





Ambedkar University Delhi (Ambedkar University Delhi or AUD) was established by the Government of the National Capital Territory of Delhi through an Act of Legislature in 2007 and was notified in July 2008. Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi has been conceived as a unitary university focusing largely on research and higher learning in areas of knowledge broadly under the domain of social sciences, humanities and the liberal arts.


Mandated to focus on research and teaching and guided by Dr. Ambedkar's vision of bridging equality and social justice with excellence, Dr. B.R. Campuses of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi

Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi is currently operating out of its four campuses at Kashmere Gate, Karampura, Lodhi Road & Qutab Institutional Area. Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi hopes to move into its permanent campuses at Dheerpur and Rohini in the next five years. The programmes offered by the School of Business, Public Policy and Social Entrepreneurship, School of Culture and Creative Expressions, School of Design, School of Development Studies, School of Human Studies, School of Human Ecology, School of Letters, School of Liberal Studies and School of Undergraduate Studies are available at the Kashmere Gate Campus. The programmes offered by the School of Global Affairs, School of Law, Governance and Citizenship and the School of Vocational Studies are available at the Karampura Campus. The programmes offered by the School of Education Studies are available at Lodhi Road Campus. The programmes offered by the School of Heritage Research and Management are available at the Qutab Institutional Area campus of the University.

Schools and Centres of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi

The schools of interdisciplinary studies offer undergraduate, postgraduate and research programmes. The idea is to focus on areas of knowledge and professional specializations which are relevant to our context, and at the same time, not being given enough emphasis by other universities.

The Centres on the other hand have a relatively flexible structure and comprise a group of professionals and scholars put together, more or less in the project mode, to undertake research, documentation, training and some teaching in lesser known or neglected areas of social and academic concerns. The Centres, as conceptualized

at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi, are identified as distinct locations for project-based research, policy advocacy and capacity building and networking with the community. The Centres are visualized to have project staff appointed on part-time and contractual basis from time to time and can also be staffed by faculty from the various schools of study concurrently for a finite time. About Competence Enhancement Scheme

As part of the implementation of the National Education Policy (‘NEP’) 2020 Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi has launched its Competence Enhancement Scheme (CES) from Academic Year 2024-25. The objective of this scheme is to open up existing courses of the University to professionals, practitioners and members of society to enable them to rejoin higher education and revisit or explore their areas of interest. The scheme will provide the candidates an opportunity to learn from unique and well-known courses of the University based on the values of democracy, equity and social justice enshrined in the Constitution of India.

The Schools of the university are offering courses between two to eight credits that are focused on generic skills (such as critical thinking, problem solving, academic writing, research skills, IT software training, and the like) and/or specialized courses in specific knowledge domains of the University. The candidates, on completion of the requirements, would be awarded credit, certificates completion duly verified by the University which may be used by the candidates for credit transfer under the Academic Bank of Credits (‘ABC’) scheme proposed by the NEP 2020.

The university will be the certifying body for all courses completed under the CES. There will be a central policy followed by all schools offering courses under the CES.

Seats, Admission and Prerequisites

All schools of the University who are open to admission under the CES will admit from a range of 2 to 5 students for the listed courses depending upon the nature of the course, and the number of students who are usually admitted in the course.

Registration

A candidate who is already enrolled as a regular student or an employed personnel in any other University/Institution will have to take NOC from the parent University or Institution or his other employer, as the case may be, and submit it at the time of

registration in the University. The registration of candidates for the specific course will be valid for that semester only.

Eligibility Criterion

Any person who fulfils the minimum eligibility criteria and pre-requisites, if any, specified for an existing course, can register for that course, subject to the availability of seats.

Selection Process

Applications will be screened on the basis of past academic record and work experience. The application form will include a Statement of Purpose to assess a candidates' motivation to participate in a re-skilling program. The candidates will be interviewed and a merit list shall be prepared based on the marks obtained in the interview.

Teaching & Evaluation

The teaching or instruction will be provided in the same mode and medium as available to the regular students and the evaluation pattern for these candidates will also be the same as that of the regular students. Students who fail to pass or complete a course will not receive their credit certificate and will have to re-apply, afresh, for the Scheme, if they want to earn credits from such course(s) and obtain the relevant certificate.

Academic credits

Schools offering courses under the CES shall define the criteria for the successful completion of the course. As far as possible all norms applicable to the course in its normal transaction including assessments and/or attendance shall be made applicable to students opting for the course under the CES. This certificate shall also be made available on Digilocker.

All credits earned on the successful completion of a course under the CES shall be transferred to the academic bank of credits of the student.

Fee for 2024-25

Rs. 8,000/- (Rupees eight thousand) per course is the fee payable by the candidates for getting enrolled in a course under CES 2024.

School of Design (SDes)

The School of Design at Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi (AUD) is visualized as both a practice and research-based School for the pursuit of design education from the undergraduate level to the postgraduate and doctoral levels. The first programme, Master of Design (Social Design) commenced in July 2013. The School is unique as it is placed in a university wholly focussed on the humanities and social sciences. The study and practice of design here is thus focussed on bringing together the traditional attributes of design—the emphasis on form, function, aesthetics and experiences—with concerns of equity and ecology to create more accessible, inclusive and sustainable public services and systems through participatory and collaborative design methods.

The areas of focus are public services and systems (such as health, education, and transport, waste, governance interfaces), community networks and livelihoods (pertaining to crafts, informal economies, built and intangible heritage, urban and rural commons), digital technologies (social media, user interfaces and experiences, privacy). Students are also introduced to entrepreneurial competencies and leadership to support them to establish their own enterprises while also providing internship opportunities in established organizations.

These concerns include global warming and environmental change, global health and well-being, urbanization, conflict and security, technological capture, global commodity flows and their regulation, and the new media landscape.

School of Heritage Research and Management (SHRM)

The School of Heritage Research and Management (SHRM) at Dr. B R Ambedkar University, has a curriculum directed towards dissemination of knowledge and practices of maintenance, conservation, preservation and management of the heterogeneity of the heritage products, through stimulating study and research for a multi-segmented higher education stratum.

The School has two post-graduate Programmes under the umbrella discipline of Heritage Management, namely MA in Archaeology and Heritage Management and MA in Conservation Preservation and Heritage Management. Both the Programmes are supported through enhanced exposure to a variety of sites such as the Visit by the students to the Parliament Museum, New Delhi, as an insight into museum curatorial and management practices. The students recently visited the Partition Exhibition at the National Gallery of Modern Art, New Delhi as part of the interpretative processes which guide our history and heritage. The students also undertake internship and training with organizations such as the Department of Archaeology, Delhi Archives and the Rail Museum, New Delhi.

School of Human Ecology (SHE)

Human Ecology is the interdisciplinary study of complex social-ecological issues at multiple spatial scales. Research and teaching at the School of Human Ecology (SHE) brings together ideas, methodologies and toolkits from disciplines in the natural sciences and social sciences to understand interactions between the biophysical environment and human society.

The School's thematic focus areas include environmental change, biodiversity conservation, ecological restoration, rural and urban transformations, environmental and social impact assessment and public health. The School offers a full-time MA programme in Environment and Development (MAED) and a full time PhD programme in Human Ecology. Scholars and Faculty at the School employ quantitative, qualitative and geospatial methodological frameworks to study complexity and causality in the intertwined lives of humans and other species. Teaching and research at SHE deploys careful field-based enquiry to study the 'big questions' of justice, well-being and sustainability in local, empirical contexts. Human and nonhuman agencies are explored in ecological and social transformations in South Asia, in the present as well as in the past.

School of Law, Governance and Citizenship (SLGC)

The School of Law, Governance and Citizenship (SLGC) at Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi offers an interdisciplinary approach to the fertile and complex interaction of law, culture, politics and social structures. Rather than treating the law merely as a domain of legal practice or as a body of knowledge reserved for lawyers and legal scholars, the school understands the law to be a contested terrain of knowledge and practice that is best investigated in a creative and collaborative manner across disciplines.

The study of law has thus far been confined to legal departments or universities and the choice of locating a Masters Program in law within a social science and humanities university is a self-conscious one. The excessive focus on legal formalism has resulted in an emphasis on skill development and an instrumental approach to legal education. While the imparting of legal skill is an essential aspect of legal education, it would be shortsighted to reduce the study of law into a vocational training. We believe a study of law is much richer when it incorporates insights from social sciences, humanities and other disciplines.

The University provides a unique environment to house such a school as the faculty and scholars come from a wide range of disciplines ranging from law to the core disciplines within the Social Sciences and Humanities. The setting up of the school will provide a unique opportunity to reorient the study of law and to create an intellectual home for cutting edge socio-legal research and scholarship.

School of Vocational Studies (SVS)

Delhi's changing demography and the resultant emergence of a large number of first-generation high school graduates who are keen to pursue full-time or part-time tertiary education for getting prepared to participate effectively in the fast-growing economy through acquisition of quality livelihood skills is the broad rationale for establishing the School of Vocational Studies (SVS) at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi.

As part of the university's vision to reach out to the people of Delhi, the School of Vocational Studies (SVS) was launched in 2017. The B.Voc & MVoc programmes offered by the School of Vocational Studies (SVS) are unique because the curriculum for each vocational programme has been designed in consultation with industry experts, industry associations, Sector Skill Councils, various Schools and Centres of the University and National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) as well as professionals and academics.

SVS has explored and developed programmes and courses that provide students with the required skill-set and academic background for meaningful employment. These programmes are envisaged to enable learners to become self-employed, entrepreneurs, creators and generators of job for themselves and for many more educated youths in the society.

All programmes have a mandatory component of internship/on-the-job-training to provide students with hands-on learning on the real job floor. The skill courses are linked to the 'job roles' already identified by the concerned sector skill council and aligned with the National Occupation Standard (NOS) as prescribed under the National Skill Qualifications Framework (NSQF) levels. Each vocational programme has both skills and general education components. The Skill component has both theory and practical components which prepare students for on-job-training and thereby facilitate the acquisition of such skills as required by the industries.
