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Ex-CM house may be leased out to luxury hotel operator

New Delhi: The Flag Staff Road house, once in the news for its allegedly expensive renovation done by former chief minister Arvind Kejriwal, could now be leased out to a luxury hospitality operator by PWD.

Official events, too, would be held at the address. Public Works Department (PWD) will complete the unfinished, two-storeyed camp for built-up to the residence and use it as a venue for state meetings and conferences as well as for private entities when it is not being used by govt, an official said. Construction of this structure started in 2022 but was halted after an investigation started into the expensive renovation of the house.

This proposal is BJP govt's latest move to repurpose the controversial Civil Lines property. Earlier, there had been plans of converting it into a state guest house and cultural centre and handing the property over to central govt. In return, Delhi govt would have received multiple houses from the central pool for states.

PWD minister Parvendra Verma said govt was exploring a partnership with established hospitality companies to professionally manage the property.



The Civil Lines property became the centre of a long running political tug-of-war over allegations of extravagant spending on its renovations.

"We were thinking of tying up with established companies that are in this business as managed professionally. At present, we spend a lot of money on its maintenance, which is an unnecessary govt expense. If the same property can be used by govt to generate revenue, it would be a better option," Verma said.

Officials said PWD is preparing a proposal detailing the operational model for the property. Under the plan, govt is considering leasing the residence to a luxury hotel or hospitality operator that could run it. It could even be under the state's bed-and-breakfast (B&B) policy. Earlier shared by Information Secretary to Delhi govt in the Assembly around Rs 50 crore was spent on the project before work came to a halt. The total project cost was estimated to be around Rs 60 crore.

The former chief minister's address became the centre of a long running political tug-of-war over allegations of extravagant spending on its renovations. BJP alleged that Rs 52 crore of public money was spent on the interior. The renovation also triggered allegations of financial irregularities and violation of building norms, leading to inquiries by multiple agencies, including those initiated by the Lieutenant Governor, Central Vigilance Commission and the CBI.

AAP in Kejriwal's defence, said BJP was giving inflated numbers and that it was built in the chief minister's house and not for Kejriwal and any CM would be entitled to live there.

Professionals and firms to be third-party fire safety auditors

New Delhi: Delhi Fire Service (DFS) has begun engaging elite professionals and firms as third-party fire safety auditors, who will be authorised to inspect buildings and issue fire safety certificates under the recently amended fire codes. The objective is to improve the ease of doing business and ensure that people have better options for obtaining fire NOCs.

Applications are invited for registration and empanelment of third-party fire safety auditors. Unlike a one-time recruitment process, the application process will remain open on a continuous basis, allowing eligible professionals to apply for empanelment at any time.

For empanelment, the auditors require higher qualifications and experience for the three categories of the safety auditors. Level 1 auditors must have a relevant degree or a post graduate diploma in fire safety and one to three years of experience. Level 2 auditors require higher qualifications or specialised training and prior experience as a level 1 auditor. Level 3 auditors will be authorised to certify all building categories. They must have advanced fire safety qualifications or international professional membership along with at least five to ten years of relevant experience.

Sachin Rana, principal director DFS, said, "Once empanelled, auditors will be empowered to issue fire safety guidelines and safety certificates to the applicants." However, the department will retain the power to carry out inspections and verify certifications. Registration will remain valid for three years. All empanelled auditors will also have to undergo mandatory training at the Fire Safety Management Academy in Rohini.

Traffic Cop On Challan Duty Mowed Down By Car; 2 Held

Vehicle Owned By 22-Yr-Old Student; Tempo Driver At Wheel

New Delhi: The owner and the driver of a car that allegedly mowed down a traffic cop on duty near Alipur Wednesday have been arrested, police said.

The accused have been identified as Nishu (22), a first-year college student and owner of the car, and Kishore (24), a tempo driver who was at the wheel when the car mowed down the cop.

The car hit head constable Amit around 6 pm when, as part of the traffic unit on the highway, he was conducting a speed enforcement drive on NH-44. The traffic unit was checking for speeding vehicles.

The accident happened when a traffic unit car from Narela Circle, comprising ASI Nishu, HC Vinod and HC Amit, was doing a speed enforcement drive on the highway. HC Amit signalled the speeding vehicle to stop, but instead of slowing down, the driver continued driving rashly and hit him. The impact threw Amit on the road, leaving him critically injured. A senior police officer said, "He was rushed to a hospital where doctors declared him brought dead."

A case was registered at Alipur police station under sections 281 (rash driving or driving on a public way) and 304A (causing death by negligence) of BNS. Both the accused were subsequently traced and apprehended.

Police said Amit, a resident of Sonapat in Haryana, is survived by his wife, Aarti, and their two children. His elder son is 10 years old, and the daughter is just three.

"Thursday was Aarti's birthday," his brother, Sumit, told.

He was rushed to a hospital where doctors declared him brought dead.

HC orders daily medical check-up for Wangchuk

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NEW DELHI: The Delhi High Court on Thursday directed the Centre to ensure that activist Sonam Wangchuk's health is medically examined every day by government doctors and necessary medical intervention is provided if his condition deteriorates.

Wangchuk, 58, has been on a hunger strike since June 25 as part of a protest organised by the Cockroach Janata Party (CJP), which is demanding the resignation of Union education minister Dharmendra Pradhan over alleged irregularities in computer examinations.

A bench of chief justice TR Upadhyaya and justice TK Kurian observed that the life of every citizen is precious and that the authorities must make every possible medical attempt to protect it.

"While noticing the assurances given by the solicitor general we observe that life of citizens is precious and all medical attempts must be made by the government authorities to appreciate the same and we direct that medical condition of Wangchuk shall be regularly monitored on daily basis and depending on the opinion of doctors, whenever medical intervention is required be taken, condition of his deteriorating condition. The petition is disposed of, the court said in its order.

The directions came in a petition filed by advocate Rakesh Kumar Saini seeking directions to the Centre and Delhi government to shift Wangchuk to a hospital and provide him medical treatment, including force-feeding if necessary.

In his petition, Saini asserted that Wangchuk's health has deteriorated significantly during the hunger strike, with he allegedly losing 8.5 kg. It said that if the last continues, his life could be at risk within the next two days.

"If he passes away, it would be a matter of great shame for the country and the world," the plea stated. This was after solicitor general Tushar Mehta, appearing

Replace Pradhan with Wangchuk: Kejriwal

NEW DELHI: Former Delhi chief minister and AAP national convenor Arvind Kejriwal on Thursday paid a visit to educationist Sonam Wangchuk at Jantar Mantar and called on the Centre to appoint Wangchuk as the Union education minister.

"I would urge the Union government to appoint Wangchuk as education minister and remove the incumbent minister, Dharmendra Pradhan, as part of the reforms sought by the protesters," Kejriwal said, addressing the event.

The protest site, which has witnessed a continuous sit-in since June 20, drew hundreds of students, teachers, activists and supporters as Kejriwal, accompanied by AAP leaders Sanjay Singh and Saravjit Bhargawa, addressed the gathering from the stage where Wangchuk has been fasting. Wangchuk, who appeared visibly weak, remained seated for most of the programme and was seen resting on the stage between speeches.

He said the country's education system required structural reforms. "I am glad that young people have come together under the banner of the Cockroach Janata Party (CJP) to demand a more robust and transparent system," he said in his 10-minute address.

Kejriwal said he would request the protesters to persuade Wangchuk to end his fast while assuring them that AAP would raise the issues during the upcoming Monsoon Session of Parliament.

There was no reaction from the Delhi BJP over Kejriwal's remarks. Arvind Kejriwal, leader of the AAP, said he would support Wangchuk's demand for a more robust and transparent system.

Farmer leader Rakesh Tikait also expressed solidarity with Wangchuk. Organisers said the movement would continue at Jantar Mantar while preparations were underway for a march to Parliament on July 20.

HC GIVES KEJRIWAL, OTHERS ONE LAST CHANCE TO REPLY IN EXCISE CASE

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NEW DELHI: The Delhi High Court on Thursday granted a final opportunity to former chief minister Arvind Kejriwal, former deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia and AAP leader Durgesh Pathak to file their replies to the Central Bureau of Investigation's (CBI) appeal challenging a trial court order discharging them in the excise policy case.

"The report of the registry indicates that so far, no reply has been received from respondents 8 (Manish Sisodia), 18 (Arvind Kejriwal) and 19 (Durgesh Pathak) though opportunity was granted to them earlier on several occasions. In view of the importance of the case, the court directed them to file their replies in its order dated July 17, 2025," the court said, granting them a final opportunity to file their replies by July 22, 2025. The trial court had granted a stay on the CBI's appeal against the trial court order discharging them in the excise policy case. The agency challenged the order in the HC.

4 people arrested for obstructing BLO on SIR duty in Old Delhi

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NEW DELHI: Four people have been arrested for allegedly obstructing a government school teacher on election duty, ousting her modesty and preventing her from carrying out the Special Inmate Revision (SIR) exercise in the Walled City earlier this month, police said on Thursday. Deputy commissioner of police (central) Rohit Rajbir Singh said the accused have been identified as Mohammad Sabreen, 44, Azeem Rehman, 58, Mohammad Asif, 50, and Mohammad Afzal, 44, all residents of the Turkman Gate area. According to police, the complainant, a 30-year-old resident of Old Delhi, who teaches special education at a government school and is employed as a Booth Level Officer (BLO), alleged that on July 5, while discharging his duties in the area, he was obstructed by the four accused who forced him to place a BLO

register on her lap and signed it despite her objection. She alleged that three other accused present at the spot laughed, abused her and refused to accept the enumeration forms. "One man placed the register on my lap I was trying to pick it up, but he forced it on my lap in sign it. The other three men looked at each other and laughed derisively. The whole incident made me feel very uncomfortable," she told HT. Police said the woman did not immediately report the matter and instead consulted her senior officers. The issue was later brought to the notice of the ADM (Old Delhi), who informed the police on Thursday. Police said an FIR was registered under Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita sections 22 (obstructing a public servant), 132 (use of criminal force), 74 (outrage of modesty), 79 (word, gesture or act intended to insult the modesty of a woman), and 305 (common luncheon).

3 COUNCILLORS SUSPENDED OVER CROSS-VOTING IN MCD POLLS: AAP

NEW DELHI: Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) on Thursday suspended three councillors with immediate effect, a day after the party alleged cross-voting during 1 ward council elections.

The councillors are Nirmal Devi and Krishna Devi Raj from the West Zone, and Sufi Ahsan from the City SP Zone. "Strict action will be taken against any individual involved in anti-party activities," the party said in a statement. GHAZIABAD VALUED AT ₹150 CRORE

26-year-old shoots father dead over property claim

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GHAZIABAD: A 26-year-old man allegedly shot dead his 52-year-old father at their home in Ghaziabad's Modinagar, after an argument over property rights. The incident occurred on Wednesday night, a police officer said on Thursday. Police identified the accused as Nikhil Singh and the deceased as his father, Harish Nehra. The family lived in a house in Modinagar. Police said Nehra was at home on Wednesday night with his elder son when the suspect, arrived around 11 pm. They got into an argument as Singh adamantly demanded a larger share in his father's property. Bhuskar Verma, assistant commissioner of police, Modinagar, said, adding that Nehra's property was valued at around ₹150 crore.

The suspect allegedly opened fire with his pistol, and Nehra sustained four gunshot wounds. Singh fled the scene immediately afterwards, Nehra was rushed to a hospital, where doctors declared him dead on arrival. His wife, Minakshi, lodged a police complaint, based on which an FIR was registered at Modinagar police station, Verma said. "During the initial investigation, it has also emerged that the suspect had fired at his brother in 2018. We are also trying to trace the past records," deputy commissioner of police Surendra Nath Tiwari said. The DCP said four police teams had been formed to trace and arrest Singh at the earliest and an investigation is underway.

Man shoots woman dead, dies by suicide

NEW DELHI: In a suspected case of murder-suicide, a 26-year-old woman was allegedly shot dead by her partner who then died by suicide in north Delhi's Burari, police said on Thursday. The incident just comes days after a Delhi Police constable killed his wife and later shot himself dead. The woman, a teacher at an MCD school and originally from Uttar Pradesh, lived in a rented accommodation with her younger sister, while the man, in his mid-20s and from Haryana, lived separately. Preliminary probe suggests the two had been in a relationship for around six months, the officer said. "The incident came to light around 4 pm when the woman's sister, 22, found the body lying dead inside a locked room," the officer said.

The woman had called earlier in the day expressed her intention to end her relationship, as he had unemployed for some time. The woman's sister said police posted a message on his WhatsApp group, saying woman's mother was not into their marriage, and are ending their lives. Woman husband dead, husband absconding another incident, a 4 old woman was found in at her residence in Gurgaon near Seelampur on Thursday evening, with police suspecting her husband, the runner, was involved in the case. Police said the woman was discovered by her sister when she returned home on Thursday evening. The woman's husband was not found.
