The minutes of the meeting are as follows:

Opening remarks by the Vice Chancellor

At the outset, the Vice Chancellor extended warm welcome to all the members of the Board to its 43rd meeting. The Vice Chancellor further informed the members Nitro Jacob

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about the following initiatives that have been taken since the last meeting of the Board of Management held on 23 December, 2022.

- University successfully organized its 11th Annual Convocation on 28.12.2022. Shri Vinai Kumar Saxena, Hon'ble Lt. Governer of Delhi and Chancellor of the University presided over the Convocation Ceremony. Dr. R. S. Sodhi, Managing Director of Gujrat Cooperative Milk Marketing Federation Ltd. (AMUL) was chief guest and delivered the Convocation Address.
- During the Convocation, 1073 students were awarded Degrees in various programmes. There were total 659 female students out of 1073 graduating students which amount to more than 60%.
- 40 students of University completed the visit to Laungewala War Memorial, Border Post 609 and Jaisalmer for the Exposure Visit to Border Areas as part of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav from 20-24 December 2022. They were also accompanied by some of the faculty members of University.
- School of Business, Public Policy and Social Entrepreneurship (SBPPSE) in collaboration with the School of Liberal Studies (SLS) organised a Special Talk by Venerable "Bhikkhu Sanghasena" on "Compassion and Education", on 30th December 2022 (Friday).
- A Memorandum of Understanding between Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi and Mahabodhi International Meditation Centre, Leh, Ladakh was signed on the 30th of December 2022.
- · The two institutions will collaborate in a number of activities including
 - Buddhist studies with special focus on Engaged/applied Buddhism;
 - Non-violence and Vishwa Shanti- World Peace Studies (with the special focus on Central Asia) Compassion in action;
 - Yoga and health;
 - > Meditation/ Mindfulness for mental health and peace,
 - Capacity Building Workshops for Faculty and Students, Seminars, Exchange programmes etc.

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- Under the ambit of MoU with Ladakh University a Student Exchange Programme with University of Ladakh was inaugurated on 16 January 2023.
 - ➤ Under this, a programme on "Entrepreneurship Development in Tourism and Hospitality" is being conducted from 16th – 22nd January 2023.
 - > 9 Students and 2 faculty members from University of Ladakh and 10 students from AUD are attending the said programme.
 - One Research Proposal on studying the career aspirations of youth in Ladakh region is being submitted as a joint collaboration project to the Government of Union Territory Ladakh for funding.
 - > The valedictory session will be held on 20.12.2022.
- A delegation of the University of Ladakh comprising of Prof S K Mehta, Vice Chancellor of University of Ladakh and Prof V K Jain, Advisor visited Dr. BR Ambedkar University on 18 January 2023. Mutual areas of cooperation were deliberated upon and a calendar of joint activities has been prepared.
- AIC AUDF celebrated National Startup Day on 16th January, 2023 as a part of Start-up India Innovation Week by organizing a Startup exhibition and mentoring session.
- 06 DANICS Probationers (58th batch) were attached with the University on 11th January 2023. The officers were briefed about the administration of education institution, various programmes offered by the university, vision and mission of the university and implementation of NEP 2020.
- School of Undergraduate Studies of the University organized a Special Lecture on "Forgotten Roots: Towards the Pathway to Nation Re-Building" on 12/1/2023, the eve of National Youth Day by SUS Division of University.
- As an outreach programme, University distributed winter clothes among children and elderly of the JJ cluster of Vasant Kunj on 20.12.2023
- University has planned various activities and events to organize during 2023 to commemorate the presidency of G-20 by India.
 - These events will be open not only for University faculty, students but also to general public.
 - Different social and cultural activities which include food festival (with cuisines of G-20 countries), sports events, conferences/seminars, literary festivals, book exhibitions special lectures etc.

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- > Among these, University has planned to organize "दिल्ली की ऐतिहासिक परिक्रमा "along with other state universities of Delhi.
- University is also planning to celebrate the national days of G-20 member countries with special events.

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the UGC Regulations 2018 on Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and Other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Ecucation 2018(Appendix-2), vide Clause 7 laid down the following provisions:-

Clause 7.1	The Pro-Vice Chancellor shall be appointed by the Executive Council on the recommendations of the Vice Chancellor.
Clause 7.2	It shall be the prerogative of the Vice-Chancellor to recommend a person to be the Pro Vice Chancellor to the Executive Council The Pro Vice Chancellor shall hold office for a period which is coterminus with that of the Vice Chancellor

It was submitted to the Board of Management that Section 13 of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi Act, 2007 pertains to the Pro Vice Chancellor which states as under:-

"Every Pro Vice Chancellor shall be appointed for a period of five years in such manner, on such emolument and other conditions of service, and shall exercise such powers and perform such functions as may be prescribed. No person shall be appointed for more than two terms as Pro Vice Chancellor."

It was submitted to the Board of Management that Clause 6 of University Statutes provides for the service conditions, selection process, salary and other terms and conditions of Pro Vice Chancellors.

In view of the above, the proposal regarding the following amendments in Section 13 of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi Act, 2007 and Clause 6 of the Statutes of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi Act, 2007, in light of the UGC Regulations 2018 on Minimum qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education 2018 was placed before the Board of Management for deliberation and consideration:

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Department of Training and Technical Education (DTTE), Govt. of NCT of Delhi vide letter B.No.F.75(Misc)/2019-2019-20/Plg./DTTE/Pt.File-1/775 dated 02.12.2022 (Appendix-4) and UGC vide its letter No.D.O.F.No.9-1/2010(PS/Misc)PT-I dated 30.09.2022 has issued guidelines for engaging Professor of Practice in Universities and Colleges.

The guidelines issued by the Department of Training and Technical Education (DTTE), Govt. of NCT of Delhi vide letter B.No.F.75(Misc)/2019-2019-20/Plg./DTTE/Pt.File-1/775 dated 02.12.2022 and UGC vide its letter No.D.O.F.No.9-1/2010(PS/Misc) PT-I dated 30.09.2022 for engaging

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Professor of Practice in Universities and Colleges were placed before the Board of Management for consideration.

Decision: The Board of Management resolved to consider and adopt the guidelines for engaging Professor of Practice in Universities and Colleges as issued by the Department of Training and Technical Education (DTTE), Govt. of NCT of Delhi vide letter B.No.F.75(Misc)/2019-2019-20/Plg./DTTE/Pt.File-1/775 dated 02.12.2022 and UGC vide its letter No.D.O.F.No.9-1/2010(PS/Misc)PT-I dated 30.09.2022.

Agenda 43.5: To consider the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for the Award of PhD) Regulations, 2022 issued by the University Grants Commission vide letter No.D.O.No.1-3/2021 (QIP/PhD Regulations/part file) dated 17.11.2022 as forwarded by the Directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of NCT of Delhi vide letter No. DHE.23(33)/NEP/2020/Volume-I/6505-09 dated 16.12.2022 and email communication dated 22.11.2022

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of NCT of Delhi vide letter No.DHE.23(33)/NEP/2020/Volume-I/6505-09 dated 16.12.2022(Appendix-5) and email communication dated 22.11.2022 has endorsed and forwarded the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for the Award of PhD) Regulations, 2022 issued by the UGC vide letter No.D.O.No.1-3/2021 (QIP/PhD Regulations/part file) dated 17.11.2022. The same were placed before the Board of Management for consideration.

Decision: The Board of Management resolved to consider and adopt the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for the Award of PhD) Regulations, 2022 issued by the University Grants Commission vide letter No.D.O.No.1-3/2021 (QIP/PhD Regulations/part file) dated 17.11.2022 and as forwarded by the Directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of NCT of Delhi vide letter No. DHE23(33)/NEP/2020/Volume-I/6505-09 dated 16.12.2022 and email communication dated 22.11.2022.

Agenda 43.6 : To consider the initiation of Disciplinary Enquiry against Prof. M.S. Farooqi, School of Business, Public Policy and Social Entrepreneurship (SBPPSE), for violation of the Rule 3 (1) (i), (ii), (iii) and (xxi) of the CCS (Conduct) Rules, as per Rule 14 of CCS (CCA) Rules 1965 for long period of unauthorized absence

It was submitted to the Board of Management that Professor M.S. Farooqi was appointed as Professor in the School of Business, Public

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Policy and Social Entrepreneurship (SBPPSE) on 31-10-2017.It was submitted that Professor M.S. Farooqi has not attended the University since 25.05.2021 and been absenting himself without any prior permission, sanction of leave and approval of the Competent Authority. The following brief facts of the case were placed before the Board of Management:-

- 1. The initial leave period commenced from 25-05-2021 to 05-01-2022 was prima facie assumed to be on leave on the basis of medical ground as per communication received from Prof. Farooqi from time to time. That, in the light of long absence of Prof. Farooqi, a letter was issued to Prof. Farooqi bearing No. AUD/3-3 (157)/2017/Acad/571 dated 22.10.2021 (Appendix-6) with the request to provide the medical certificate and also detailing the leave in his credit in the light of email dated 11-10-2021 received from Prof. Farooqi (Appendix-7).
- 2. In response to the same, Prof. Farooqi requested for consideration of absence period in EL and HPL vide email dated 08.11.2021 (**Appendix-8**) as no proper medical certificates were adduced. The competent authority considered request of Prof. Farooqi and regularized the absence period from 25.05.2021 to 05.01.2022 (227 days) by grant of 98 days Earned leave and 129 days HPL (**Appendix-9**).
- 3. As per facts mentioned in Para 2 above, Prof. Farooqi was required to join his duty w.e.f. 06.01.2022 (**Appendix-10**). However, after the lapse of said period, Professor Farooqi neither joined the duty nor informed the University within the stipulated period, that over such absence period beyond 06.01.2022, Academic Service Division sent an email dated 12-01-2022 for intimating his non-joining of the duties (**Appendix-11**).
- 4. In response to the said communication referred to in Para 3 above, Prof. Farooqi intimated about further extension of leave for three months vide email dated 17.01.2022. After due examination the absence period, it was noticed that the act of Professor Farooqi has been repetitive in nature and even without any substance, in the absence of any concrete Medical grounds. Even it was noticed that no sincere efforts were being made by Professor Farooqi for joining his duties and no timely and accurate information has been given to the University.
- 5. Over such misconduct which was repetitive in nature, Professor M. S. Farooqi was issued a Show Cause Notice bearing No. AUD/3-3(157)/2014/Acad/531 dated 9th June 2022 (**Appendix-12**) to report for the duty immediately within 07 days from the date of issuance of ibid show cause notice alongwith a written explanation mentioning why disciplinary action should not be initiated against him. Professor Farooqi failed to join his duty within the stipulated period. He has submitted his explanation dated 15.06.2022 (**Appendix-13**). The Chairperson, Board of Management on the

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behalf of Board of Management considered his reply but found the reply unsatisfactory/ devoid of any substance.

It was further submitted that Professor Farooqi has thus, wilfully failed to maintain devotion to duty and is not amenable to discipline. He has, thus, acted in a manner unbecoming of an employee of the University and has thereby contravened Rule 3 (1) (i), (ii), (iii) and (xxi) of the CCS (Conduct) Rules, 1964 read with the Statute 22 framed in exercise of the provisions of Dr.B.R.Ambedkar University Delhi Act 2007.

It was submitted to the Board that a draft charge sheet has been framed under Rule 14 of the Central Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rule 1965 is placed at (Appendix-14).

The matter was submitted before the Board of Management for consideration and deliberations.

Decision: As also informed to the Board of Management that the salary of Prof. M.S.Farooqi has also been stopped for the period of his absence, the Board took note of the same.

After detailed deliberations, the Board of Management resolved to constitute a Medical Board for examining the medical condition of Prof. M.S. Farooqi. The Medical Board will submit its report to the Vice Chancellor. On the basis of the report of the Medical Board, the matter would be processed further. The Board further authorized the Vice Chancellor to constitute the Medical Board and also take further necessary action in the matter, as per rules.

Decision: The Board resolved to consider and approve the engagement of Shri. Umesh Chandra Mishra, Shri.Gaurav Saxena and Shri. Mohammed Haseen against vacant posts for a period of six months.

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Reporting Items

- To handle all work relating to equivalence committee, grant of recognition of (i) courses and programmes, vocational courses under UGC scheme.
- Printing and maintenance of record of scheme of examination and syllabus (j) of various programmes running in the University School of Study and various affiliated institutions.
- Chairman, Sub-Committee of Academic Council for consideration of revision (k) or any other related matter for further approval of Academic Council of the University for its Implementation.
- To coordinate with the University School of Study for implementation of (1) guidelines of Statutory Bodies related to academics.
- To address academic related query of different University Schools/ Centres. (m)
- Any other duties as assigned by the Competent Authority from time to time. (n) The term of Dean, Academic Affairs will be for a period of three years.

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Agenda 43.21: To consider the proposal for amendment in Dr.B.R.

Ambedkar University Act 2007 for the purpose of Academic expansion of the University.

It was submitted to the Board of Management that Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi has implemented the guidelines envisaged in the National Education Policy-2020 in its various Undergraduate and Postgraduate Courses.

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the University, in view of the implementation of NEP 2020, desires to open new multi-disciplinary school specializing in areas other than social sciences, liberal arts, humanities and also professional and other courses in higher education.

It was submitted to the Board that, in order to include provisions for other professional courses, the proposed amendments may be carried out in the Preamble of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi Act, 2007 and Section 3(3) and 5(a) of Dr.B.R.Ambedkar University Delhi Act, 2007.

The Preamble of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi states as under:-

"An Act to establish and incorporate, a teaching University at Delhi to facilitate and promote studies, research and extension work in higher education with focus on liberal arts, humanities and social sciences and also to achieve excellence in higher education and other matters connected therewith or incidental thereto"

Section 3 (3) relates to Incorporation of the University which states as under:

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3(3) The University shall be engaged in teaching and research in emerging areas of higher education with focus on liberal arts, humanities and social sciences, for example, Arts, Commerce, Humanities, etc. and also to achieve excellence in these and connected fields.

Section 5 (a) relates to the Objects of the University which states as under:

5(a) To evolve and impart comprehensive higher education with focus on liberal arts, humanities and social sciences including distant and continuing education at all levels to achieve excellence:

It was submitted to the Board of Management that considering the above provisions of the Act and in view of the implementation of guidelines envisaged in the National Education Policy-2020 in its various UG & PG courses, the University had also obtained a legal opinion from the University Counsel, as to whether an amendment in Dr.B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi Act is required to carry out for the academic expansion exercise or the same can be carried out well within the existing provisions of the University Act.

In view of the above facts and in light of the implementation of NEP 2020 and the advice of the University Legal Counsel(Appendix-19) the proposal regarding following amendments in the Preamble, Section 3(3) and Section 5(a) and other related provisions/phrases of Dr.B.R.Ambedkar University Delhi Act, 2007 was placed before the Board of Management for deliberations and considerations.

UGC REGULATIONS ON MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT OF TEACHERS AND OTHER ACADEMIC STAFF IN UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES AND MEASURES FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF STANDARDS IN HIGHER EDUCATION, 2018

No. F.1-2/2017(EC/PS).—In exercise of the powers conferred under clause (e) and (g) of sub-section(I) of Section 26 read with Section 14 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956), and in supersession of the "UGC Regulations on Minimum qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education 2010" (Regulation No.F.3-1/2009 dated 30th June, 2010) together with all amendments made therein from time to time, the University Grants Commission, hereby, frames the following Regulations, namely:-

1. Short title, application and commencement:

- 1.1 These Regulations may be called the University Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and other Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) Regulations, 2018.
- 1.2 These shall apply to every University established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, Provincial Act or a State Act, every Institution including a Constituent or an affiliated College recognized by the Commission, in consultation with the University concerned under Clause (i) of Section 2 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 and every Institution deemed to be a University under Section 3 of the said Act.
- 1.3 These shall come into force from the date of notification.
- 2. The Minimum Qualifications for appointment and other service conditions of University and College teachers, Librarians, and Directors of Physical Education and Sports as a measure for the maintenance of standards in higher education, shall be as provided in the Annexure to these Regulations.
- 3. If any University contravenes the provisions of these Regulations, the Commission after taking into consideration the cause, if any, shown by the University for such failure or contravention, may withhold from the University, the grants proposed to be made out of the Fund of the Commission.

UGC REGULATIONS ON MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT OF TEACHERS AND OTHER ACADEMIC STAFF IN UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES AND OTHER MEASURES FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF STANDARDS IN HIGHER EDUCATION, 2018

Minimum qualifications for the posts of Senior Professor, Professors and Teachers, and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and revision of pay scales and other Service Conditions pertaining to such posts.

1.0 Coverage

These Regulations are issued for minimum qualifications for appointment and other service conditions of University and College teachers and cadres of Librarians, Directors of Physical Education and Sports for maintenance of standards in higher education and revision of pay-scales.

- 1.1 For the purposes of direct recruitment to teaching posts in disciplines relating to university and collegiate education, interalia in the fields of health, medicine, special education, agriculture, veterinary and allied fields, technical education, teacher education, norms or standards laid down by authorities established by the relevant Act of Parliament under article 246 of the Constitution for the purpose of co-ordination and determination of standards in institutions for higher education or research and scientific and technical institutions, shall prevail
 - Provided that where no such norms and standards have been laid down by any regulatory authority, UGC Regulations herein shall be applicable till such time as any norms or standards are prescribed by the appropriate regulatory authority.
 - ii. Provided further that for appointment to the post of Assistant Professor and equivalent positions pertaining to disciplines in which the National Eligibility Test (NET), conducted by the University Grants Commission or Council of Scientific and Industrial Research as the case may be, or State level

- IV. The criteria for CAS Promotions from University Deputy Director Physical Education and Sports/College Director Physical Education and Sports (Academic Level 13A) to University Deputy Director Physical Education and Sports/College Director Physical Education and Sports (Academic Level 14) shall be the following:
 - 1) He/she has completed three years of service.
 - 2) He/she has done any one of the following during last three years: (i)Completed one course / programme from among the categories of Refresher Courses, Research Methodology Workshop, (ii)Teaching-Learning-Evaluation Technology Programmes / Faculty Development Programmes of at least two weeks (ten days) duration (or completed two courses of at least one week (five days) duration in lieu of every single course/programme of at least two weeks (ten days) duration), (iii) Taken / developed one MOOCs course in relevant subject (with e-certification).
 - 3) Evidence of organising competitions and coaching camps of at least two weeks' duration.
 - 4) Evidence of having produced good performance of teams/athletes for competitions like state/national/inter-university/combined university, etc.
 - 5) A Ph.D. in Physical Education or Physical Education and Sports or Sports Science.

CAS Promotion Criteria:

An individual may be promoted if;

- i) He/she gets a 'satisfactory' or 'good' grade performance assessment reports of at least two out of the last three years of the assessment period as specified in Appendix II, Table 5, and;
- ii) The promotion is recommended by a selection committee constituted as per these Regulations on the basis of the interview performance.
- 6.5. Discretionary award of advance increments for those who enter the profession as Associate Professor or Professor with higher merit, high number of research publications of high quality and experience at the appropriate level, shall be within the competence of the appropriate authority of the University concerned or recruiting institution based on the recommendations of a selection committee while considering the case of individual candidates in the context of the merits of each case, taking into account the pay structure of other teachers in the faculty and other merit-specific factors. Discretionary award of advance increments is not applicable to those entering the profession as Assistant Professor/Assistant Librarian/Assistant Director of Physical Education and Sports and to those who are entitled for grant of advance increments for having acquired a Ph. D., M. Phil. or M.Tech. and LLM degree. However, those entering the service as Assistant Professor/Assistant Librarian/Assistant Director of Physical Education and Sports, having a post-doctoral teaching/research experience, after obtaining a Ph.D. degree and proven credentials, may be eligible for discretionary award of advanced increments to be given to the person, as decided and recorded by the Selection Committee in the minutes of its meeting.

7.0 SELECTION OF PRO-VICE CHANCELLOR / VICE - CHANCELLOR OF UNIVERSITIES:

7.1 PRO-VICE-CHANCELLOR:

The Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall be appointed by the Executive Council on the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor.

7.2 It shall be the prerogative of the Vice-Chancellor to recommend a person to be the Pro-Vice-Chancellor to the Executive Council. The Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall hold office for a period, which is co-terminus with that of the Vice-Chancellor.

7.3. VICE CHANCELLOR:

- i. A person possessing the highest level of competence, integrity, morals and institutional commitment is to be appointed as Vice-Chancellor. The person to be appointed as a Vice-Chancellor should be a distinguished academician, with a minimum of ten years' of experience as Professor in a University or ten years' of experience in a reputed research and / or academic administrative organisation with proof of having demonstrated academic leadership.
- ii. The selection for the post of Vice-Chancellor should be through proper identification by a Panel of 3-5 persons by a Search-cum-Selection-Committee, through a public notification or nomination or a talent search process or a combination thereof. The members of such Search-cum-Selection Committee shall be

Subject:- Scheme of revision of pay of teachers and equivalent cadres in universities and colleges following the revision of pay scales of Central Government employees on the recommendations of the 7th Central Pay Commission (CPC).

Sir,

I am directed to say that the Government of India have decided, after taking into consideration the recommendations made by the Pay Review Committee (PRC), constituted by the University Grants Commission (UGC), and decision of the UGC taken at the meeting of the Commission held on 22nd February, 2017, to revise the pay scales of teachers in the Higher Educational Institutions under the purview of the UGC. The revision of pay scales of teachers and equivalent academic staff shall be subject to various provisions of the Scheme of revision of pay scales as contained in this letter and Regulations issued by UGC and amendments thereof from time to time in this behalf. The revised pay scales and other provisions of the Scheme are as under:-

1. Designation

There shall be only three designations in respect of teachers in universities and colleges, namely, Assistant Professors, Associate Professors and Professors. Also, there shall be no change in the present designations in respect of Library and Physical Education Personnel at various levels.

2. Revised Pay for teachers and equivalent positions:

(i) Pay Fixation method

The revised pay structure for different categories of teachers and equivalent positions is based on the following:

- a) The formula followed by the 7th CPC is followed in the academic pay structure, moving from the concept of Pay Band and Academic Grade Pay to that of Academic Levels and Cells.
- b) The first academic level (corresponding to AGP of Rs.6000) is numbered as academic level 10. Similarly, the other academic levels are 11, 12, 13A, 14 and 15.
- Each cell in an academic level is at 3% higher than the previous cell in that level.
- d) The Index of Rationalisation (IOR) is 2.67 for present AGP less than Rs.10,000 and 2.72 for the AGP of Rs.10,000 and above.

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e) The entry pay for each level is as follows:

- f) The Pay Matrix based on the above propositions on Academic Levels, Cells and Entry Pay is at **Annexure-I**.
- g) For fixation of pay of an employee in the Pay Matrix as on 1st January, 2016, the existing pay (Pay in Pay Band plus Academic Grade Pay) in the prerevised structure as on 31st December, 2015 shall be multiplied by a factor of 2.57. The figure so arrived at is to be located in the Academic Level corresponding to employee's Pay Band and Academic Grade Pay in the new Pay Matrix. If a Cell identical with the figure so arrived at is available in the appropriate Academic Level, that Cell shall be the revised pay; otherwise the next higher cell in that Academic Level shall be the revised pay of the employee. If the figure arrived at in this manner is less than the first cell in that Academic Level, then the pay shall be fixed at the first cell of that Academic Level.

If a situation arises whenever more than two stages are bunched together, one additional increment equal to 3 percent may be given for every two stages bunched, and pay fixed in the subsequent cell in the pay matrix.

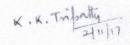

3. Revised pay of Pro-Vice Chancellor and Vice Chancellor of Universities

- (i) Pro-Vice Chancellor: The pay of the Pro Vice Chancellor of a University, presently at existing AGP of Rs.10,000 in PB Rs.37,400-67,000/ HAG scale, shall be fixed at Academic Level 14/ Academic Level 15, as the case may be, with the existing special allowance of Rs.4000/- per month.
- (ii) Vice Chancellor: The pay of the Vice Chancellor shall be fixed at Rs.2,10,000/- (fixed) (Figures obtained by using the IOR of 2.81 on 75,000/- and rounding off the figures to nearest five thousand), with the existing special allowance of Rs.5000/- per month.

4. Revised pay of Principals in Colleges

The pay of Principals in Under Graduate and Post Graduate Colleges shall be:

- (i) Under Graduate Colleges: The pay of Principals shall be equivalent to the pay of Associate Professor i.e. Academic Level 13A with rationalized entry pay of Rs.1,31,400/-, with the existing special allowance of Rs.2000/- per month.
- (ii) Post Graduate Colleges: The pay of Principals shall be equivalent to the pay of Professor i.e. at level Academic Level 14 with rationalized entry pay of Rs.1,44,200/-, with the existing special allowance of Rs.3000/- per month.

Note:

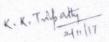
- (i) The existing pay scale of person appointed as Principal shall be protected.
- (ii) Principals would continue to have lien in their main academic post where they would continue to get notional promotions while they are functioning as principals. After completion of their tenure as principals, they would go back to their academic post and draw salary due in such respective academic posts, and would not continue to have the Principals' pay.

7. Date of Implementation

The date of implementation of the above revised pay shall be 1st January, 2016.

8. Incentive increment for higher qualification

The incentive structure is built-in in the pay structure itself wherein those having M.Phil or Ph.D. degree will progress faster under CAS. Therefore, there shall be no incentives in form of advance increments for obtaining the degrees of M.Phil or Ph.D.



9. Increment

- (i) The annual increment is given in the Pay Matrix at 3%, with each cell being higher by 3% over the previous cell in the same level, rounded off to nearest 100. The annual increments to each employee would move up in the same academic level, with an employee moving from the existing cell in the academic level to the immediate next cell in the same academic level.
- (ii) There shall be two dates for grant of increment namely, 1st January and 1st July of every year, instead of existing date of 1st July, provided that an employee shall be entitled to only one annual increment on either one of these two dates depending on the date of appointment, promotion or grant of financial up-gradation.

10. Promotion

When an individual gets a promotion, his new pay on promotion would be fixed in the Pay Matrix as follows:

On promotion, he would be given a notional increment in his existing Academic Level of Pay, by moving him to the next higher cell at that level. The pay shown in this cell would now be located in the new Academic level corresponding to the post to which he has been promoted. If a cell identical with that pay is available in the new level, that cell shall be the new pay; otherwise the next higher cell in that level shall be the new pay of the employee. If the pay arrived at in this manner is less than the first cell in the new level, then the pay shall be fixed at the first cell of that level.

11. Allowances

The decision on allowances of teachers and other equivalent academic staff of Universities and Colleges will be taken after consultation with the Ministry of Finance. Till a final decision on Allowances is taken after consultation with the Ministry of Finance based on the decision of the Government of India for Central Government employees, all allowances will continue to be paid at existing pay structure, as if the pay had not been revised with effect from 01.01.2016.

12. Superannuation and Reemployment

The existing provisions on superannuation and reemployment of teachers shall continue.

13. Consultancy Assignments:

University Grants Commission shall study the consultancy guidelines prevalent in educational institutions like IITs & IIMs, CSIR and other such institutions, and formulate detailed guidelines for consultancies including revenue sharing mechanism between the institution and the individual(s).

14. Anomalies of the last PRC:

The final decision on anomalies, due to implementation of recommendations of the last Pay Review Committee, will be taken after consultation with the Ministry of Finance.

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15. Other recommendations of Pay Review Committee and UGC

The Pay Review Committee (PRC) has recommended certain other measures on methods of recruitment, promotion, New Performance Assessment System, attracting & retaining talent, use of ICT in teaching, etc. These recommendations of PRC shall be considered appropriately by the University Grants Commission and necessary regulations will be issued by the University Grants Commission with the approval of the Central Government within a period of 3 months from the date of the approval/ decision of the Cabinet.

16. Applicability of the Scheme:

- (i) This Scheme shall be applicable to teachers and other equivalent academic staff in all the Central Universities and Colleges there-under and the Institutions Deemed to be Universities whose maintenance expenditure is met by the UGC. The implementation of the revised scales shall be subject to the acceptance of all the conditions mentioned in this letter as well as Regulations to be framed by UGC and amendments thereof in this behalf. Universities implementing this Scheme shall be advised by UGC to amend their relevant statutes and ordinances in line with the UGC Regulations within three months from the date of issue of this letter.
- (ii) This Scheme does not extend to the cadres of Registrar, Finance Officer and Controller of Examinations for which a separate Scheme is being issued separately.
- (iii) This Scheme does not extend to the Accompanists, Coaches, Tutors and Demonstrators. Pay of the said categories of employees shall be fixed in the appropriate relative Level to their existing Pay in each university/ institution corresponding to such fixation in respect of Central Government employees as approved by the Central Government on the basis of the recommendations of 7th Central Pay Commission.
- (iv) This Scheme may be extended to universities, Colleges and other higher educational institutions coming under the purview of State legislatures, provided State Governments wish to adopt and implement the Scheme subject to the following terms and condition:
 - (a) Financial assistance from the Central Government to State Governments opting to revise pay scales of teachers and other equivalent cadre covered under the Scheme shall be limited, by way of reimbursement, to the extent of 50% (fifty percent) of the additional expenditure involved in the implementation of the pay revision, for the universities, colleges and other higher educational institutions funded by the State Government.
 - (b) The State Government opting for revision of pay shall meet the remaining 50% (fifty percent) of the additional expenditure from its own sources.
 - (c) The proposal for reimbursement on account of pay revision in State funded universities, colleges and other higher educational institutions shall be submitted in the prescribed format by the State Governments. The state bills preferred by the State Governments for reimbursement during 2017-18 and 2018-19 would be met to the extent of 50% of additional financial impact during these two years. There would be no central assistance thereafter.

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- (d) Financial assistance referred to in sub-clause (a) above shall be provided for the period from 01.01.2016 to 31.03.2019.
- (e) The entire liability on account of revision of pay scales etc. of university and college teachers shall be taken over by the State Government opting for revision of pay scales with effect from 01.04.2019.
- (f) Financial assistance from the Central Government shall be restricted to revision of pay scales in respect of only those posts which were in existence and had been filled up as on 01.01.2016.
- (g) State Governments, taking into consideration other local conditions, may also decide in their discretion, to introduce pay higher than those mentioned in this Scheme, and shall give effect to the revised bands/ scales of pay from 01.01.2016; however, in such cases, the details of modifications proposed shall be furnished to the Central Government and Central assistance shall be restricted to the Pay as approved by the Central Government and not to any higher pay fixed by the State Government(s).
- (h) Payment of Central assistance for implementing this Scheme is also subject to the condition that the entire Scheme of revision of pay scales, together with all the conditions to be laid down by the UGC by way of Regulations and other guidelines shall be implemented by State Governments and Universities and Colleges coming under their jurisdiction as a composite scheme without any modification except in regard to the date of implementation and pay scales mentioned herein above.

17. Date of implementation of revised pay and allowance and payment of arrears:

- The revised Pay and revised rates of Dearness Allowance under this Scheme shall be effective from 01.01.2016.
- (ii) Payment of arrears may be released by Central Universities and Centrally funded Deemed Universities after the funds for the purpose is provided by the Ministry of Finance and released to the Universities through the UGC.
- (iii) Payment of arrears up to 40% of total arrears shall be made to State Governments for State funded Universities, colleges and other higher educational institutions during the current financial year 2017-18.
- (iv) An undertaking shall be taken from every beneficiary under this Scheme to the effect that any excess payment made on account of incorrect fixation of pay in the revised Pay Level or grant of inappropriate Pay Level and Pay Cells or any other excess payment made shall be adjusted against the future payments due or otherwise to the beneficiary.
- (v) The revised pay in the relevant Level and Cell together with the applicable allowances including arrears of salary as mentioned above shall be paid to all eligible beneficiaries under this Scheme pending issue of Regulations by the UGC.
- 18. This Scheme is subject to the guidelines issued by the Ministry of Finance (Department of Expenditure) vide OM No.1/1/2016-E.III(A) dated 13th January, 2017.

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- 19. Anomalies, if any, in the implementation of this Scheme may be brought to the notice of the Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, for clarification/ decision of the Central Government.
- 20. This issues with the concurrence of Internal Finance Division vide Dy. No.3738/IFD dated 2nd November, 2017.

In continuation of this Ministry's letter No.1-7/2015-U.II(1) dated 02.11.2017 and letter No.1-7/2015-U.II(2) dated 02.11.2017, it is informed that that the Government of India have decided, in consultation with the Ministry of Finance (Department of Expenditure), to revise the rate of allowances of teachers, equivalent academic staff, Registrars, Finance Officers and Controller of Examinations in Central Universities and colleges thereunder and Centrally funded Deemed to be Universities on the basis of recommendations of the 7th Central Pay Commission. with immediate effect.

- It has been decided that the rates of the allowances admissible during the 6th CPC shall be revised in accordance with the provisions of the Department of Expenditure's OM No.1/1/2016-E-III(A) dated 26th July, 2017, read with Department of Expenditure's Resolution dated 06.07.2017 and the Government orders issued in the matter, for teachers, equivalent academic staff, Registrars, Finance Officers and Controller of Examinations in Central Universities and colleges thereunder and Centrally funded Deemed to be Universities.
- It is also informed that the rate of Special Allowances for the post of Vice-Chancellor, Pro Vice-Chancellor and College Principals has been revised by a factor of 2.25 and the revised Special Allowances are as follows:

Guidelines for Engaging Professor of Practice in Universities and Colleges

The National Education Policy 2020 seeks to transform higher education by focusing on skill- based education to meet needs of the industry and the economy. Further, the NEP also recommends integrating vocational education with general education and strengthening industry-academia collaboration in HEIs. For skilling of youth at the optimum level, learners are required to think like employers and employers are to think like learners. Towards this, the UGC has taken a new initiative to bring the industry and other professional expertise into the academic institutions through a new category of positions called "Professor of Practice". This will help to take real world practices and experiences into the class rooms and also augment the faculty resources in higher education institutions. In turn, the industry and society will benefit from trained graduates equipped with the relevant skills.

1. Objectives:

- To develop courses and curriculum to meet the industry and societal needs and enable the HEIs to work with industry experts on joint research projects and consultancy services which will be mutually beneficial;
- To bring in distinguished experts from various fields such as engineering, science, technology, entrepreneurship, management, chartered accountancy (CA), commerce, ii. social sciences, media, literature, fine arts, civil services, armed forces, legal profession and public administration into the academic institutions;
- To enable the higher education institutions to formally associate with persons of eminence and encourage them to participate in experiential learning, research, iii. training, skilling, entrepreneurship and extension and to play mentoring role.

2. Eligibility:

- Distinguished experts who have made remarkable contributions in their professions from various fields such as engineering, science, technology, entrepreneurship, commerce, social sciences, media, literature, fine arts, civil services, armed forces, legal profession, community development, panchayati raj, rural development, watershed development, water-harvesting, organic farming, small green energy systems, municipal planning, community participation, gender budgeting/planning, inclusive development of tribals and public administration among others. Those who have proven expertise in their specific profession or role with at least 15 years of service/experience, preferably at a senior level, will be eligible for Professor of Practice.
 - A formal academic qualification is not considered essential for this position if they have exemplary professional practice in lieu. These experts will also be exempted from the requirement of publications and other eligibility criteria stipulated for the recruitment of faculty members at the Professor level. However, they should possess the skills to carry out the duties and responsibilities specified in the following section.

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 The number of Professors of Practice in a HEI, at any point in time, should not exceed 10% of the sanctioned posts in a HEI.

3. Duties and Responsibilities:

- Involve in the development and designing of courses and curriculum.
- ii. Introduce new courses and deliver lectures as per institutional policies.
- To encourage students in innovation and entrepreneurship projects & provide necessary mentorship for these activities.
- iv. To focus on enhanced industry-academia collaborations.
- v. Conduct jointly in collaboration with regular faculty member of the institution, workshops, seminars, deliver special lectures and training programmes.
- vi. Carryout joint research project or consultancy services in collaboration with the regular faculty member of the concerned HEI.

4. General Conditions:

i. The engagement of Professor of Practice will be for a fixed term.

ii. The engagement of Professor of Practice will be exclusive of the sanctioned posts of a university/college. It will not affect the number of sanctioned posts and the recruitment of regular faculty members.

iii. Professor of Practice is not open for those in teaching profession- serving or retired.

5. Categories of Engagement:

It is envisioned that Professor of Practice can be engaged in one of the following categories:

- A. Professor of Practice funded by Industries
- B. Professor of Practice funded by HEIs from their own resources
- C. Professor of Practice on Honorary basis

A. Professor of Practice funded by Industries:

Today's industry looks for graduates with specific skill sets. But the higher education system is churning out graduates who fall short of the required skills. As a result, many industries now hire graduates and provide adequate training before employing them. Involving experts from industry in teaching will benefit both the industry and the higher educational institutions. For engaging industry experts and professionals in this category, HEIs may collaborate with the industries to support the Professor of Practice positions.

B. Professor of Practice funded by HEIs from their own resources:

As per the policy directives of NEP 2020, graduate programmes are revised with the holistic and multidisciplinary approach. HEIs may assess the required gap areas in different fields and engage experts working in leadership positions in various fields. In this category, the remuneration for the Professor of Practice is made by HEIs from their own resources as indicated below:

Remuneration:

Part-time/Full-time engagement: Consolidated amount, mutually agreed between the institution and expert.

C. Professor of Practice on Honorary basis:

Experts fulfilling the eligibility criteria for the Professor of Practice may like to share their expertise with students and come forward to teach on honorary basis. Such experts may be engaged on honorary basis as Professor of Practice and their services may be utilized for the benefit of the students.

The HEIs may decide on the amount of honorarium to be paid to the Professor of Practice in this category from their own resources.

6. Procedure for selecting Professor of Practice

- a) The Vice-Chancellors/Directors may invite nominations from eminent experts for Professor of Practice positions.
- b) The experts willing to serve may also be nominated or they can send their nomination to the Vice-Chancellor/Director with a detailed biodata and a brief write-up about their potential contribution to the HEI.
- c) Such nominations will be considered by a selection committee consisting of two senior Professors from the HEI and one eminent external member. Based on the recommendations of this committee, the Academic Council and the Executive Council or statutory bodies of the HEI will decide on the engagement.

7. Tenure

The engagement may be initially for up to one year. At the end of the initial engagement or subsequent extension, the HEI will make an assessment and take the decision about extension. The HEI will devise its own assessment procedure for extension based on the contribution and requirement of the experts engaged as Professors of Practice.

The maximum duration of service of Professor of Practice at a given institution should not exceed three years and is extendable by one year in exceptional cases and the total service should not exceed four years under any circumstances.

क्रम मि. स० 1–3/2021 (क्यूआईपी).—विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग अधिनियम, 1956 (1956 का 3) की धारा 26 की उप—धारा (1) के अनुच्छेद (च) एवं (छ) के द्वारा प्रदत्त अधिकारों का प्रयोग करते हुए और यूजीसी (एम.फिल. /पीएच.डी. उपाधि प्रदान करने हेतु न्यूनतम मानदण्ड और प्रक्रिया) विनियम, 2016 और इसके संशोधनों के प्रतिस्थापन में विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग एतद्द्वारा निम्नवत विनियम बनाता है, नामतः —

1. लघु शीर्ष, अनुप्रयोग एवं प्रवर्तन-

- (1) इन विनियमों को विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग (पीएच.डी. उपाधि प्रदान करने हेतु न्यूनतम मानदण्ड और प्रक्रिया) विनियम, 2022 कहा जाएगा।
- (2) ये विनियम, ऐसे प्रत्येक विश्वविद्यालय पर लागू होंगे जो किसी केन्द्रीय अधिनियम, प्रांतीय अधिनियम अथवा राज्य अधिनियम के तहत स्थापित अथवा निगमित है, तथा ऐसा प्रत्येक महाविद्यालय जो विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग अधिनियम, 1956 की धारा 3 के तहत मानित विश्वविद्यालय संस्थान हैं।
- (3) ये विनियम भारत के राजपत्र में अधिसूचित किए जाने की तिथि से लागू माने जाएंगे।

2. परिभाषाएं-

- (1) इन विनियमों में, जब तक कि संदर्भ से अन्यथा अपेक्षित न हो, -
 - क) "अधिनियम" का अर्थ विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग अधिनियम, 1956 (1956 का 3) है;
- ख) अनुबंधक संकाय" का अर्थ है एक अंशकालिक या आकस्मिक प्रशिक्षक, लेकिन पूर्णकालिक संकाय सदस्य नहीं, जो एक उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान द्वारा पढ़ाने के लिए नियुक्त किया गया

है;

- ग) "संचित ग्रेड प्वाइंट औसत (सीजीपीए)" का अर्थ सभी सेमेस्टर में एक छात्र के समग्र संचित प्रदर्शन का परिणाम है। सीजीपीए सभी सेमेस्टर में विभिन्न पाठ्यक्रमों में एक छात्र द्वारा अर्जित कुल क्रेडिट अंकों तथा सभी सेमेस्टर में सभी पाठ्यक्रमों के कुल क्रेडिट के योग का अनुपात है। इसे दशमलव के दो स्थानों तक व्यक्त किया जाता है;
- घ) "क्रेडिट" का अर्थ है एक सेमेस्टर की अवधि में प्रति सप्ताह आवश्यक शिक्षण के घंटों की संख्या। एक सेमेस्टर में तीन—क्रेडिट पाठ्यक्रम का अर्थ है प्रति सप्ताह एक घंटे के तीन व्याख्यान जिसमें प्रत्येक एक घंटे के व्याख्यान को एक क्रेडिट के रूप में गिना जा सकता है:
- **ङ)** ''महाविद्यालय'' का अर्थ है उच्चतर शिक्षण और / या अनुसंधान में संलग्न एक संस्था, जिसे या तो किसी विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा इसकी घटक इकाई के रूप में स्थापित किया गया है या इससे संबद्ध है;
 - च) ''आयोग'' का अर्थ यूजीसी अधिनियम 1956 की धारा 4 के तहत स्थापित विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग है;
 - छ) "पाठ्यक्रम" का अर्थ उन विशिष्ट इकाइयों में से एक है जो अध्ययन के एक कार्यक्रम को शामिल करती हैं:
- ज) ''कोर्स वर्क'' का अर्थ है स्कूल / विभाग / केंद्र द्वारा पीएच.डी. उपाधि के लिए पंजीकृत शोधार्थी के अध्ययन के लिए निर्धारित पाठ्यक्रम;
- **झ)** "उपाधि" का अर्थ है अधिनियम की धारा 22 (3) के प्रावधानों के अनुसार किसी उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान द्वारा प्रदान की गई उपाधि;
- अ) ''बाह्य परीक्षक'' का अर्थ है एक शिक्षाविद / छात्रवृति प्राप्त शोधकर्ता जो शोधकार्य प्रकाशित होने के साथ उस उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान में नियोजित नहीं है जहां पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी ने पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रम के लिए पंजीकरण कराया है;
- ट) "विदेशी शैक्षिक संस्थान" का अभिप्राय— (प) उस देश में विधिवत स्थापित या निगमित ऐसे संस्थान से है जो अपने देश में रनातक, रनातकोत्तर और उच्च स्तर पर शैक्षिक कार्यक्रम पेश करता हो और (पप) जो पारंपरिक मुखाभिमुख तरीके के माध्यम से डिग्री प्रदान करने के लिए अध्ययन के कार्यक्रम(ओं) की पेशकश करता हो, ना कि ऑनलाइन मुक्त एवं दूरस्थ ज्ञानार्जन माध्यम से।
 - **ढ)** "ग्रेड प्वाइंट" का अर्थ है 10-बिंद् पैमाने पर प्रत्येक अक्षर ग्रेड को आवंटित संख्यात्मक भार;
- **ड)** ''गाइड/शोध पर्यवेक्षक'' का अर्थ है उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान द्वारा मान्यता प्राप्त एक शिक्षाविद/शोधकर्ता जो पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी और उसके शोध की निगरानी करे।
- **ढ)** ''उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान'' का अर्थ इन विनियमों के विनियम 1 के खंड 2 के तहत विनिर्दिष्ट विश्वविद्यालय या संस्थान है:
 - ण) "अंतर्विषयक शोध" का अर्थ है दो या दो से अधिक शैक्षणिक विषयों में पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी द्वारा किया गया शोध;
- त) "मुक्त एवं दूरस्थ ज्ञानार्जन माध्यम" का वही अर्थ होगा जो यूजीसी (मुक्त एवं दूरस्थ ज्ञानार्जन माध्यम एवं ऑनलाइन कार्यक्रमों) विनियम, 2020 के तहत परिभाषित है;
- थ) ऑनलाइन माध्यम का वही अर्थ होगा जो यूजीसी (मुक्त एवं दूरस्थ ज्ञानार्जन माध्यम एवं ऑनलाइन कार्यक्रमों) विनियम, 2020 के तहत परिभाषित है;
 - द) ''साहित्यिक चोरी'' का अर्थ है किसी और के कार्य या विचार को स्वयं के मूल कार्य के रूप में प्रकाशित कराना।
- **ध)** "कार्यक्रम" का अर्थ अधिनियम की धारा 22 की उप—धारा (3) के तहत आयोग द्वारा निर्दिष्ट उपाधि के लिए अपनाये जाने वाला उच्चतर शिक्षा कार्यक्रम है;
- न) ''विवरण-पुस्तिका'' का अर्थ है कोई भी प्रकाशन, चाहे वह प्रिंट में हो या अन्यथा, उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान और कार्यक्रमों से संबंधित सर्वसाधारण जनता को (ऐसे उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थानों में प्रवेश के इच्छुक हो) निष्पक्ष और पारदर्शी जानकारी प्रदान करने के लिए उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थानों द्वारा जारी किया गया हो;
- प) ''शोध प्रस्ताव'' का अर्थ है प्रस्तावित शोध कार्य की रूपरेखा देने वाला एक संक्षिप्त आलेख जो पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रम हेत् पंजीकरण के लिए आवेदन के साथ पीएच.डी. अभ्यर्थी द्वारा प्रस्तुत किया जाएगा;
- फ) ''विश्वविद्यालय'' का अर्थ एक केंद्रीय अधिनियम, एक प्रांतीय अधिनियम, या एक राज्य अधिनियम द्वारा या उसके तहत स्थापित या निगमित एक उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान है, और इसमें अधिनियम की धारा 3 के तहत एक मानित विश्वविद्यालय के रूप में माना जाने वाला उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान शामिल होगा।

(2) इन विनियमों में प्रयुक्त और परिभाषित नहीं किए गए शब्दों और अभिव्यक्तियों, लेकिन अधिनियम में परिभाषित और इन विनियमों के अनुरूप नहीं हैं, उनका अर्थ क्रमशः उस अधिनियम में दिया जाएगा।

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- 3. पीएच.डी.कार्यक्रम में प्रवेश के लिए पात्रता मानदण्ड निम्नवत अभ्यर्थी पीएच.डी कार्यक्रम में प्रवेश प्राप्त करने हेतु पात्र हैं :-
 - (1) वे अभ्यर्थी जिन्होंने पूरा कर लिया है:
 - i). 4—वर्षीय/8—सेमेस्टर स्नातक उपाधि कार्यक्रम के बाद 1—वर्ष/2—सेमेस्टर स्नातकोत्तर उपाधि कार्यक्रम अथवा 3—वर्षीय स्नातक उपाधि कार्यक्रम के बाद 2—वर्षीय/4—सेमेस्टर स्नातकोत्तर उपाधि कार्यक्रम अथवा संबंधित सांविधिक निकाय द्वारा स्नातकोत्तर उपाधि के समकक्ष घोषित योग्यताएं, जहां कहीं भी ग्रेडिंग प्रणाली का पालन किया जाता है; अथवा एक मूल्यांकन और प्रत्यायन एजेंसी द्वारा मान्यता प्राप्त ऐसे विदेशी शैक्षणिक संस्थान से समकक्ष योग्यता, जो किसी प्राधिकरण द्वारा स्थापित, मान्यता प्राप्त या अधिकृत है, में कम से कम 55: अंकों के साथ या इसके समकक्ष ग्रेड में एक बिंदु पैमाने पर अथवा ऐसे प्रत्यायित विदेशी शैक्षिक संस्थान से समकक्ष उपाधि प्राप्त की हो, जो कि किसी आकलन एवं प्रत्यायन एजेंसी द्वारा प्रत्यायित है, जोिक शैक्षिक संस्थानों की गुणवत्ता एवं मानकों को सुनिश्चित करने एवं उनके आकलन, प्रत्यायन हेतु ऐसे किसी सांविधिक प्राधिकरण द्वारा अथवा ऐसे एक प्राधिकरण के अंतर्गत स्वीकृत एवं प्रत्यायित है जो कि उस देश में किसी कानून के अन्तर्गत स्थापित अथवा निगमित है।

अनुसूचित जाति/अनुसूचित जनजाति/अन्य पिछड़ा वर्ग (नॉन-क्रीमी लेयर)/दिव्यांग व्यक्ति, आर्थिक रूप से कमजोर वर्ग (ई.डब्ल्यू.एस) और अन्य श्रेणियों के अभ्यर्थियों को समय-समय पर विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग के निर्णय के अनुसार 5: अंकों अथवा ग्रेड में समतुल्य छूट प्रदान की जा सकती है।

बशर्ते, 4—वर्षीय/8—सेमेस्टर स्नातक उपाधि कार्यक्रम के बाद प्रवेश पाने के इच्छुक उम्मीदवार के न्यूनतम 75: अंक होने चाहिए या इसके समकक्ष ग्रेड एक पॉइंट स्केल में जहां भी ग्रेडिंग सिस्टम का पालन किया जाता है; अनुसूचित जाति/अनुसूचित जनजाति/अन्य पिछड़ा वर्ग (नॉन—क्रीमी लेयर)/दिव्यांग व्यक्ति, आर्थिक रूप से कमजोर वर्ग (ई.डब्ल्यू.एस) और अन्य श्रेणियों के उम्मीदवारों के लिए समय—समय पर आयोग के निर्णय के अनुसार 5: अंकों या ग्रेड में समतुल्य की छूट की अनुमति प्रदान की जा सकती है।

(2)एम.फिल. पाठ्यक्रम को कम से कम 55: अंकों के साथ उत्तीर्ण करने वाले अथवा जहाँ कहीं भी—ग्रेडिंग प्रणाली अपनाई जाती है वहाँ बिंदु मानक पर समतुल्य ग्रेड अथवा ऐसे प्रत्यायित विदेशी शैक्षिक संस्थान से समकक्ष उपाधि प्राप्त की हो, जो कि किसी आकलन एवं प्रत्यायन एजेंसी द्वारा प्रत्यायित है, जोकि शैक्षिक संस्थानों की गुणवत्ता एवं मानकों को सुनिश्चित करने एवं उनके आकलन, प्रत्यायन हेतु ऐसे किसी सांविधिक प्राधिकरण द्वारा अथवा ऐसे एक प्राधिकरण के अंतर्गत स्वीकृत एवं प्रत्यायित है जो कि उस देश में किसी कानून के अन्तर्गत स्थापित अथवा निगमित है, से समतुल्य योग्यता प्राप्त अभ्यर्थी पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रम में नामांकन के लिए पात्र होंगे।

4. कार्यक्रम की अवधि-

- (1) पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रम की अवधि कम से कम तीन (3) वर्ष की होगी, जिसमें पाठ्यक्रम से संबंधित कार्य (कोर्स वर्क) भी शामिल होगा तथा पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रम में प्रवेश की तिथि से अधिकतम अवधि छह (6) वर्ष होगी।
- (2) संबंधित उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान के सांविधि / अध्यादेश के अनुसार पुनः पंजीकरण की प्रक्रिया के माध्यम से अधिकतम दो (2) वर्ष का अतिरिक्त समय दिया जा सकता है; बशर्ते, कि पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रम पूरा करने की कुल अविध पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रम में प्रवेश की तिथि से आठ (8) वर्ष से अधिक नहीं होना चाहिए।

बशर्ते कि, महिला पीएच.डी. शोधार्थियों एवं दिव्यांग व्यक्तियों (40: से अधिक विकलांगता वाले) को दो (2) वर्षों की अतिरिक्त छूट की अनुमित दी जा सकती है, हालांकि, पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रम पूरा करने की कुल अवधि ऐसे मामले में पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रम में प्रवेश की तारीख से दस (10) वर्ष से अधिक नहीं होना चाहिए।

(3) महिला पीएच.डी. शोधार्थियों को पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रम की पूरी अवधि में 240 दिनों तक के लिए मातृत्व अवकाश / शिश् देखभाल अवकाश प्रदान किया जा सकता है।

5. प्रवेश की प्रक्रिया-

- (1) प्रवेश, यूजीसी और अन्य संबंधित वैधानिक/नियामक निकायों द्वारा जारी किए गए दिशा—निर्देशों/मानदंडों को ध्यान में रखते हुए, और केंद्र/राज्य सरकार द्वारा समय—समय पर जारी किए गए आरक्षण नीति का पालन करते हुए, संस्थान द्वारा अधिसूचित मानदंडों पर आधारित होगा।
- (2) पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रम में प्रवेश निम्नलिखित विधियों का उपयोग करके किया जा सकता है:
 - (क) उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान एक साक्षात्कार के आधार पर यूजीसी-नेट/यूजीसी-सीएसआईआर नेट/गेट/सीईईडी और इसी तरह के राष्ट्रीय स्तर के परीक्षाओं में अध्येतावृत्ति/छात्रवृत्ति के लिए अर्हता प्राप्त करने वाले छात्रों को प्रवेश दे सकते हैं।

और / या

- (ख) उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान अपने स्तर पर आयोजित प्रवेश परीक्षा के माध्यम से छात्रों को प्रवेश दे सकते हैं। प्रवेश परीक्षा में 50: प्रश्न शोध पद्धति तथा 50: विशिष्ट विषय के पूछे जाएंगे।
- (ग) प्रवेश परीक्षा में 50: अंक अर्जित करने वाले अभ्यर्थी साक्षात्कार के लिए बुलाए जाने के पात्र होंगे।
- (घ) आयोग द्वारा समय–समय पर लिए गए निर्णय के अनुसार अनुसूचित जाति / अनुसूचित जनजाति / अन्य पिछड़ा वर्ग / दिव्यांग वर्ग, आर्थिक रूप से कमजोर वर्ग (ई.डब्ल्यू.एस) और अन्य श्रेणियों के उम्मीदवारों के लिए प्रवेश परीक्षा में 5: अंकों की छूट की अनुमति दी जाएगी।
- (ड) उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान उपलब्ध पीएच.डी सीटों की संख्या के आधार पर साक्षात्कार के लिए बुलाए जाने वाले पात्र छात्रों की संख्या तय कर सकते हैं।
- (च) बशर्ते कि, उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान द्वारा आयोजित प्रवेश परीक्षा के आधार पर उम्मीदवारों के चयन के लिए, प्रवेश परीक्षा के लिए 70: और साक्षात्कार / मौखिक परीक्षा में प्रदर्शन के लिए 30: का महत्व दिया जाएगा।

(3) विश्वविद्यालय और महाविद्यालय जो पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रम चलाने के पात्र है, वे:

- i. दाखिले हेतु सीटों की संख्या, उपलब्ध सीटों का विषय/विषय—वार संवितरण, दाखिले का मानदंड, दाखिले की प्रक्रिया और अभ्यर्थियों के लिए अन्य सभी संगत जानकारी को निर्दिष्ट करते हुए संस्थान की वेबसाइट पर एक विवरण—पुस्तिका को पहले से ही सूचित करेंगे;

 m ii.}$ राष्ट्रीय / राज्य स्तरीय आरक्षण नीति का यथास्थिति अनुपालन करें।
- (4) उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान पीएच.डी. पर्यवेक्षकों की एक सूची का रख—रखाव (पर्यवेक्षक का नाम, उसका पदनाम और विभाग/स्कूल/केंद्र निर्दिष्ट करते हुए), पीएच.डी. के लिए पंजीकृत छात्रों के विवरण के साथ (पंजीकृत पीएच.डी. छात्र का नाम, उनके शोध का विषय और दाखिले की तारीख का उल्लेख करते हुए) अपने वेबसाइट पर अपलोड करेंगे और हर शैक्षणिक वर्ष में इस सूची को अद्यतन करेंगें।

8. शोध पर्यवेक्षक का निर्धारण—शोध पर्यवेक्षक, सह—पर्यवेक्षक बनने हेतु पात्रता मानदण्ड, प्रति पर्यवेक्षक के लिए अनुमेय पीएच.डी. शोधार्थियों की संख्या, आदि।

(1) उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान के प्रोफेसर / एसोसिएट प्रोफेसर के रूप में काम करने वाले स्थायी संकाय सदस्य जिन्होंने पीएच.डी. प्राप्त करने के साथ पीयर-रिव्यू या संदर्भित पत्रिकाओं में कम से कम पांच शोध प्रकाशित किए हैं और उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थानों में सहायक प्रोफेसर के रूप में काम करने वाले स्थायी संकाय सदस्य जो पीएच.डी. उपाधि धारक हो तथा जिसके द्वारा पीयर-रिव्यू या संदर्भित पत्रिकाओं में कम से कम तीन शोध प्रकाशन प्रकाशित किए गए हों उन्हें वि"वविद्यालय अथवा इसके संबद्ध रनातकोत्तर महाविद्यालयों / संस्थानों में शोध पर्यवेक्षक के रूप में मान्यता दी जा सकती है जहां वे कार्यरत है। ऐसे मान्यता प्राप्त शोध पर्यवेक्षक अन्य संस्थानों में शोधार्थियों के पर्यवेक्षक नहीं हों सकते हैं, पर वहां वे केवल सह-पर्यवेक्षक के रूप में कार्य कर सकते हैं। अगर पीएच.डी. की एक उपाधि एक विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा एक ऐसे संकाय सदस्य की देखरेख में प्रदान की जाती है जो उस विश्वविद्यालय या उसके संबद्ध स्नातकोत्तर महाविद्यालयों / संस्थानों का कर्मचारी नहीं है, तो इसे इन विनियमों का उल्लंघन माना जाएगा।

केंद्र सरकार / राज्य सरकार के अनुसंधान संस्थानों में कार्यरत पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी जिनकी डिग्री उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थानों द्वारा दी जाती है, ऐसे शोध संस्थानों के वैज्ञानिक जो प्रोफेसर / एसोसिएट प्रोफेसर / सहायक प्रोफेसर के समकक्ष हैं, उन्हें पर्यवेक्षक के रूप में मान्यता दी जा सकती है यदि वे उपरोक्त आवश्यक मापदंड को पूरा करते हैं।

बशर्ते कि उन क्षेत्रों / विषयों में जहां कोई पीयर—रिव्यू या संदर्भित पत्रिकाएँ नहीं है, या केवल सीमित संख्या में हैं, उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान लिखित रूप में उचित कारण दर्ज करते हुए शोध पर्यवेक्षक के रूप में किसी व्यक्ति की मान्यता के लिए उपरोक्त शर्त में छूट दे सकता है।

एक ही विभाग या एक ही संस्थान के अन्य विभागों या अन्य संस्थानों के सह—पर्यवेक्षकों को सक्षम प्राधिकारी के अनुमोदन से अनुमति दी जा सकती है।

अनुबंध संकाय सदस्य (एडजंक्ट फैकल्टी) शोध पर्यवेक्षक नहीं हो सकते, वे केवल सह-पर्यवेक्षक के रूप में कार्य कर सकते हैं।

- (2) अंतर्विषयक / बहुविषयक अनुसंधान कार्य के मामले में, यदि आवश्यक हो, विभाग / स्कूल / केंद्र / महाविद्यालय / विश्वविद्यालय के बाहर से एक सह—पर्यवेक्षक नियुक्त किया जा सकता है।
- (3) किसी एक समय में एक पात्र प्रोफेसर/एसोसिएट प्रोफेसर/सहायक प्रोफेसर क्रमशः आठ (8)/छह (6)/चार (4) पीएच.डी. छात्रों का मार्गदर्शन कर सकते है।
- (4) विवाह अथवा अन्यथा किसी कारण से किसी पीएच.डी.महिला शोधार्थी के अन्यत्र चले जाने पर, शोध आंकड़ों को ऐसे उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान को अंतरित करने की अनुमित होगी जहाँ शोधार्थी पुनः जाना चाहे बशर्ते कि इन विनियमों के अन्य सभी निबंधन और शर्तों का शब्दशः पालन किया जाए तथा शोध किसी मूल संस्थान / पर्यवेक्षक द्वारा किसी वित्त पोषण एजेंसी से प्राप्त न किया गया हो। तथापि, शोधार्थी मूल संस्थान के मार्गदर्शन तथा संस्थान के पूर्व में किए गए शोध कार्य के लिए उसे पूर्ण श्रेय देगा।
- (5) ऐसे संकाय सदस्य जिनकी सेवानिवृत्ति को तीन वर्ष से कम की अवधि बची है उन्हें अपने पर्यवेक्षण में नए शोधार्थियों को लेने की अनुमित नहीं होगी। बशर्ते कि, हालाँकि, ऐसे संकाय अपनी सेवानिवृत्ति तक पहले से ही पंजीकृत शोधार्थियों का पर्यवेक्षण जारी रख सकते हैं और सेवानिवृत्ति के पश्चात् सह—पर्यवेक्षक के रूप में 70 वर्ष की आयु प्राप्त करने तक ही कार्य कर सकते है उसके बाद नहीं।

7. अंतर्राष्ट्रीय छात्रों का पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रमों में प्रवेश -

- (1) प्रत्येक पर्यवेक्षक पीएच.डी. शोधार्थियों की अनुमित संख्या के ऊपर दो अंतर्राष्ट्रीय शोधार्थियों को एक अतिरिक्त आधार पर मार्गदर्शन कर सकता है, जैसा कि ऊपर खंड 6.3 में निर्दिष्ट है।
- (2) उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान संबंधित सांविधिक / नियामक निकायों द्वारा समय—समय पर जारी दिशा—निर्देशों / मानदंडों को ध्यान में रखते हुए अंतर्राष्ट्रीय छात्रों का पीएच.डी. में दाखिले के लिए अपनी चयन प्रक्रिया स्वयं तय कर सकते हैं।
- 8. किसी भी समय, पीएच.डी. छात्रों की कुल संख्या, एक संकाय सदस्य के अधीन या तो पर्यवेक्षक या सह-पर्यवेक्षक के रूप में छात्रों की संख्या खंड 6.3 और खंड 7.1 में निर्धारित संख्या से अधिक नहीं होगी।

9. कोर्स वर्क— क्रेडिट आवश्यकताएं, संख्या, अवधि, पाठ्यक्रम, पूरा करने के लिए न्यूनतम मानदण्ड आदि।

- (1) पीएच.डी. कोर्स वर्क के लिए कम से कम 12 क्रेडिट की आवश्यकता होगी, जिसमें "शोध और प्रकाशन नैतिकता" कोर्स, जैसा कि यूजीसी द्वारा डी.ओ. मि॰ सं॰ 1–1/2018 (जर्नल/केयर) 2019 में अधिसूचित है और जिसमें एक शोध पद्धित पाठ्यक्रम शामिल है। शोध सलाहकार समिति पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रम के लिए क्रेडिट आवश्यकताओं के हिस्से के रूप में यूजीसी द्वारा मान्यता प्राप्त ऑनलाइन पाठ्यक्रमों की सिफारिश भी कर सकती हैं।
- (2) सभी पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी को अपने डॉक्टरेट अवधि के दौरान अध्ययन के विषय की परवाह किए बिना अपने चुने हुए पीएच.डी. विषय से संबंधित शिक्षण / शिक्षा / शिक्षाशास्त्र / लेखन में प्रशिक्षण प्राप्त करने होंगे। पीएच.डी. शोधार्थियों को ट्यूटोरियल या प्रयोगशाला कार्य और मूल्यांकन के संचालन के लिए प्रति सप्ताह 4–6 घंटे शिक्षण / शोध सहायक के कार्य भी सौंपे जा सकते है।
- (3) एक पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी को पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रम को जारी रखने और अपनी शोध प्रबंधन (थीसिस) जमा करने हेतु पात्र होने के लिए न्यूनतम 55: अंक या यूजीसी 10—पॉइंट स्केल में इसके समकक्ष ग्रेड प्राप्त करना होगा।

10. शोध सलाहकार समिति और उसके कार्य-

- (1) प्रत्येक पीएच.डी. छात्र के लिए एक शोध सलाहकार समिति होगी या समकक्ष निकाय, जैसा कि संबंधित उच्च शिक्षा संस्थान के कानूनों / अध्यादेशों में परिभाषित किया गया है। पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी के शोध पर्यवेक्षक इस समिति के संयोजक होंगे और इस समिति के उत्तरदायित्व निम्नवत् होंगे:
 - शोध प्रस्ताव की समीक्षा करना और शोध के शीर्षक को अंतिम रूप देना।
 - ii. शोधार्थी को अध्ययन ढाँचे तथा शोध पद्धित को विकसित करने के लिए मार्गदर्शन प्रदान करना तथा उसके द्वारा पूर्ण किए जाने वाले पाठ्यक्रम (ओं) की पहचान कराना।
 - iii. पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी के शोध कार्य की प्रगति की आवधिक समीक्षा और प्रगति में सहायता करना।
- (2) प्रत्येक सेमेस्टर में एक बार पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी शोध सलाहकार सिमित के समक्ष उपस्थित होकर मूल्यांकन तथा आगे का मार्गदर्शन प्राप्त करने के लिए अपने कार्य की प्रगति पर एक संक्षिप्त रिपोर्ट जमा करेंगे और प्रस्तुति देंगे। शोध सलाहकार सिमिति पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी की प्रगति रिपोर्ट की एक प्रति के साथ अपनी सिफारिशें संबंधित उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान को प्रस्तुत करेगी। ऐसी सिफारिशों की एक प्रति पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी को भी उपलब्ध कराई जाएगी।
- (3) यदि पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी की प्रगति असंतोषजनक हो तो, शोध सलाहकार सिमिति इसके कारणों को दर्ज करेगी और सुधारात्मक उपाय सुझाएगी। यदि पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी इन सुधारात्मक उपायों को कार्यान्वित करने में विफल रहता है तो शोध सलाहकार सिमिति विशिष्ट कारण दर्ज कर पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी के पंजीकरण को रद्द करने की सिफारिश कर सकती है।

11. उपाधि प्रदान करने के लिए मूल्यांकन तथा निर्घारण पद्वतियां न्यूनतम मानदण्ड/क्रेडिट, आदि–

- (1) पाठ्यक्रम का काम संतोषजनक ढंग से पूरा करने और उपरोक्त विनियम 9 के खंड (3) में विहित अंक / ग्रेड प्राप्त करने पर, पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी को शोध कार्य करने और एक मसौदा शोध प्रबंध / थीसिस प्रस्तुत करने की आवश्यकता होगी।
- (2) शोध प्रबंध / थीसिस जमा करने से पूर्व, पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी संबंधित उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान की शोध सलाहकार समिति के समक्ष एक प्रस्तुति देगा जिसमें सभी संकाय सदस्य तथा अन्य शोधार्थी / विद्यार्थी उपस्थित होंगे।
- (3) संबंधित उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान के पास शोध कार्य में साहित्यिक चोरी का पता लगाने के लिए सुविकसित सॉफ्टवेयर अनुप्रयोगों का उपयोग करने वाला एक तंत्र का होना आवश्यक है और शोध सत्यनिष्ठा पीएच.डी. उपाधि प्रदान करने के निमित सभी शोध गतिविधियों का एक अभिन्न अंग होगा।
- (4) पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी मूल्यांकन हेतु शोध प्रबंध / थीसिस प्रस्तुत करेगा, जिसके साथ (क) शोधार्थी से एक वचनवद्धता प्राप्त करना होगा जिसमें यह आश्वासन दिया जाएगा कि किसी भी प्रकार की कोई साहित्यिक चोरी नहीं हुई है और, (ख) शोध पर्यवेक्षक द्वारा शोध प्रबंध / थीसिस की मौलिकता के अनुप्रमाणन स्वरूप एक प्रमाण पत्र जमा करना होगा, जिसमें यह आश्वासन दिया जाएगा कि यह शोध प्रबंध किसी अन्य उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान में किसी अन्य उपाधि / डिप्लोमा के पाठ्यक्रम करने के लिए थीसिस जमा नहीं किया गया है।
- (5) किसी भी पीएच.डी. शोधार्थी द्वारा प्रस्तुत पीएच.डी. शोध प्रबंध/थीसिस का मूल्यांकन उसके शोध पर्यवेक्षक और कम से कम दो ऐसे बाह्य परीक्षकों द्वारा किया जाएगा जो संबंधित क्षेत्र में विशेषज्ञ हो और संबंधित उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान में नियोजित नहीं हो। ऐसे परीक्षक वे शिक्षाविद होंगे जिनको संबंधित विषय क्षेत्र में विद्वतापूर्ण प्रकाशन की सुकीर्ति प्राप्त हो। यथासंभव, बाह्य परीक्षकों में से एक को भारत के बाहर से चुना जाना चाहिए। मौखिक परीक्षा में बोर्ड में शोध पर्यवेक्षक और दो बाह्य परीक्षकों में से कम से कम एक शामिल होगा और यह ऑनलाइन मोड में आयोजित किया जा सकता है। मौखिक परीक्षा में शोध सलाहकार समिति के सदस्यगण/संकाय सदस्य/शोध अन्य शोधार्थियों तथा छात्र भाग ले सकते हैं, उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान इस विनियम के प्रावधानों को लागू करने के लिए उपयुक्त नियम/अध्यादेश तैयार कर सकते हैं।
- (6) शोध प्रबंध / थीसिस के पक्ष में शोधार्थी की मौखिक परीक्षा केवल उस स्थिति में आयोजित की जाएगी जब दोनों बाह्य परीक्षक उनके द्वारा सुझाए गए सुधारों को शामिल करने के बाद थीसिस को स्वीकार करने की सिफारिश करते हैं। यदि इन बाह्य परीक्षकों में से कोई एक अस्वीकृति की सिफारिश करता है, तो संबंधित उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान परीक्षकों के अनुमोदित पैनल से एक वैकल्पिक बाह्य परीक्षक को थीसिस भेजेगा और मौखिक परीक्षा केवल तभी

आयोजित की जाएगी जब वैकल्पिक परीक्षक थीसिस की स्वीकृति की सिफारिश करता है। यदि वैकल्पिक परीक्षक थीसिस की स्वीकृति की अनुशंसा नहीं करता है, तो थीसिस को अस्वीकार कर दिया जाएगा, और पीएच.डी शोधार्थी को पीएच.डी. के अवार्ड के लिए अपात्र घोषित कर दिया जाएगा।

- (7) संबंधित उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान पीएचडी के मूल्यांकन की पूरी प्रक्रिया वाइवा—वॉयस परिणाम की घोषणा सहित पीएच.डी. थीसिस, थीसिस जमा करने की तारीख से छह (6) महीने की अवधि के भीतर पूरी करेगा।
- 12. पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रमों को प्रस्तुत करने के लिए महाविद्यालयों द्वारा पूर्ण की जाने वाली शैक्षणिक, अनुसंधान, प्रशासनिक और अवसंरचनात्मक अपेक्षाएं—
 - (1) वे स्नातकोत्तर महाविद्यालय जो 4—वर्षीय स्नातक कार्यक्रम और/या स्नातकोत्तर कार्यक्रम चलाते हैं, पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रम चला सकते हैं। बशर्ते, वे इन विनियमों के अनुरूप पात्र शोध पर्यवेक्षकों, अपेक्षित अवसंरचना तथा सहायक प्रशासनिक और अनुसंधान सुविधाओं की उपलब्धता को सुनिश्चित करते हों।
 - (2) केंद्र सरकार या राज्य सरकार द्वारा स्थापित वे महाविद्यालय और शोध संस्थान जिनकी डिग्री उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थानों द्वारा प्रदान की जाती है, पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रम की पेशकश कर सकेंगे, बशर्ते कि उनके पास:—
 - i. एक महाविद्यालय में कम से कम दो संकाय सदस्य या शोध संस्थान में दो पीएच.डी. उपाधि धारक वैज्ञानिक होने चाहिए।
 - ii. उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान द्वारा निर्दिष्ट पर्याप्त बुनियादी ढांचा, प्रशासनिक सहायता, अनुसंधान सुविधाएं और पुस्तकालय संसाधन की व्यवस्था हो।

13. अंशकालिक शिक्षा पद्वति के माध्यम से पीएच.डी.-

- (1) अंशकालिक पद्वति के माध्यम से पीएच.डी. कार्यक्रमों को चलाने की अनुमित दी जाएगी बशर्ते इन विनियमों में विनिर्दिष्ट सभी शर्तें पूरी हों।
- (2) संबंधित उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान को अंशकालिक पीएच.डी. के लिए अभ्यर्थी के माध्यम से उस संस्थान के सक्षम अधिकारी द्वारा निर्गत एक ''अनापत्ति प्रमाण पत्र'' प्राप्त करना होगा जहां अभ्यर्थी कार्यरत है और जिसमें यह स्पष्ट रूप से यह उल्लेख किया गया हो कि:
 - i. उम्मीदवार को अंशकालिक आधार पर अध्ययन करने की अनुमति है।
 - ii. उनके आधिकारिक कर्तव्य उन्हें शोध के लिए पर्याप्त समय देने की अनुमित देते हैं।
 - iii. यदि आवश्यक हुआ तो उन्हें कोर्स वर्क पूरा करने के लिए कार्यभार से मुक्त कर दिया जाएगा।
- (3) वर्तमान में लागू इन विनियमों अथवा किसी अन्य कानून में अंतर्विष्ट किसी भी बात के बावजूद, कोई भी उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान या केंद्र सरकार या राज्य सरकार का शोध संस्थान दूरस्थ और / या ऑनलाइन पद्धित के माध्यम से पीएच.डी. पाठ्यक्रम नहीं चलाएगा।
- 14. एम.फिल.उपाधि की स्वीकृति— उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान एम.फिल.(मास्टर ऑफ फिलॉसफी) उपाधि प्रदान नहीं करेंगे।
- 15. अनंतिम प्रमाणपत्र जारी करना— उपाधि को वास्तव में प्रदान करने से पूर्व उपाधि प्रदान करने वाला उच्चतर शिक्षा संस्थान इस आशय का एक अनंतिम प्रमाणपत्र जारी करेगा कि उपाधि, इन विनियमों के प्रावधानों के अनुरूप प्रदान की गई है।
- 16. इन विनियमों की अधिसूचना से पूर्व पीएच.डी. उपाधि प्रदान करना— इन विनियमों के अधिनियमन से पहले शुरू होने वाले एम.फिल उपाधि कार्यक्रम इन विनियमों की किसी भी बात से अप्रभावित रहेगा। ऐसे अभ्यर्थी जो पीएच.डी. पाठ्क्रमों के लिए 11 जुलाई, 2009 को अथवा उसके प्रचात, इन विनियमों की अधिसूचना तक पंजीकृत हुए थे, ऐसे अभ्यर्थी को उपाधि प्रदान किया जाना, यू.जी.सी. (एम.फिल./पीएच.डी. उपाधि प्रदान करने के न्यूनतम मानक और प्रक्रिया) विनियम, 2009 अथवा विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग (एम.फिल./पीएच.डी. उपाधि प्रदान करने हेतु न्यूनतम मानदण्ड और प्रक्रिया) विनियम, 2016, जैसा भी मामला हो इसके अलावा) पहले से पंजीकृत एवं पीएच.डी. कर रहे उम्मीदवारों को उपाधि प्रदान करने के लिए इन विनियमों या विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग (एम.फिल./पीएच.डी. उपाधि प्रदान करने हेतु न्यूनतम मानदण्ड और प्रक्रिया) विनियम 2016 के प्रावधानो द्वारा शासित होंगे। इन विनियमों के अधिनियमन से पहले प्रारंभ एम.फिल उपाधि कार्यक्रम का इन विनियमों से कोई प्रभाव नहीं पड़ेगा।

17. इनिफलबनेट के साथ डिपॉजिटरी— पीएच.डी. उपाधि(यों) को अवार्ड करने हेतु मूल्यांकन प्रक्रिया के सफल समापन के पश्चात् तथा पीएच.डी. उपाधि को प्रदान किये जाने की घोषणा से पूर्व, संबंधित उच्चतर शिक्षण संस्थान पीएच.डी. शोध प्रबंधन की इलेक्ट्रॉनिक प्रति इनिफलबनेट के पास प्रदर्शित (होस्ट) करने के लिए जमा करेगा तािक सभी उच्चतर और अनुसंधान संस्थानों को यह सुलभ हो।

UNIVERSITY GRANTS COMMISSION NOTIFICATION

New Delhi, the 7th November, 2022

University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedures for Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2022

No. F. No. 1-3/2021(QIP).—In exercise of the powers conferred by clauses (f) and (g) of sub-section (1) of section 26 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956), and in supersession of the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Awards of M.Phil. /Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2016 and its amendments, the University Grants Commission hereby makes the following Regulations, namely: -

1. Short title, Application, and Commencement. –

- (1) These Regulations may be called University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2022.
- (2) They shall apply to every university established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, a Provincial Act, or a State Act, every college, and every institution deemed to be a University under section 3 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956.
- (3) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Gazette of India.
- **2. Definitions.-** (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,
 - a) "Act" means the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956);
- b) "Adjunct Faculty" means a part-time or contingent instructor, but not full-time faculty member hired to teach by a Higher Educational Institution;
- c) "Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)" means a measure of the overall cumulative performance of a student over all semesters. The CGPA is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses in all semesters and the sum of the total credits of allcourses in all semesters. It is expressed up to two decimal places;
- d) "Credit" means the number of hours of instruction required per week over the duration of a semester. A three-credit course in a semester means three one-hour lectures per week, with each one-hour lecture counted as one credit;
- e) "College" means an institution engaged in higher education and/or research, either established by a University as its constituent unit or is affiliated with it;
 - f) "Commission" means the University Grants Commission established under Section 4 of the UGC Act1956;
 - g) "Course" means one of the specified units which go to comprise a programme of study;
 - h) "Course Work" means courses of study prescribed by the School/Department/ Centre to be undertaken by a student registered for the Ph.D. Degree;
 - i) "Degree" means a degree awarded by a Higher Educational Institution in accordance with the provisions of section 22 (3) of the Act;
 - j) "External examiner" means an academician/researcher with published research work who is not part of the Higher Educational Institutionwhere the Ph.D. scholar has registered for the Ph.D. programme;
 - k) "Foreign Educational Institution" means-(i) an institution duly established or incorporated in its home

country and offering educational programmes at the undergraduate, postgraduate and higher levels in its home country and (ii) which offers programme(s) of study leading to the award of a degree through conventional face-to-face mode, but excluding distance, online, ODL mode;

- l) "Grade Point" means a numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on a 10-point scale;
- m) "Guide/Research Supervisor" means an academician/researcher recognized by Higher Educational Institution to supervise the Ph.D. scholar for his/her research;
- n) "Higher Educational Institution" means a university or institution specified under clause 2 of Regulation 1 of these Regulations;
- 0) "Interdisciplinary Research" means research conducted by a Ph.D. scholar in two or more academic disciplines;
- p) "Open and Distance Learning Mode" shall have the same meaning as defined under the UGC (Open and Distance Learning Programmes and Online Programmes) Regulations 2020;
- q) "Online Mode" shall have the same meaning as defined under the UGC (Open and Distance Learning Programmes and Online Programmes) Regulations 2020;
- r) "Plagiarism" means the practice of taking someone else's work or idea and passing them asone's own;
- s) "Programme" means a higher education programme pursued for a degree specified by the Commission under sub-section (3) of section 22 of the Act;
- t) "Prospectus" means any document, whether in print or otherwise, issued for providing fairand transparent information relating to a Higher Educational Institution and programmes, to the general public (including to those seeking admission in such Higher Educational Institutions) by the Higher Educational Institutions;
- "Research Proposal" means a brief write-up giving an outline of the proposed research work which the Ph.D. scholar shall submit along with the application for registration for Ph.D. programme;
- v) "University" means a Higher Educational Institution established or incorporated by or undera Central Act, a Provincial Act, or a State Act, and shall include any institution for higher education deemed to be a University under Section 3 of the Act.
- (2) Words and expressions used and not defined in these Regulations but defined in Act and not consistent with these Regulations shall have the meanings assigned to them in that Act.
- **3. Eligibility criteria for admission to the Ph.D. Programme.**-The following are eligible to seek admission to the Ph.D. programme:
 - (1) Candidates who have completed:
 - i. A 1-year/2-semester master's degree programme after a 4-year/8-semester bachelor's degree programme or a 2-year/4-semester master's degree programme after a 3-year bachelor's degree programme or qualifications declared equivalent to the master's degree by the corresponding statutory regulatory body, with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed
 - or equivalent qualification from a foreign educational institution accredited by an assessment and accreditation agency which is approved, recognized or authorized by an authority, established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other statutory authority in that country to assess, accredit or assure quality and standards of the educational institution.

A relaxation of 5% marks or its equivalent grade may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/Differently-Abled, Economically Weaker Section (EWS) and other categories of candidates as per the decision of the Commission from time to time.

Provided that a candidate seeking admission after a 4-year/8-semester bachelor's degree programme should have a minimum of 75% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade on a point scale wherever the grading system is followed. A relaxation of 5% marks or its equivalent grade may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/Differently-Abled, Economically Weaker Section (EWS) and other categories of candidates as per the decision of the Commission from time to time.

(2) Candidates who have completed the M.Phil. programme with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its

equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed or equivalent qualification from a foreign educational institution accredited by an assessment and accreditation agency which is approved, recognized or authorized by an authority, established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other statutory authority in that country to assess, accredit or assure quality and standards of educational institutions, shall be eligible for admission to the Ph.D. programme. A relaxation of 5% marks or its equivalent grade may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/Differently-Abled, Economically Weaker Section (EWS) and other categories of candidates as per the decision of the Commission from time to time.

4. Duration of the Programme.- (1) Ph.D. Programme shall be for a minimum duration of three

- (3) years, including course work, and a maximum duration of six (6) years from the date of admission to the Ph.D. programme.
 - (2) A maximum of an additional two (2) years can be given through a process of re-registration as per the Statute/Ordinance of the Higher Educational Institution concerned; provided, however, that the total period for completion of a Ph.D. programme should not exceed eight (8) years from the date of admission in the Ph.D. programme.

Provided further that, female Ph.D. scholars and Persons with Disabilities (having more than 40% disability) may be allowed an additional relaxation of two (2) years; however, the total period for completion of a Ph.D. programme in such cases should not exceed ten (10) yearsfrom the date of admission in the Ph.D. programme.

(3) Female Ph.D. Scholars may be provided Maternity Leave/Child Care Leave for up to 240days in the entire duration of the Ph.D. programme.

5. Procedure for admission. -

- (1) The admission shall be based on the criteria notified by the institution, keeping in view the guidelines/norms in this regard issued by the UGC and other statutory/regulatory bodies concerned, and taking into account the reservation policy of the Central/State Government from time to time.
- (2) Admission to the Ph.D. programme shall be made using the following methods:
 - i. HEIs may admit students who qualify for fellowship/scholarship in UGC-NET/UGC- CSIR NET/GATE/CEED and similar National level tests based on an interview.

And/or

- ii. HEIs may admit students through an Entrance Test conducted at the level of the individual HEI. The Entrance Test syllabus shall consist of 50% of research methodology, and 50% shall be subject-specific.
- iii. Students who have secured 50 % marks in the entrance test are eligible to be called for the interview.
- iv. A relaxation of 5 % marks will be allowed in the entrance examination for the candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC/differently-abled category, Economically Weaker Section (EWS), and other categories of candidates as per the decision of the Commission from time to time.
- V. HEIs may decide the number of eligible students to be called for an interview based on the number of Ph.D. seats available.
- vi. Provided that for the selection of candidates based on the entrance test conducted by the HEI, a weightage of 70 % for the entrance test and 30 % for the performance in the interview/viva-voce shall be given.
- (3) Universities and Colleges which are eligible to conduct Ph.D. programmes, shall:
 - i. Notify a prospectus well in advance on the institution's website specifying the number of seats for admission, subject/discipline-wise distribution of available seats, criteria for admission, the procedure for admission, and all other relevant information for the candidates;
 - ii. Adhere to the National/State-level reservation policy, as applicable.
- (4) The Higher Educational Institution shall maintain a list of Ph.D. supervisors (specifying the name of the supervisor, his or her designation, and the department/school/centre), along with the details of Ph.D. scholars (specifying the name of the registered Ph.D. scholar, the topic of his/her research and the date of

admission) admitted under them on the website of the institution and update this list every academic year.

- **6. Allocation of Research Supervisor.-** Eligibility criteria to be a Research Supervisor, Co-Supervisor, Number of Ph.D. scholars permissible per supervisor, etc.
 - (1) Permanent faculty members working as Professor/Associate Professor of the Higher Educational Institution with a Ph.D., and at least five research publications in peer-reviewed or refereed journals and permanent faculty members working as Assistant Professors in Higher Educational Institutions with a Ph.D., and at least three research publications in peer-reviewed or refereed journals may be recognized as a Research Supervisor in the university where the faculty member is employed or in its affiliated Post-graduate Colleges/institutes. Such recognized research supervisors cannot supervise research scholars in other institutions, where they can only act as co-supervisors. Ph.D. awarded by a university under the supervision of a faculty member who is not an employee of the university or its affiliated Post- graduate Colleges/institutes would be in violation of these Regulations.

For Ph.D. scholars working in Central government/ State government research institutions whose degrees are given by Higher Educational Institutions, the scientists in such research institutions who are equivalent to Professor/Associate Professor/Assistant Professor can be recognized as supervisors if they fulfill the above requirements.

Provided that in areas/disciplines where there is no, or only a limited number of peer-reviewed or refereed journals, the Higher Educational Institution may relax the above condition for recognition of a person as Research Supervisor with reasons recorded in writing.

Co-Supervisors from within the same department or other departments of the same institution or other institutions may be permitted with the approval of the competent authority.

Adjunct Faculty members shall not act as Research Supervisors and can only act as co-supervisors.

- (2) In case of interdisciplinary/multidisciplinary research work, if required, a Co-Supervisor from outside the Department/School/Centre/College/University may be appointed.
- (3) An eligible Professor/Associate Professor/Assistant Professor can guide up to eight (8) / six (6) / four (4) Ph.D. scholars, respectively, at any given time.
- (4) In case of relocation of a female Ph.D. scholar due to marriage or otherwise, the research data shall be allowed to be transferred to the Higher Educational Institution to which the scholar intends to relocate, provided all the other conditions in these Regulations are followed, and the research work does not pertain to a project sanctioned to the parent Institution/Supervisor by any funding agency. Such scholar shall, however, give due credit to the parent institution and the supervisor for the part of research already undertaken.
- (5) Faculty members with less than three years of service before superannuation shall not be allowed to take new research scholars under their supervision. However, such faculty members can continue to supervise Ph.D. scholars who are already registered until superannuation and as a co-supervisor after superannuation, but not after attaining the age of 70 years.

7. Admission of International students in Ph.D. programme.

- (1) Each supervisor can guide up to two international research scholars on a supernumerary basis over and above the permitted number of Ph.D. scholars as specified in clause 6.3 above.
- (2) The HEIs may decide their own selection procedure for Ph.D. admission of international students keeping in view the guidelines/norms in this regard issued by statutory/regulatory bodies concerned from time to time.
- **8.** At any point, the total number of Ph.D. scholars under a faculty member, either as a supervisor or a co-supervisor, shall not exceed the number prescribed in clause 6.3 and clause 7.1.
- 9. Course Work.- Credit requirements, number, duration, syllabus, minimum standards for completion, etc.
 - (1) The Credit requirement for the Ph.D. coursework is a minimum of 12 credits, including a "Research and Publication Ethics" course as notified by UGC vide D.O. No. F.1- 1/2018(Journal/CARE) in 2019 and a research methodology course. The Research Advisory Committee can also recommend UGC recognized online courses as part of the credit requirements for the Ph.D. programme.
 - (2) All Ph.D. scholars, irrespective of discipline, shall be required to train in teaching /education /pedagogy/writing related to their chosen Ph.D. subject during their doctoral period. Ph.D. scholars may also be assigned 4-6 hours per week of teaching/research assistantship for conducting tutorial or laboratory work and evaluations.

- (3) A Ph.D. scholar must obtain a minimum of 55% marks or its equivalent grade in the UGC 10-point scale in the course work to be eligible to continue in the programme and submit his or her thesis.
- **10. Research Advisory Committee and its Functions.-** (1)There shall be a Research Advisory Committee or an equivalent body as defined in the Statutes/Ordinances of the Higher Educational Institution concerned for each Ph.D. scholar. The Research Supervisor of the Ph.D. scholar concerned shall be the Convener of this committee, and this committee shall have the following responsibilities:
 - i. To review the research proposal and finalize the topic of research.
 - ii. To guide the Ph.D. scholar in developing the study design and methodology of research and identify the course(s) that he/she may have to do.
 - iii. To periodically review and assist in the progress of the research work of the Ph.D.scholar.
 - (2) Each semester, a Ph.D. scholar shall appear before the Research Advisory Committee to make a presentation and submit a brief report on the progress of his/her work for evaluationand further guidance. The Research Advisory Committee shall submit its recommendations along with a copy of Ph.D. scholar's progress report to the Higher Educational Institution concerned. A copy of such recommendations shall also be provided to the Ph.D. scholar.
 - (3) In case the progress of the Ph.D. scholar is unsatisfactory, the Research Advisory Committee shall record the reasons for the same and suggest corrective measures. If the Ph.D. scholar fails to implement these corrective measures, the Research Advisory Committee may recommend, with specific reasons, the cancellation of the registration of the Ph.D. scholar from the Ph.D. programme.

11. Evaluation and Assessment Methods, minimum standards/credits for award of the degree,etc.-

- (1) Upon satisfactory completion of course work and obtaining the marks/grade prescribed inclause (3) of Regulation 9 above, the Ph.D. scholar shall be required to undertake research work and produce a draft dissertation/thesis.
- (2) Before submitting the dissertation/thesis, the Ph.D. scholar shall make a presentation before the Research Advisory Committee of the Higher Educational Institution concerned, which shall also be open to all faculty members and other research scholars/students.
- (3) The Higher Educational Institution concerned shall have a mechanism using well-developed software applications to detect Plagiarism in research work and the research integrity shall be an integral part of all the research activities leading to the award of a Ph.D. degree.
- (4) A Ph.D. scholar shall submit the thesis for evaluation, along with (a) an undertaking from the Ph.D. scholar that there is no plagiarism and (b) a certificate from the Research Supervisor attesting to the originality of the thesis and that the thesis has not been submitted for the award of any other degree/diploma to any other Higher Educational Institution.
- (5) The Ph.D. thesis submitted by a Ph.D. scholar shall be evaluated by his/her Research Supervisor and at least two external examiners who are experts in the field and not in employment of the Higher Educational Institution concerned. Such examiner(s) should be academics with a good record of scholarly publications in the field. Wherever possible, one of the external examiners should be chosen from outside India. The viva-voce board shall consist of the Research Supervisor and at least one of the two external examiners and may be conducted online. The viva-voce shall be open to the members of the Research Advisory Committee/faculty members/research scholars, and students. Higher Educational Institutions may formulate appropriate rules/ordinances to effect the provisions of this Regulations.
- (6) The viva-voce of the Ph.D. scholar to defend the thesis shall be conducted if both the external examiners recommend acceptance of the thesis after incorporating any corrections suggested by them. If one of the external examiners recommends rejection, the Higher Educational Institution concerned shall send the thesis to an alternate external examiner from the approved panel of examiners, and the viva-voce examination shall be held only if the alternate examiner recommends acceptance of the thesis. If the alternate examiner does not recommend acceptance of the thesis, the thesis shall be rejected, and the Ph.D. scholar shall be declared ineligible for the award of a Ph.D.
- (7) The Higher Educational Institution concerned shall complete the entire process of evaluating a Ph. D. thesis, including the declaration of the viva-voce result, within a period of six (6) months from the date of submission of the thesis.
- 12. Academic, research, administrative, and infrastructure requirements to be fulfilled by Colleges for getting recognition for offering Ph.D. programmes.-

- (1) Post-graduate Colleges offering 4-year Undergraduate Programmes and/or Post-graduate Programmes, may offer Ph.D. programmes, provided they satisfy the availability of eligible Research Supervisors, required infrastructure, and supporting administrative and research facilities as per these Regulations.
- (2) Colleges and research institutions established by the central government or a State government whose degrees are awarded by Higher Educational Institutions shall offer Ph.D. programmes provided they have:
 - i. At least two faculty members in a college or two Ph.D.-qualified scientists in the research institution.
 - ii. Adequate infrastructure, administrative support, research facilities and library resources as specified by the HEI.

13. Ph.D. through Part-time Mode-

- (1) Ph.D. programmes through part-time mode will be permitted, provided all the conditions stipulated in these Regulations are fulfilled.
- (2) The Higher Educational Institution concerned shall obtain a "No Objection Certificate" through the candidate for a part-time Ph.D. programme from the appropriate authority in the organization where the candidate is employed, clearly stating that:
 - i. The candidate is permitted to pursue studies on a part-time basis.
 - ii. His/her official duties permit him/her to devote sufficient time for research.
 - iii. If required, he/she will be relieved from the duty to complete the course work.
- (3) Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations or any other law, for the time being in force, no Higher Educational Institution or research institution of the Central government or a State Government shall conduct Ph.D. programmes through distance and/oronline mode.
- **14. Grant of M.Phil. Degree.-** Higher Educational Institutions shall not offer the M.Phil.(Masterof Philosophy) programme.
- **15. Issuing a Provisional certificate.-**Prior to the actual award of the Ph.D. degree, the degree- awarding Higher Educational Institution shall issue a provisional certificate to the effect that the Ph.D. is being awarded in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations.
- 16. Award of Ph.D. degrees prior to Notification of these Regulations.- Award of degrees to candidates registered for the Ph.D. programme on or after July 11, 2009, till the date of Notification of these Regulations shall be governed by the provisions of the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Award of M.Phil./Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2009 or the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Award of M.Phil./Ph.D. Degrees) Regulations, 2016 as the case may be. Further, the award of degrees to candidates already registered and pursuing Ph.D. shall be governed by these Regulations or UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Award of M.Phil./Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2016. Nothing in these Regulations shall impact the M.Phil. degree programmes commencing prior to the enactment of these Regulations.
- 17. **Depository with INFLIBNET.-** Following the successful completion of the evaluation process and before the announcement of the award of the Ph.D. degree(s), the Higher Educational Institution concerned shall submit an electronic copy of the Ph.D. thesis to INFLIBNET, for hostingthe same so as to make it accessible to all the Higher Educational Institutions and research institutions.

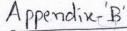

After a detailed deliberation, the Committee was of the opinion to revise the Academic Progress Scholarships norms in the light of decision taken by the Academic Council.

"The Academic Progress Scholarships may be awarded to students who attain substantial progress in their additional effort and motivation. Scholarship of Rs.8,000/- each may be awarded to students who have made maximum progress compared to the previous semester by showing at least 'one grade progress', provided that they have obtained a minimum of B Plus(B+) as the cumulative grade points in the programme of study".

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Existing Norms

10% of the fee collected(Tuition Fee)
from students in a programme during
each semester is set aside for
scholarship

Academic Merit Scholarships of Rs.8,000 each is awarded to the top 20% of students in terms of their performance in the semesters, provided that such students have obtained a minimum grade of B Plus (B+) or above.

Recommended Norms

10% of the fee collected(Tuition Fee) from students in a programme during each semester be set aside for scholarship

Academic Merit Scholarships of Rs.8,000/- to Rs.14,000/- each to be awarded to students in terms of their performance in the semesters, provided that such students have obtained a minimum grade of A Minus (A-) or above. Accordingly, the scholarship may be awarded as per table below

Grade Point	Scholarship Range
A Plus (A+)	Rs.12,000/- to Rs.14,000/-
A Only	Rs.10,000/- to Rs.12,000/-
A Minus (A-)	Rs.5,000/- to Rs.8,000/-

Academic Progress Scholarships may be awarded to students who attain substantial progress in their additional effort and motivation. Since it may not be possible to decide on an exact scale of such progress in term of specific grade points, the committee recommends that 2 scholarship of Rs.8,000/- each may be awarded to students who have made maximum progress compared to the previous semester, provided that they have obtained a minimum of B Plus(B+) as the cumulative grade points in the programme of study.

Academic Progress Scholarships may be awarded to students who attain substantial progress in their additional effort and motivation. Scholarship of Rs.8,000/- each may be awarded to students who have made maximum progress compared to the previous semester by showing at least 'one grade progress', provided that they have obtained a minimum of B Plus(B+) as the cumulative grade points in the programme of study.

programmes have been experiencing difficulty to strictly follow the norms of awarding Rs.8,000/- each as scholarship, either due to lack of sufficient funds or due to large number of students falling within the top 20% of the class in terms of their academic examining performance. After the various dimensions of the problems in detail, the Standing Committee Students Affairs. has recommended Scholarship shall be awarded within the range of Rs. 5,000/- to Rs.8,000/- in each semester.

Some programmes may experience difficulty in strictly following the proposed norms of awarding scholarship as per range detailed above either due to lack of sufficient funds or due to large number of students falling within the class in terms of their academic performance; the amount may be lowered as per the availability of funds.

After examining the various dimensions of the problems in detail, it is recommended that the Scholarship shall be awarded within the range of Rs.8,000/- to Rs.14,000/- in each semester.



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The Scholarship for the current Academic year 2021-22 may be awarded as per existing norms for Monsoon Semester 2021 and Winter Semester 2022.

The scholarship norms 'be reviewed every five years'.

The proposed /recommended norms for award of Scholarship may be implemented from the Academic Year 2022-2023; after due approval of Statutory Bodies.
