid caste certificate issued by appropriate Competent Authority.

### **Economically-Backward Students: -**

Income certificate issued on or after 1<sup>st</sup> April 2023 by the Competent Authority.

#### **Refund of Fees**

If a student chooses to withdraw from the programme of the study in which he/she enrolled or admitted, Dr. B.R.University Delhi shall follow the latest refund policy as per the notification issued by UGC.



- **Note:** 1. \*Refund of Caution money and Security deposit, which are not part of the fees chargeable, shall be refunded in full.
  - 2. THE FORMALLY NOTIFIED LAST DATE OF ADMISSION shall be notified on University website for the Admission Year 2023-24.

#### STUDENT WELFARE FUND

The University has created a Student Welfare Fund with the objective of making financial assistance available for meeting the welfare needs of students in need, such as conveyance, purchase of books and study material.

Through the fee structure as well as the exemptions offered, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi hopes to inculcate a social sensitivity in its students—to respect what they enjoy as privileges and to be able to serve society in their future professional capacities.

#### IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICANTS

- All admissions in the University shall be provisional till regularized by the University.
- Your candidature in the whole admission process /selection process is "PURELY PROVISIONAL" pending scrutiny of your eligibility as mentioned in this document for the programme. In case, it is found at any stage of selection that the candidate does not fulfill the eligibility criteria and any information provided by the candidate is found to be false or is not in conformity with the eligibility criteria mentioned in this document including Age, Caste Category, Sub-Category, Application Fee, Educational Qualification, etc. the candidature of such a candidate will be rejected at any stage of selection process and even after appointment.
- The candidate will have to submit the final result of qualifying degree/provisional certificate/marksheet proving his/her eligibility on or before the date of admission or on the day of verification of documents (to be announced).
- Result Awaited / Compartment / Supplementary Cases
  - All such candidates who have appeared in the qualifying examination (irrespective of the outcome of their final result) will be eligible to apply/appear in the admission process 2023-24 and all such candidate(s) have to produce qualifying degree/ marksheet/provisional certificate at the time of document verification of the admission process.
- For ascertaining the eligibility conditions, combination of mark sheets, shall be allowed, only and only if the mark sheets are from the same Board. If any particular candidate changes the Board e.g. CBSE to NIOS, an appropriate proof of accepting the marks of earlier Board shall be required, by the new Board. Thus, such candidate shall supply the one complete mark sheet making him eligible. The decision for ascertaining the region will be based on the documents produced by the candidate.
- Applicants are required to submit medical certificate as enclosed in Annexure 7 at the time of admission.
- Category: Select the appropriate option for your categories DSC, DST,SC,ST,D-OBC(NCL), UR, EWS, PwBD(Persons with Benchmark Disability), Defence and Kashmiri Migrant. If no category is specified, you would be considered as falling under Unreserved category. And, no claim whatsoever shall be entertained thereafter. Category certificate to be



verified at the admission. If a candidate falls in more than two categories, he / she can select multiple options.

- The medium of instruction for all programmes (except for MA and BA Hindi) of studies offered in the University shall be English unless otherwise specified in the Scheme and Syllabi of Examinations of the concerned programme of study.
- For formats of self-declaration / affidavits / undertakings required at the time of admissions, candidates are advised to see the Annexures of this document.
- All admitted students to any programme in Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi and their parents/guardian shall have to give an affidavit / undertaking for not indulging in any Ragging during the tenure of the student in the University.
- Students and their parents are advised, in their own interest, to visit the campus prior to the date(s) of admission to ascertain the location, other academic and infrastructural facilities available such as hostel, transportation etc. in the various campuses which may facilitate their decision-making at the time of admission.
- If it is found at any stage during the entire period of the programme that the candidate has either concealed any material information or has furnished any false or incorrect information in the application form or at the time of admission, his/her candidature for the programme will be cancelled summarily. In addition, disciplinary action may be taken against him/her as per the University rules.
- The University shall not issue any certificate of equivalence to any other programme of study.

- The University reserves the rights to add or remove any programme from the list of programmes grouped together for the purpose of admissions.
- Any Change / Addition / Modification / further clarification about eligibility conditions for admission in various programmes, if required, will be notified on the University Website through separate notification.
- Terms and conditions notified in this brochure, and notified time to time on the University website www.aud.ac.in shall be binding on all applicants. In case of any dispute, the decision of the Vice Chancellor, Dr. BRAmbedkar University, Delhi shall be final.
- If the University is not satisfied with the character, past behavior or antecedents of a candidate, it can refuse to admit him/her to any course of study of the University.



- The Vice Chancellor may cancel the admission of any student for specific reasons and / or debar him/her for a certain period from admissions and / or examinations.

# $^1\mathrm{THE}$ CONSTITUTION (SCHEDULED CASTES) $^2[(\mathrm{UNION}\ \mathrm{TERRITORIES})]$ ORDER 1951 C.O. 32

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (1) of article 341 of the Constitution of India, as amended by the Constitution (First Amendment) Act, 1951, the President is pleased to make the following Order, namely:—

- 1. This Order may be called the Constitution (Scheduled Castes) 2[(Union Territories)] Order, 1951.
- 2. Subject to the provisions of this Order, the castes, races or tribes or parts of, or groups within, castes or tribes, specified in <sup>3</sup>[Parts I to III] of the Schedule to this Order shall, in relation to the <sup>2</sup>[Union territories] to which those parts respectively relate, be deemed to be Scheduled Castes so far as regards members thereof resident in the localities specified in relation to them respectively in those Parts of that Schedule.
- <sup>4</sup>[3. Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph 2, no person who professes a religion different from the Hindu, <sup>5</sup>[the Sikh or the Buddhist] religion shall be deemed to be a member of a Scheduled Caste.]
- <sup>6</sup>[4. Any reference in this Order to a Union territory in Part I of the Schedule shall be construed as a reference to the territory constituted as a Union territory, as from the first day of November, 1956, any reference to a Union territory in Part II of the Schedule shall be construed as a reference to the territory constituted as a Union territory as from the first day of November, 1966 and any reference to a Union territory in Part III of the Schedule shall be construed as a reference to the territory constituted as a Union territory as from the day appointed under clause (b) of section 2 of the Goa, Daman and Diu Reorganisation Act, 1987.]
