

Social Progress: As a social sciences and humanities higher education institution, we contribute through our cutting edge research and teaching initiatives towards social progress. **Environmental Sustainability:** We are regularly conducting tree plantation programmes across our different existing and forthcoming university premises. *Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam* has been a flagship programme of the University this year. We have been conducting an undergraduate course on Environment: Issues and Challenges which involves our students to do fieldwork and on matters related to environmental consciousness and climate change.

Good Governance: Multiple initiatives related to good governance is practiced at the University. Recently we have shifted to digital governance through the SAMARTH portal. All our degrees are available through DIGILOCKER. All days of national importance are celebrated with full involvement by all members of the University community. The University acts as knowledge partner with different government institutions like National Minority Development Finance Corporation and Delhi Development Authority. # 33,000 apply for 887 UG seats at AUD, 917 allotments made

New Delhi: Ambedkar University Delhi has received over 33,000 applications for its 887 undergraduate seats for the 2024-25 academic session.

According to a university official, the most popular courses among applicants this year are Bachelor of Business Administration, BA (H) Psychology and Political Science. BA (H) English and Economics have also seen a growing interest. The university offers programmes in Bachelor of Science (B.Sc), Bachelor Degree in Library & Information

Science (BLISc) and Bachelor of Education (B.Ed).

It has acknowledged the possibility of an applicant's name appearing in the provisional admission list of multiple programmes. However, the applicant is required to pay the fee for only one programme within the specified timeframe, indicating their preferred choice of admission.

The first merit list has resulted in 917 allotments, and candidates have until Aug 28 to confirm their admission by paying the necessary fees. The second seat allotment list will be released on Aug 29.

नई दिल्ली। दिल्ली के डॉ. बीआर अंबेडकर विश्वविद्यालय ने पीएचडी में दाखिल के लिए आवेदन प्रक्रिया को शुरू कर दिया है, जबकि अभी डीयू में पीएचडी में दाखिल शुरू होने का इंतजार है। अंबेडकर विवि में 17 प्रोग्राम की 92 सीटों के लिए 26 नवंबर तक ऑनलाइन आवेदन किया सकता है। आवेदक यूनिवर्सिटी के दाखिला पोर्टल पर आवेदन कर सकते हैं।


28 अगस्त तक फीस भरकर सीट पक्की करने का है मौका के लिए स्टूडेंट्स के डॉक्युमेंट्स का वेरिफिकेशन होगा, जिसके बाद वो फीस भरेंगे। फीस का ऑनलाइन लिंक रविवार को खुलेगा।

स्टूडेंट्स 28 अगस्त रात 11 बर्जे तक ऑनलाइन फीस देकर अपना एडमिशन करवा सकते हैं।

सरकार की एयूडी के कर्मपुरा कश्मीरी गेट कैपस में अंडरग्रैजुएट कोर्स पढ़ाए जाते है। एयूडी में 18 यूजी कोर्स चलते है। यूनिवर्सिटी की यूजी सीटों के लिए 30 हजार से ज्यादा ऐप्लिकेशन मिली है। पिछले साल की तरह ही बीबीए, बीए पॉलिटिकल साइंस और बीए साइकोलॉजी के लिए यूनिवर्सिटी को सबसे ज्यादा ऐप्लिकेशन मिले है। दूसरी लिस्ट जारी होने के बाद सीटें खाली रहती है तो युनिवर्सिटी और राउंड भी रखेगा। यूनिवर्सिटी का कहना है कि सीयूईटी रिजल्ट देरी से आया मगर एडिमशन टीम ने पुरी कोशिश की है कि एडिमशन प्रक्रिया जल्द से जल्द शुरू हो और आगे सेशन भी वक्त पर शुरू हो। दिल्ली सरकार की एयूडी में 85% सीटें दिल्ली से 12वीं पास स्टूडेंट्स के लिए आरक्षित हैं। बाकी 15% सीटों पर देशभर के स्टूडेंट्स को एडमिशन मिलेगा।

COUNTING SOARING KITES FROM METRO

#### Introduction

This study involved monitoring black kites (Milvus migrans) from the elevated tracks of the Delhi Metro, focusing on their flying population between selected stations. The aim was to explore population patterns and behavioral tendencies of these birds of prey in an urban setting. Observations were conducted as part of the Black Kite Project, which examines how these raptors adapt to life in a megazity like Delhi.

The black kite, known for its adaptability, is among the most successful and widespread raptors globally. However, urban influences have caused significant population fluctuations in some regions, making their study important for understanding ecological dynamics.

#### Procedure

The project was conducted on the Delhi Metro Blue Line between Rajiv Chowk and Dwarka Sector-21. Two observation sessions took place during the afternoons of November 26, 2024 and November 28, 2024. The methodology was designed to ensure clear and unbiased data collection.

During the observations, I positioned myself near the left-side doors of the metro to ensure an unobstructed view of the sky. This placement was chosen to avoid any visual interference from metro trains traveling on parallel tracks and to maximize visibility of soaring kites. While conducting the counts, there was an exclusive focus on kites in flight. Birds perched on trees, buildings, or towers were deliberately excluded to maintain consistency and avoid inflating the ununbers. This decision allowed for a more accurate assessment of the active population of soaring kites. To document my observations. I used a tablet to record the numbers in real time. #### Report: Behavioral Reactions of a Black Street Dog to Howling and Pain Sounds. Introduction, Kishan Anandam

Understanding natural canine behaviour is aided by street dogs, who are typically untrained and rely on instinct. This article details how a black street dog responds to two auditory stimuli: pain sounds and howling. The goal is to highlight emotional sensitivity and communication patterns by observing how a free-ranging dog reacts to sounds that may be associated with social bonding (howling) and discomfort (pain).

Methodology

Subject: Street Black dog

Location: Govindpuri, Gali no. 8, Kalkaji, Delhi.

Sound Source: Mobile phone.

Sounds Played: Dog crying or pain, and howling.

#### Procedure

The experiment was set up in the Govindpuri Gali no.8 in the front of 925A House at 10pm night.

The sounds were played from a Small Bluetooth Sound box.

When both the howling and pain sounds were played, the dog responded immediately to each stimulus. The pain sound, in particular, appeared to provoke a reaction characterized by anger or agitation.

### DEVELOPING COURSES ON INDIAN KNOWLEDGE SYSTEM





In March 2024, the University instituted a Committee for Deliberation on Courses on Indian Knowledge Systems with well-known external experts from the Ministry of Education (IKS Division), National Council for Promotion of Sindhi Language (NCPSL), University of Delhi, NCERT, and Karnataka Samskrit University. In November, 2024 the second meeting of the IKS committee was held in hybrid mode. With the revision and finalisation of the courses presented before the Committee, in due course, the University will be offering a total of 49 distinct courses in IKS at undergraduate and postgraduate levels. Two diploma programmes on IKS are also on the anvil. Furthermore, IKS has been incorporated into value-added courses across all UG programmes, demonstrating the University's commitment to making IKS accessible to all students.
