अंबेडकर विवि में विरासत सप्ताह की शुरुआत



From the Desk of Vice Chancellor

Professor Anu Singh Lather



It is with immense pleasure that I announce Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi has adopted and announced the implementation of National Education Policy 2020 for its undergraduate programmes, after approval of its new four-year BA course structures to be offered through School of Undergraduate Studies, School of Global Affairs, School of Law, Governance and Citizenship, School of Business, Public Policy and Social Entrepreneurship and School of Vocational Studies. The new four year structure will include courses on Ability Enhancement, Skill Enhancement and Community engagement besides Generic elective and compulsory courses.

It gives me great satisfaction to declare that our university has initiated its *First* Research Awards Ceremony from 2021, organised by its Research and Development Division. The AUD Research Publication Incentive Scheme (AURPIS) was launched for the researchers of the University. A total of 19 awards were distributed in the categories of Commendable and Good researchers. AUD Merit Research Fellowship Scheme (AUDMRFS) for PhD scholars at par with UGC's JRF/SRF has also been initiated. A total of 18 PhD scholars from the 2021 cohort were awarded this Fellowship. Hon'ble LG and Chancellor, Shri V. K. Saxena distributed the awards to faculty and research scholars.

As a commitment towards internationalisation, the University through its International Affairs Division, celebrated for the *first* time, 'International Students Day' in which the First Secretary from Zambia High Commission participated in the event where a roundtable discussion on 'Being an International Student' was organised.

For the *first* time, the University marked the Heritage Week, a seven-day festival, where Secretary, Art Culture and Languages, Government of NCT of Delhi was the Chief Guest at the inauguration. Workshops on paper conservation, stone and metal objects were organised by the School of Heritage Research and Management. The highlight of the festival was a heritage walk, themed **1857 trail with Souls of Martyrs**, beginning from the Mutiny Memorial and finishing at the Flagstaff Tower and covering Hindu Rao hospital, Baoli, Chauburja on the way. The University wishes to include the celebration of Heritage week each year in its calendar of activities.

The NCC and NSS activities have become regular in the University with enthusiastic response from students

across all four campuses. As part of the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav celebrations, there were cycle rallies, *prabhat pheri, tiranga yatra* and theatre performances organised by these divisions. Under the direction of the Hon'ble LG office, students and faculty had exposure visits to border areas for the first time: Longewala Border Post, near Jaisalmer, Rajasthan (commemorating the 1971 War) in Jaisalmer and Wagah-Attari Border near Amritsar. The objective of these exposure visits were to sensitise participants about the exemplary work being done by the Defence Forces and the Central Police Organizations notwithstanding the difficult terrain and weather conditions. In the Amritsar visit, students and faculty also visited the Jallianwala Bagh and the Partition Museum.

The 11th Annual Convocation was conducted by the University with a total of 1069 students receiving their BA, MA, MPhil and PhD degrees from the Hon'ble LG and Chancellor of the University. Dr Rupinder Singh Sodhi, Managing Director AMUL was the Chief guest of the event.

With India holding the Presidency of the G20 from 1 December 2022 – 30 November 2023, the University committed to organise various academic and exposure events related to the themes that G 20 is fostering through the motto *Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam*. The University community would engage with its students and reach out to citizens of Delhi to spread the spirit of G 20.

UNIVERSAL LITERACY IN THE 21ST CENTURY

Learning from historical mass literacy campaigns in Asia, Africa and Latin America

The SDG 4 aims to ensure that all youth and a substantial proportion of adults achieve basic literacy and numeracy by 2030. The talk will attempt to inform this discussion by drawing from comparative research on some 'successful' historical mass literacy movements Asia, Africa, and Latin America. Drawing from case studies in the bo 'Disruptive Literacy: A Roadmap for Urgent Global Action,' the talk will unpack the social, economic and political contests and processes that enabled nations to achieve huge gains in literacy rates in short time periods. We will also discuss how literacy was identified as a critical national development goal and how a variety of state and non-state stakeholders, youth and student volunteers, and worker's associations were mobilised through policy, governance and technology mechanisms. And finally, the talk will raise some questions on what we can learn from these movements when thinking of literacy campaigns and programs that are equitable, contextual and enabling for the marginalized in the context of countries with extreme inequalities like India.

Mashhood Alam Bhat is an educational practitioner and rese interested in advancing equity and quality in school education. He has worked with organizations like Pratham, DEVI Sansthan and NIEPA. Revisiting Hand Washing and Water as Basics during Pandemic and Beyond

The COVID-19 pandemic has transformed the significance of hand washing, not as a choice, but as a rule. India has experienced several outbreaks of diseases throughout history and the severity is amplified among those living in powerty and poor hygiene conditions. In the last few decades, one of the crucial development agendas has been water, sanistrion, and hygiene (WASH). However, we are nowhere close to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) and its commitments to universal, affordable, and sustainable access. The community response has been slow and sizeable sections of children are yet to benefit from interventions.

and the related complexities as the rapid spread of coronavirus in India highlight persisting gaps. This article emphasises on an integrated approach towards hygiene goals as a way forward to ensure long-term impacts that will benefit children. The first section reflects on the gendered aspects of hand washing campaigns and why interventions may fall short of expected behavioural changes by focussing on accessibility and disparity. The second section discusses persisting hygiene and water limitations that add up to vulnerabilities during the pandemic.

Hand hygiene reveals attitudes and beliefs denoting a family and community activity and not only an individual habit. Therefore, in our focus on children, a larger picture cannot be overlooked. Hygiene is important for all children, and we are not attempting to restrict the discussion to a particular age group.

Insights are drawn from observing the national-level reports, research publications, and a few media coverage, mainly from Delhi.

Hand Hygiene First: What to make of it?

Hand hygiene is one of the simplest, effective, and low-cost preventive measures against transmission of infections. It is a significant aspect of children's well-being. A wide range of stakeholders through the public-private partnership are involved in the promotional mission for hand washing with seep and has attempted to integrate it with education. However, the initiatives in the area of hand hygiene will need frequent interventions, driving motivations, and constant persuasion for the expected behavioural

achieve regular hand washing practices amo children will have a more lasting impact when along with the rational aspect of physical cleanliness, the mental make-up is strengthened. The emotional drivers like the desire of being a happy child and the desire to avoid contamination can trigger hand washing habits. Community health studies have stated that improving hand washing practices among mothers and caregivers can significantly impact children's health under 5 years. While critically analysing the promotion of hand hygiene, a few important observations cannot be missed. Who are projected as the agents of change and their preparedness? Whether there is the availability of non-

This special issue contributes insights into ongoing debates on the politics and ethics of knowledge production in "global" childhood studies by decentering dominant, northern-centric models of childhood and using southern epistemologies. We contest the ways in which most of the world's children have their experiences and contexts interpreted through the theoretical canons, vernaculars and institutions of northern academia. Drawing on studies that deploy indigenous, decolonial and postcolonial perspectives on the study of childhood and children in different temporal moments and spatial contexts of Africa, Latin America and South Asia, authors of papers aim to push the boundaries for ways of knowing children and doing childhood studies through cross-disciplinary, generative southnorth and south-south encounters. The special issue critically engages with questions of epistemic plurality and bottom-up theorization of research with globally southern children, to both rectify the onto-epistemological imbalance in childhood studies and reinscribe indigenous knowledge systems that have received limited attention in this field thus far.

66 Menstrual Hygiene Management: A study of Sociocultural practices and Implications of the Intervention programme in Kerala, India

Menstruation is an important life event for every female member of society. The major population overlooks its significance for reproductive health. Simultaneously, there is a wide variation in the knowledge, awareness and practice signalling various social factors responsible for it. Many studies addressed the question of hygiene management in the light of cultural understanding, scientific knowledge and environmental factors. This paper is an attempt to investigate the knowledge, awareness and practices of menstrual cups as part of the hygiene management. Methodologically, it deals with an ethnographic approach using face-to-face interviews, questionnaire surveys, and telephonic interviews. There are two phases of data collection. The sample population for the first phase was drawn using a snowballing method of age groups ranging from 11-15 years among the school going girls, and 2nd phase study population was selected using convenient sampling for questionnaire survey-I and voluntary participation for Questionnaire survey-II. The areas of study chosen for the first phase were Meppadi village in Wayanad. For the second phase, different districts of Kerala and medical colleges and health care centres were selected. The study shows a significant amount of menstrual hygiene management in using the absorbents, disposal of sanitary pads and cleaning practices. The awareness level is still yet to be improved through education at school and at home. The socio-cultural practices are still respectfully observed by them. The study also shows successful implementation of awareness campaigns and workshops towards the use of menstrual cups inspiring people to adopt the new methods of menstrual hygiene management. The intervention process of the government initiatives in Kerala is appreciated and responsible for the quick change in the use of menstrual cups. This study concludes that the use of menstrual cups with proper education about the usage of it will help in resolving the hygiene-related issues from the use of sanit





Disgust for the sexual: the emotional side of obscenity law in India

ABSTRACT

This article traces the judicial discourse in obscenity cases in (colonial and postcolonial) India (1860–2015). I demonstrate that law emerges as an affective site that mobilises the emotions of disgust (towards sex) and fear (of transgressive sexualities) to strengthen the dominant (hetero)normative sexual order. In this landscape of emotional adjudication, the 'sexual' invariably comes under erasure unless it meets the 'community standard' of honourable love.



With the admission that the law is being glaringly misused, the Supreme Court has suspended the use of Section 124A of the Indian Penal Code until the law is re-examined. The order is significant as it addresses the gap between the design of a law and its working by factoring in the instances of misuse as a ground for constitutional review. This article argues that sedition has been designed to serve as the "law of the executive" on two accounts. First, the choice of invoking the law is allowed to be governed by political considerations in cases dissociated with the legal understanding of the offence. Second, the possibility of a judicial trial is made contingent upon the will of the executive by instituting the requirement of sunction for prosecution.



Abstract
This article discusses the shifting links between the articulation of caste, class and representation claims on one side and development experiences in modern and contemporary India on the other. Going beyond the questions of exclusion, humiliation, protest and case reforms, it extends the engagement with this subject to India's path of development, experiences of capitalist modernisation, the functioning of colonial institutions and parliamentary demonracy, labour-relations and the sexual economy. The works under review suggest that caste and merit became proximate instead of antithetical from the nineteenth century. In contemporary India, the discourse of mentirocracy has responded to subaltered assertions of their rights against inherized injustice. As a determinant of life chances and axis of inequality, class has largely superseded caste among contemporary Indians. However, the varied engiopment relations operate in the organised and unorganised sectors. And, they have been wedded to the structuration of class among the better-earning librour elists in the organised sectors, and the interfaced existence of caste and class among the bloouring poor in the unorganised sector. This article suggests implications for action and research.

EXPERIMENTING WITH PEDAGOGY

Testimonial by an BBA student on Field Visit: First they test the sample composition of the raw material including milk powder and sugar when sample is selected, its processed under two parts first in seed room where milk powder converted to thick milk and then LcS (Lactobacillus casei shirota) is added into that and left for 4-5 days under favourable condition and then after testing of the ready mixture, chilled RO water is added in the mixture to prepare the drink after that it is kept for observation for atleast 10 days and at the end it is packed and even the bottle of Yakult is prepared by the company itself with food grade plastic."




An MBA student said: we went for the plant visit where we observed the manufacturing process quite closely. As a management student this was a very enriching experience for us. Dr. Minoru Shirota, the founder of Yakult successfully cultivated the Lactobacillus case i strain, which resulted in a fermented milk drink under the brand name YAKULT. Yakult being a Japanese company which in India is in partnership with Danone a French company and a competitor in the international market. It is possible for two firms to come together for a new venture. Yakult believes in the philosophy of Shirota-ism (preventive medicine, long life and affordability). The primary consumer target of Yakult is the housewives and collar workers. Also, we were impressed to see how cleanliness being a core virtue of Japanese culture is also imbibed at the manufacturing plant. We also learnt about the corporate social responsibilities and recycling process plant, in situ




The students of Master of Public Health, School of Global Affairs, went for a field visit to a JJ colony near Shahbad diary on 27 th August 2022, as part of their Field Practice -I course in the 2nd semester. This was a colony of waste pickers and manual segregators.
