





Message from the Honorable Vice Chancellor




Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi has created a research ecosystem in line with the national agenda in alignment with the National Education Policy 2020.

Research and Consultancy Division

The Board of Management in its 25th meeting held on 26.12.2018 approved the proposal for the creation of the office of Research and Consultancy (R&C). The division was notified on 13 February 2019 and took over the responsibility for overseeing research projects from the Academic Committee for Research Projects Management (ACRPM).

The Research and Consultancy Division looks after research and consultancy related matters in the University. It provides strategic planning and guidance across academic and research programmes. The Division oversees the research and consultancy projects done by faculty either individually or in collaboration with external agencies or institutions. This involves ensuring that research and consultancy carried out by faculty members complies with the appropriate regulatory, legal, professional, and ethical standards. The Division is mandated to create frameworks and most importantly to create an enabling environment for research and consultancy projects to take place within the University and in collaboration with outside members or institutions.

Another aspect that the Research and Consultancy Division looks after is capacity building in research by helping develop skills and methodological insights in research among the University community.

The Division is responsible for organising Shodhotsav: Annual Research Festival of the University.


