## Opening remarks by the Vice Chancellor

At the outset, the Vice Chancellor extended warm welcome to all the members of the Board to its 44<sup>th</sup> meeting. The Vice Chancellor informed the members about the following initiatives that have been taken since the last meeting of the Board of Management held on 20 January, 2023.

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## It was informed that the University has organized the following Special Talks/ Workshops/ Seminars/ Events/ Meetings

- The School of Development Studies organised a seminar on 'Institutional Experiments for Welfare of Informal Workers', on 13 February 2023
- A meeting with delegates from York University (London, United Kingdom), was held on 13.02.2023. Professor Charlie Jeffery, Vice-Chancellor and President, York University along with his team attended the meeting
- Centre for Community Knowledge (CCK) organised a Winter School in community-based research and engagement at the KP Campus from 15-20 Feb, 2023.
- The University organised a webinar on "Digital Payments Role of the Government, Banks and Citizens" on 28th February 2023.
- SBPPSE organised the "Alumni Networking Meet" for the alumni of the School on 03.03.2023 in the India Habitat Centre.

- It was informed that the University has participated in various visits of Hon'ble LG and Chancellor.
- Hon'ble LG visited Qudesia on 16<sup>th</sup> February 2023 and 6<sup>th</sup> March 2023 to inspect cleaning of Yamuna. A No. of officers, students and staff members participated.
- Hon'ble LG visited to inspect 11-km Signature Bridge-ITO Barrage stretch of Yamuna on 30<sup>th</sup> April 2023 on completion of 1st phase of HLC-monitored Yamuna cleaning operations. A No. of Officers, students and staff members participated.
- It was informed about the meeting held with Hon'ble Secretary (HE): A meeting with Hon'ble Secretary (HE) was held on 8th February 2023. Hon'ble Secretary (HE) appreciated the functioning of the University and its performance at various fronts. However, Secretary (HE) also made some observations and suggestions which have been deliberated and being implemented by the University.



- > It was informed about the meeting with Hon'ble Education Minister, Delhi:
- A meeting with the Hon'ble Education Minister was held on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2023 to discuss various matters pertaining to the Academic Expansion and Infrastructure Development of the University Delhi, the introduction of new programmes and to take up the matter with the Administrative Reforms Department for expediting the processing of the files.
- Meeting with the Hon'ble Education Minister was held on 10<sup>th</sup> may 2023 regarding placements of all Universities of Govt. of NCT Delhi. Placement records of 2022 and the planning for future placements was presented over. Hon'ble Minister suggested working to increase placement in social sector by introducing tech driven or industry linkage programmes.
- ➤ It was informed about the meeting held with Hon'ble Chairman, UGC: Hon'ble Chairman, UGC chaired a meeting held with the Vice Chancellors of Universities and Directors of Institutions on 15<sup>th</sup> March 2023 to discuss the progress in implementing NEP 2020. Our University, being a Social Science University placed all issues which were well noted.
- > It was informed that the following batch of DANICS probationers were attached with the University.
- 06 DANICS Probationers (58<sup>th</sup> batch) were attached with the University on 11<sup>th</sup> January 2023.
- 08 DANICS Probationers (59<sup>th</sup> batch) were attached with the University on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2023.
- > It was informed that the University has signed Memorandum of Understanding (MoUs) with the following Universities:
- Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi (GGSIPU): MoU with Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University was signed on the 31<sup>st</sup> January 2023 with a purpose to bring together the industry, institutions and academia for the development of better and skill oriented all round professional to contribute to national development.
- NSUT and DTU: MoUs with Netaji Subhas University of Technology (NSUT)
   Delhi and Delhi Technological University, Delhi (DTU) were also signed on
   the 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2023 with the objective of facilitating mutual cooperation, for the
   promotion of Academic Excellence.
- National Law University, Delhi: MoU with University of Delhi was signed on the 17<sup>th</sup> May 2023.
- University of Delhi: MoU with University of Delhi was signed on the 18<sup>th</sup> May 2023 to work together in areas of research, consultancy, student and faculty exchange, outreach and extension activities etc. The two universities will share resources like libraries, archives, research laboratories, auditorium, sports ground, stadium, conference Halls, and other facilities.

#### It was informed that the University has started its Admission Process for Academic Year 2023-24

The University has started its Admission Process for the UG and PG programmes for the academic Year 2023-24. Information Handbook for UG & PG Admissions 2023-24 has been released on University's website.

Total 817 and 1093 seats have been offered by the University for UG and PG programmes respectively. The applications have been closed now for both UG and PG admissions. NTA has started conducting entrance examinations for UG. As per the information provided by the NTA, a total 4,72,355 applications have been received for UG admission. For PG admission, total 1,92,750 applications have been received till the last date i. e. 11<sup>th</sup> May 2023.

# Agenda 44.1 : Confirmation of the Minutes of 43<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the Board of Management held on 20.01.2023

The Minutes of the 43<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the Board of Management held on 20.01.2023 were circulated among all the members, and no comments were received.

**Decision**: The Board of Management confirmed the minutes of the 43<sup>rd</sup> Meeting of Board of Management.

Agenda 44.2 : Action Taken Report (ATR) on the Minutes of the 43<sup>rd</sup>
Meeting of the Board of Management held on 20.01.2023

The Board of Management was informed that a total of 21 agenda items were discussed in the last meetings held on 20.01.2023. The details of the agenda, decisions taken thereon and the action taken by the University as resolved by BoM were given for information to the Hon'ble members vide **Appendix-1**.

Decision: The Board of Management took the action taken report on record.

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Agenda 44.3 : To deliberate on the observations made by the Directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of NCT of Delhi regarding amendment in Section 13 and Statute 6 pertaining to the Pro- Vice Chancellors of the University of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi Act, 2007

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Board in its 43<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 20.01.2023 vide Resolution No.43.3 (**Appendix-2**) had resolved to consider the amendments in Section 13 and Statute 6 of the Dr.B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi Act, 2007 pertaining to the Pro-Vice Chancellors of the University in light of the UGC Regulations, 2018.

It was informed that the University, in light of the resolution passed by the Board of Management had sent the file to the Directorate of Higher Education for carrying out necessary action regarding amendments in the Section 13 and Statute 6 of the Dr.B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi Act, 2007. However, the DHE vide their note dated 14.03.2023 had sent back to the University for re-examination, which was duly examined and replied by the University. However, the DHE has again sent the proposal to the University for Examination in light of the UGC Regulations, 2018.

It was informed that the Directorate of Higher Education made some observations in the note regarding the superannuation age of Pro-Vice Chancellor.

The following provision has been mentioned in regard to the age of superannuation of Pro-Vice Chancellor, in light of the Statute 6(1):-

"... Provided further than a Pro- Vice Chancellor shall retire on attaining the age of sixty-five year...".

It is submitted that the UGC Regulations 2018 laid down the following provisions in regard to the Pro-Vice Chancellor.

Clause 7.1: The Pro-Vice Chancellor shall be appointed by the Executive Council on the recommendations of the Vice Chancellor.

Clause 7.2: It shall be the prerogative of the Vice Chancellor to recommend a person to be the Pro Vice Chancellor to the Executive Council. The Pro Vice Chancellor shall hold office for a period which is co-terminus with that of the Vice Chancellor.

It was informed to the Board of Management that the UGC Regulations 2018 do not mention about the superannuation age of the Pro-Vice Chancellor. However, in general, para 2.1 of UGC Regulations 2018 states as under:-

"Subject to the availability of vacant positions and fitness, teachers such as Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, Professor and

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Senior Professor only, may be re-employed on contract appointment beyond the age of superannuation, as applicable to the concerned University, college and Institution, up to the age of seventy years. Provided further that all such re-employment shall be strictly in accordance with the guidelines prescribed by the UGC, from time to time".

It was informed to the Board of Management that the University referred to the Acts and Statutes of various Central/State Universities for clarification in the matter pertaining to the superannuation age of Pro Vice Chancellor.

It was informed to the Board that the Directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of NCT of Delhi in one of the files pertaining to the Amendment of Statute 14(2) of the University Act has advised to send such matters directly to the Hon'ble Chancellor through the Chief Secretary.

Decision:

The Board of Management considered the observations made by the Directorate of Higher Education (DHE) and Law Department, GNCTD in one of the matters pertaining to the amendment of Statute 14(2) of the University Act and also DTTE OM No. Ps/Secy/TTE/2023/1439-47 dated 06.04.2023. The Board noted that the DHE has suggested to send such proposals directly to the Hon'ble Chancellor through Chief Secretary.

After due deliberations, the Board of Management resolved that the University may re-send the proposal for amending the First Statute 6 of the University Act to the Hon'ble Chancellor through Chief Secretary. The Board further resolved that the proposal regarding amendment of Statute 6 may be formulated in light of the Clause 7.1 and 7.2 of the UGC Regulations, 2018 and the age of retirement of the Pro-Vice Chancellor may be kept as 65 years as being followed by the Universities established by the Govt. of NCT of Delhi/Delhi University.

Agenda 44.5 : To consider filling up the post of Deputy Registrar on Direct Recruitment basis in Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi

It was submitted to the Board of Management that as per Recruitment Rules (Non – Teaching Employee), 2020 of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi, 25% posts of Deputy Registrars are under promotion, to be filled from amongst the Assistant Registrars with 5 years of regular service in Senior Scale of Level – 11 on regular basis through Limited Departmental

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Examination (LDE). As per Recruitment Rules 2020, only 2 numbers of Assistant Registrars shall be eligible for promotion to the post of Deputy Registrar on or after 12.07.2027.

It was submitted to the Board of Management that there will be no Assistant Registrar eligible for the post of Deputy Registrar before 12.07.2027 and there is an urgent requirement of the Senior Officers as the University is in expansion stage. Therefore, the proposal for the considering the filling up of these 2 posts of Deputy Registrars on Direct Recruitment basis was placed before the Board of Management for consideration.

Decision: After due deliberations, the Board of Management resolved that the posts of Deputy Registrar earmarked to be filled on promotion basis may be filled on promotion basis or the same may be filled for the time being on contract basis by engaging retired government/departmental officials of age below 65 years, after following the guidelines issued by the Finance (Accounts) Department, GNCTD vide OM No. F.20/472015-AC/204-248 dated 04.12.2015 and GNCTD O.M. No. F.20/40/2016-AC/DSFA/16-45 dated 20.01.2017.

Agenda 44.6 : To deliberate and consider the confirmation of Dr. Alka Rai, Deputy Librarian after completion of one year probation period

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Dr. Alka Rai joined Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi on 16.02.2018 (FN) as Deputy Librarian against unreserved category on regular basis on the basis of recommendation made by the duly constituted Selection Committee. The said appointment was ratified by the Board of Management in its 24<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 24.07.2018. Her usual probation period was from 15.02.2018 to 15.02.2019, however, the same was extended up to 15.02.2020, due to the availing of Study Leave by Dr. Alka Rai from 01.10.2018 to 30.09.2019.

It was submitted to the Board of Management that a Civil Writ Petition (CWP) No.10953 of 2018 has also been filed by Mr. Akash (who was also an applicant among the candidates who had applied for the post of Deputy Librarian) against the appointment of Deputy Librarian in Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi, stating that the selection process was carried out in a non-transparent and arbitrary manner, without due consideration of the mandatory guidelines laid down by the University Grants Commission (UGC) issued from time to time. The matter is still subjudice in the Hon'ble Court.

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the court has neither imposed stay on the said appointment nor passed any order for withholding the confirmation process of Dr. Alka Rai to the post of Deputy Librarian. The Board was also apprised of the performance report given by the then Librarian on the tasks performed by Dr. Alka Rai from 16.02.2018 to 30.09.2018 and 01.10.2019 to 15.02.2020.

In view of the above, the matter pertaining to the confirmation of Dr. Alka Rai, Deputy Librarian, after completion of one year probation period/extended probation period subject to the outcome of the writ petition, was placed before the Board of Management for deliberation and consideration.

Decision: The Board of Management deliberated and noted that the matter is pending before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi vide Civil Writ Petition (CWP) No.10953/2018 wherein, the petitioner has sought the following relief:

"a. Issue a writ of mandamus or such other writ or direction to quash the Office Order dated 20.2.2018 issued by the Deputy Registrar(Academic Services) in furtherance of recruitment Advertisement No.AUD/01/2017/Acad.Ser./(i) dated 10.5.2017 and set aside the appointment of Respondent No.2 to the post of Deputy Librarian being in violation of Article 14 of the Constitution of India and University Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications for appointment of Teachers and other academic staff in Universities and colleges and measures for the maintenance of standards in higher education) Regulations, 2010 and the University Grant Commission Minimum Qualifications for appointment of Teachers and other academic staff in Universities and colleges and measures for the maintenance of standards in higher education) (4th Amendment), Regulations, 2016."

It is pertinent to mention here that the Respondent No. 2 cited in the above petition is Dr.Alka Rai, Deputy Librarian.

The Board of Management deliberated, discussed and further noted that Dr. Alka Rai is drawing the pay and admissible allowances as applicable to the post of Deputy Librarian on regular basis. After due deliberations, the Board of Management resolved to take up the matter pertaining to her confirmation after the outcome of the pending Civil Writ Petition (CWP) No.10953 of 2018 in the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi.

Agenda 44.7 : To apprise and consider the continuation of Dr. Nitin Malik as Registrar, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi, appointed on tenure basis for a period of five years

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Before the agenda was taken up by the Board of Management, Dr.Nitin Malik, Registrar recused himself from the meeting, with the approval of the Chair and as decided by the Chair, the agenda was presented by CMA Rajiv Talwar, Controller of Finance to the Board of Management.

It was submitted to the Board of Management that, in accordance with the Section 15(1) of the University Act and subsequent to the Advertisement as issued by the University vide Advt. No.01/HR/2019 dated 01.07.2019, Dr.Nitin Malik, holding substantive post of Joint Registrar at GGS Indraprastha University joined Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi as Registrar on 06.01.2020. The Board of Management was apprised of the detailed facts from time to time as also resolved in the previous meetings of the Board of Management and the provisions laid down in the University Act and Statutes.

The following proposals as approved by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor were placed before the Board of Management for consideration:-

- (i) Continuance of Dr. Nitin Malik as Registrar till the tenure i.e., upto 05.01.2025 on deputation/lien basis in terms of GGSIPU letter dated 09.02.2023.
- (ii) The Finance Division to ensure timely remittance of leave salary/pension contribution to the parent organization of Dr. Nitin Malik (GGSIPU) as admissible for the tenure period i.e., 06.01.2020 to 05.01.2025.

The details and resolution of BoM's and inter-alia decisions taken by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor were placed before the Board of Management for consideration and ratification.

Decision: The Board of Management took note of the detailed facts. After due deliberations, the Board considered and resolved to ratify the decision taken by the Vice Chancellor, Dr.B.R.Ambedkar University Delhi as above(i) and (ii) in regard to the tenural appointment of Dr.Nitin Malik as Registrar, Dr.B.R.Ambedkar University Delhi, for a period of five years.

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# Agenda 44.10 : Matters arising out of the Finance Committee (FC) as emanating from its 33rd meeting held on 29.05.2023

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Minutes of the 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the Finance Committee (FC) held on 29.05.2023 is placed at **Appendix-3**.

Agenda 44.10.1: To consider the proposal for dealing with fund crunch situations anticipated due to insufficient grant sanctioned under Budget Estimates (BE) for the financial year 2023-24 and mismatch between pattern of grant release and actual fund requirements of the University

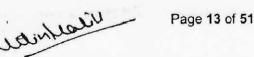
It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Finance Committee in its 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 29.05.2023 considered the proposal for dealing with fund crunch situations anticipated due to insufficient grant sanctioned under Budget Estimates (BE) for the financial year 2023-24 and mismatch between pattern of grant release and actual fund requirements of the University.

The Finance Committee had deliberated on the comparative position of Budget Estimates (BE) for the financial year 2023-24, as recommended by the Finance Committee (FC) in its 31<sup>st</sup> meeting held on 17.10.2022 and approved by the Board of Management (BOM) in its 42<sup>nd</sup> meeting held on 23.12.2022, as sanctioned by Government of NCT of Delhi (GNCTD) and the grant released so far as tabulated below:

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The Finance Committee noted that the BE sanctioned by the GNCTD is on much lower side as compared with the BE recommended by the FC & approved by the BOM, and grossly insufficient in case of GIA head – General. Further it was noted that the Government would be releasing grant in equal installments on quarterly basis but in case of GIA head – General, bulk of expenditure is to be incurred during first two quarters of the financial year as infrastructure augmentation including essential repairs/ renovations need to be done before commencement of forthcoming academic session 2023-24. Due to this temporary fund crunch, situations are anticipated and therefore in order to deal with the same, the Finance Committee considered the following proposals:

- The University may demand sufficient funds under Revised Estimates (RE) for the financial year 2023-24.
- 2. The Vice Chancellor may be authorized to approve transfer of funds from Central Pool of University Development Fund (UDF) to GIA heads -General and Salaries on need basis and recoup UDF upon receipt of sufficient grants from GNCTD. Such transactions shall be reported to the Finance Committee and the Board of Management.
- 3. The following four sub-heads of UDF (a) Student Travel and Exchange Programme Fund, (b) Academic Chairs Fund, (c) Research Endowment Fund and (d) Central Pool may be merged to create a single fund, namely University Development Fund (UDF) so that blockage of funds under different sub-heads is avoided, as it has been observed that fund utilization is happening from Central Pool of UDF only.

After due deliberation, the Finance Committee recommended the proposal for consideration and approval by the Board of Management. Further, the FC also recommended that the transfer of funds from the UDF to GIA Heads – 'General' and 'Salaries' should be in line with the pattern of release of Grant-in-Aid by the GNCTD.

The recommendations made by the Finance Committee in its 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 29.05.2023 were placed before the Board of Management for consideration.

Decision: After due deliberation, the Board considered and resolved to approve the following recommendations made by the Finance Committee in its 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 29.05.2023:

- The University may demand sufficient funds under Revised Estimates (RE) for the financial year 2023-24.
- The Vice Chancellor may be authorized to approve transfer of funds from Central Pool of University Development Fund (UDF) to GIA heads - General and Salaries on need basis and

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recoup UDF upon receipt of sufficient grants from GNCTD. Such transactions shall be reported to the Finance Committee and the Board of Management.

- 3. The following four sub-heads of UDF (a) Student Travel and Exchange Programme Fund, (b) Academic Chairs Fund, (c) Research Endowment Fund and (d) Central Pool may be merged to create a single fund, namely University Development Fund (UDF) so that blockage of funds under different sub-heads is avoided, as it has been observed that fund utilization is happening from Central Pool of UDF only.
- 4. The Finance Committee also recommended that the transfer of funds from the UDF to GIA Heads - 'General' and 'Salaries' should be in line with the pattern of release of Grant-in-Aid by the GNCTD.

Agenda 44.10.2: To consider the proposal for settlement of unspent balance at the end of financial year 2020-21 under Major Head "2203 03 102 88 00 35 - Grants for Creation of Capital Assets"

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Finance Committee in its 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 29.05.2023 considered the proposal for settlement of unspent balance at the end of financial year 2020-21 under Major Head "2203 03 102 88 00 35 - Grants for Creation of Capital Assets".

The Finance Committee was apprised that the Directorate of Higher Education, vide its letter No.F.DHE.20(74)/AUD/GIA/2021-22/Pt. File/3752 dated 13.07.2022 (Appendix-3, Enclosure-2) and reminder letter No. F.DHE.20(74)/AUD/GIA/2021-22/Pt. File/4418 dated 23.08.2022 (Appendix-3, Enclosure-3) on the subject "Regarding refund of unspent balance pertaining to the financial year 2020-21 under Major Head 2203 03 102 88 00 35 - Grants for Creation of Capital Assets" directed the University to refund in financial year 2022-23, an amount of Rs. 42,76,06,115/- lying unspent with the University under the head "Creation of Capital Assets" at the end of financial year 2020-21.

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Finance Committee noted the break-up of unspent balance under the head - "Creation of Capital Assets" as on 31.03.2021 as per Utilization Certificate of the University for the Financial Year 2020-21 (Appendix-3, Enclosure-4), which is as follows:

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The Finance Committee noted that vide Notification F.No. DHE.20(70)/AUD/ 2020-21/1475 dated 14.06.2021 (Appendix-3, Enclosure-5) erstwhile Delhi Institute of Heritage Research and Management (DIHRM) was merged with Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi and all movable assets and liabilities including various funds, court cases etc. of DIHRM were merged with the University on "as is where is basis". As per Utilization Certificate of DIHRM for the financial year 2020-21 (Appendix-3, Enclosure-6), unspent balance under the head - Capital Assets as on 31.03.2021 was Rs.12,34,992/-.

In view of above, the unspent balance as on 31.03.2021, which could be refunded by the University during financial year 2022-23, is as follows:

The above mentioned amount has been refunded by way of Account Payee Cheque No. 758227 dated 24.03.2023 drawn in favour of "PAO-IX, Old Secretariat, Delhi 110 054" for depositing in the Government Account Head "Deduct refund" i.e. "2202 03 102 88 00 70".

While preparing annual accounts of the University and DIHRM for the financial year 2022-23, aforesaid amounts of Rs. 13,05,56,479/- and Rs. 12,34,992/- respectively, would be shown as Grant-in-Aid refunded to the Government of NCT of Delhi (GNCTD).

The aforesaid unadjusted advances amounting to Rs.29,70,49,636/- pertain to different works being executed by Public Works Department (PWD), New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) and BSES Rajdhani Power Ltd. The executing agencies have already incurred expenses against these advances for respective works which are at different stages of execution. In this regard, the University is pursuing with the executing agencies for completion of the works, settlement of work accounts and refund of unutilized advances, if any. As the GIA head – "Creation of Capital Assets" of the University has been discontinued w.e.f. 01.04.2021, settlement of these unadjusted advances can be done in following manner:

## Advance to PWD for construction of Dheerpur Campus of the University:

An advance of Rs.15.00 crore (@2% of initially estimated cost of Rs.750.00 crore) for undertaking preparatory work for construction of Dheerpur Campus of the University was approved by the Finance Department,

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GNCTD on 20.09.2017 and released to Public Works Department on 13.10.2017. Executive Engineer, Education Projects Division-2, PWD, vide letter No. 58(1)/Budget/EE/Education-2/PWD/2022-23/33 dated 21.02.2023 (Appendix-3, Enclosure-7), has intimated that Consultancy work for the above project has been awarded and so far expenditure of Rs.4.05 crore has been incurred for the project. Further it has been intimated that in view of committed liabilities it is not feasible to refund any amount at this stage. In this regard it may be noted that while "Major Head 2203 03 102 88 00 35 – Setting up of Ambedkar University - Grants for Creation of Capital Assets" under "Demand No. 6 – Education" has been discontinued w.e.f. financial year 2021-22, "Major Head 4201 01 203 89 00 72 – Construction of Ambedkar University Delhi (AUD) Campus – Dheerpur" has been introduced under "Demand No.11-Urban Development Public Works" and an amount of Rs.5.00 crore has been sanctioned under Budget Estimates (BE) 2023-24.

#### Therefore it was proposed that:

a) The "Major Head 2203 03 102 88 00 35 – Setting up of Ambedkar University - Grants for Creation of Capital Assets" under "Demand No. 6 – Education" may be reintroduced so that aforesaid outstanding advance may be settled by booking expenditure under this head as per utilization by PWD.

#### OR

b) The unadjusted advance of Rs.15.00 crore released by the University may be consolidated under the Demand No. 11 – Urban Development Public Works, Major Head "4201 01 203 89 00 72 – Construction of Ambedkar University Delhi (AUD) Campus – Dheerpur". Accordingly, the University may settle this outstanding advance of Rs.15.00 crore by showing this amount as Grant-in-Aid transferred to the Public Works Department. The Public Works Department may treat the outstanding advance of Rs.15.00 crore as Grant-in-Aid received from the GNCTD and take this into account while seeking grant from GNCTD under Revised Estimates (RE) 2023-24.

# 2. Advance to PWD for construction of Rohini Campus of the University:

An advance of Rs.12.00 crore (@2% of initially estimated cost of Rs. 600.00 crore) for undertaking preparatory work for construction of Rohini Campus of the University was approved by the Finance Department, GNCTD on 26.12.2017 and released to Public Works Department on 28.03.2018. Executive Engineer, Education Projects Division-2, PWD, vide letter No. 58(1)/Budget/EE/Education-2/PWD/2022-23/32 dated 21.02.2023

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(Appendix-3, Enclosure-8), has intimated that Consultancy work for the above project has been awarded and so far expenditure of Rs.2.68 crore has been incurred for the project. Further it has been intimated that in view of committed liabilities it is not feasible to refund any amount at this stage. In this regard it may be noted that while "Major Head 2203 03 102 88 00 35 – Setting up of Ambedkar University - Grants for Creation of Capital Assets" under "Demand No. 6 – Education" has been discontinued w.e.f. financial year 2021-22, "Major Head 4201 01 203 88 00 72 – Construction of Ambedkar University Delhi (AUD) Campus – Rohini" has been introduced under "Demand No.11-Urban Development Public Works" and an amount of Rs. 50.00 crore has been sanctioned under Budget Estimates (BE) 2023-24.

Therefore it was proposed that:

a) The "Major Head 2203 03 102 88 00 35 – Setting up of Ambedkar University - Grants for Creation of Capital Assets" under "Demand No. 6 – Education" may be reintroduced so that aforesaid outstanding advance may be settled by booking expenditure under this head as per utilization by PWD.

OR

b) The unadjusted advance of Rs. 12.00 crore released by the University may be consolidated under the Demand No. 11 – Urban Development Public Works, Major Head "4201 01 203 89 00 72 – Construction of Ambedkar University Delhi (AUD) Campus – Rohini". Accordingly, the University may settle this outstanding advance of Rs.12.00 crore by showing this amount as Grant-in-Aid transferred to the Public Works Department. The Public Works Department may treat the outstanding advance of Rs.12.00 crore as Grant-in-Aid received from the GNCTD and take this into account while seeking grant from GNCTD under Revised Estimates (RE) 2023-24.

#### 3. Other miscellaneous advances:

Rest of unadjusted advances amounting to Rs. 2,70,49,636/- pertaining to different works being executed by Public Works Department (PWD), New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) and BSES Rajdhani Power Ltd. may be transferred to GIA head – General of the University and expenditure may be booked under this head.

The proposal was submitted to the Finance Committee for consideration and recommendation to the Board of Management for consideration and approval. After approval of the Board of Management, the matter would be taken up with the Finance Department, GNCTD through the Directorate of Higher Education (DHE).

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After detailed deliberations, the Finance Committee recommended for consideration and approval by the Board of Management and submission of the same before the Finance Department, GNCTD as under:

- The outstanding advances to PWD for construction of campus at Dheerpur and Rohini may be consolidated under respective heads of demand no.11 – Urban Development Public Works and accordingly settlement may be done as proposed.
- The other miscellaneous advances may be transferred to the GIA head General of the University and expenditure may be booked under this head.

The recommendations of the Finance Committee were placed before the Board of Management for consideration.

Decision: After due deliberation, the Board considered and resolved to approve the following recommendations made by the Finance Committee in its 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 29.05.2023:

- The outstanding advances to PWD for construction of campus at Dheerpur and Rohini may be consolidated under respective heads of demand no.11 – Urban Development Public Works and accordingly settlement may be done as proposed.
- The other miscellaneous advances may be transferred to the GIA head – General of the University and expenditure may be booked under this head.

Agenda 44.10.3: To consider the proposal for providing free sanitary pads to the girl students at the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Finance Committee in its 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 29.05.2023 deliberated on the proposal for providing free sanitary pads to the girl students at the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi. After due deliberations, the Finance Committee did not recommend the proposal.

Decision: The Board of Management endorsed the recommendations of the Finance Committee and did not approve the proposal.

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Agenda 44.10.4: To consider the fund transfer of Rs.5.00 crores from the Central Pool of University Development Fund (UDF) to the 'GIA Head Salaries' and 'GIA Head General' respectively

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Finance Committee in its 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 29.05.2023 considered the fund transfer of Rs.5.00 crores from the Central Pool of University Development Fund (UDF) to the 'GIA Head Salaries' and 'GIA Head General'.

It was submitted that due to delay in release of the first installment of the Grant-in-Aid (GIA) for the financial year 2023-24, the University is facing difficulty in releasing the salary and meeting regular nature expenditure like electricity, water and telephone bills, etc. Accordingly, with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor, the following funds were transferred as a temporary measure to manage the situation:

April 2023 - Central Pool of UDF to the 'GIA Head Salaries'- Rs.2.50 crores

Central Pool of UDF to the 'GIA Head General'- Rs.1.00 crores

May 2023 - Central Pool of UDF to the 'GIA Head General'- Rs.1.50 crores It was noted that the funds will be returned back to the UDF from the 'GIA Head Salaries' and 'GIA Head General', once sufficient grant is received under the heads.

The decision of the Vice-Chancellor for transfer of funds was submitted to the Finance Committee for ratification. After due deliberations, the Finance Committee recommended the proposal for ratification by the Board of Management. Further, the Finance Committee also recommended that the transfer of funds from the UDF to GIA Heads — 'General' and 'Salaries' should be in line with the pattern of release of Grant-in-Aid by the GNCTD.

The recommendations of the Finance Committee were placed before the Board of Management for consideration.

Decision: After due deliberation, the Board considered and resolved to approve the recommendations made by the Finance Committee in its 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 29.05.2023 regarding the fund transfer of Rs.5.00 crores from the Central Pool of University Development Fund (UDF) to the 'GIA Head Salaries' and 'GIA Head General' respectively.

## Agenda 44.10.6: To consider the Guidelines for Student Travel Grant

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Finance Committee in its 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 29.05.2023 had considered the guidelines for the student travel grant scheme and noted that the scheme is applicable for providing financial assistance to the students of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi to participate in Seminar/Conference/ Workshop/ Paper and Poster Presentation.

## Eligibility:

- 1. All BA + MA (Group 1) and MPhil + PhD (Group 2) students of Dr.B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi are eligible to apply for the grant.
- 2. A travel grant under this fund will be made available to **Group 1** and **Group 2** as per the following norms:
- (a) For International travel only once during the student's term in a BA + MA degree programme or MPhil + PhD programme of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi;
- (b) Twice for national travel during the student's term for Group 2 students (MPhil + PhD); once for Group 1 students (BA+ MA).

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- 3. Grants will be given only if the student's academic work in the form of a paper or article (or an equivalent in the case of students of SCCE, SDes) has been accepted for presentation or poster presentation by an external organization of academic reputation. Grants under this fund may not be used for any other purpose.
- 4. The student must be active in research and/or must demonstrate innovative work in the subject area with a good academic record.
- 5. The scheme is applicable for participation in Seminar/Conference/Workshop/Paper and Poster Presentation.
- 6. The proposal for attending any Short Term/Long Term training course(s) within or outside the country shall not be considered under this scheme.

#### Procedure:

- 1) The student should apply to the Dean of the School through the Programme Coordinator at least 2 months in advance of the event in the prescribed form.
- 2) The request of the student shall be duly verified by the Programme Coordinator and the School Dean. If required, the Dean may seek advice on this 'subject experts' within Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi.
- 3) The Dean will forward the recommendation to the Committee operating within the office of Student Services for a final decision, subject to availability of funds.
- 4) The Students who will be given travel grant will have to submit a report to the Dean of School and those who will be availing travel grant for International visits will have to give a seminar after they return.

#### Financial Assistance:

The financial assistance under the Travel Grant shall be admissible on reimbursement basis as per the recommendations of the Standing Committee Student Travel Grant constituted by the Competent Authority.

The students are required to invariably adhere to the following instructions/guidelines, failing which their claims for reimbursements shall summarily be rejected:

- 1) Booking of tickets through any agency other than those mentioned above is not permissible.
- 2) While submitting the reimbursement claims of travel, the students are required to attach a printout of the rate chart of the air fare applicable on the date of journey taken from the official website at the time of booking of tickets.

#### Release of Travel Grant:

The applicant shall submit the claim for the expenditure incurred duly forwarded by the concerned Dean of the School along with copies of the following documents:

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- 1) Claim should be submitted to the Dean of School in the prescribed form. (Student Travel Grant Reimbursement Form)
- Statement of expenditure along with the copy of journey tickets (Original Boarding passes are required in case of travel by Air/Original Train tickets)
- 3) The Students who will be given travel grant will have to submit a report to the Dean of School and those who will be availing travel grant for International visits will have to give a seminar after they return.
- 4) Receipt of the Registration Fee in original issued by the Organizers
- 5) Voucher/Bank Certificate indicating the rate at which foreign currency is purchased, if applicable.
- 6) Certificate of attendance/participation issued by the organizers.

In case the claim for releasing of Travel Grant is not submitted in the prescribed format along with the aforesaid relevant documents duly attested by the Student/Faculty Supervisor/Dean, the grant will not be released. The sanctioned amount shall be reimbursed to the applicant through RTGS in the bank account of the student on receipt of all the required documents duly forwarded by the Dean of the School. All the documents should be submitted to the office of Dean of School within one month of the return journey.

The students should also submit details of their Bank Account No., Address of Bank, IFSC Code, a copy of passbook/cancelled cheque for transferring the sanctioned amount of grant.

The Finance Committee recommended the proposal for consideration and approval by the Board of Management.

The recommendations of the Finance Committee were placed before the Board of Management for consideration.

Decision: After due deliberation, the Board of Management considered and resolved to approve the recommendations made by the Finance Committee in its 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 29.05.2023 regarding the Guidelines for Student Travel Grant.

Agenda 44.10.7: To consider the revised policy of scholarship (w.e.f. Academic Year 2022-23)

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Finance Committee in its 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 29.05.2023 considered the revised policy of scholarship with effect from the Academic Year 2022-23. The Finance Committee noted that the Board of Management (BoM) in its 43rd meeting held on 20th January 2023 resolved to approve the fresh policy of scholarship to be awarded to student's w.e.f. Academic Year 2022-23.

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The revised policy is as below:

- A. 10% of the fee collected (Tuition Fee) from students in a programme during each semester be set aside for scholarship.
- B. Academic Merit Scholarships of Rs.8,000/- to Rs.14,000/- each to be awarded to students in terms of their performance in the semesters, provided that such students have obtained a minimum grade of A or above. Accordingly, the scholarship may be awarded as per table below:-

Grade Point	Scholarship Range
O (Outstanding)	Rs.12,000/- to Rs.14,000/-
A Plus (A+) (Excellent)	Rs.10,000/- to Rs.12,000/-
A (Very Good)	Rs.5,000/- to Rs.8,000/-

- C. Academic Progress Scholarships may be awarded to students who attain substantial progress in their additional effort and motivation. Scholarship of Rs.8,000/- each may be awarded to students who have made maximum progress compared to the previous semester by showing at least 'one grade progress', provided that they have obtained a minimum of B Plus (B+) as the cumulative grade points in the programme of study.
- D. Some programmes may experience difficulty in strictly following the proposed norms of awarding scholarship as per range detailed above either due to lack of sufficient funds or due to large number of students falling within the class in terms of their academic performance; the amount may be lowered as per the availability of funds.
- E. The scholarship norms 'be reviewed every five years'.

The matter was placed before the Finance Committee for consideration.

After due deliberations, the Finance Committee suggested the University to review the proposal.

The recommendations of the Finance Committee were placed before the Board of Management for information.

Decision: After due deliberation, the Board of Management endorsed the Finance Committee recommendation to "Review the Policy".

Agenda 44.10.8: To consider the contingency fund for non-net research scholars

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Finance Committee in its 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 29.05.2023 considered the proposal related to the contingency fund for non-net research scholars. The Finance Committee noted that Academic Council in its 3rdmeeting held on 10.12.2012 had considered the agenda of the Standing Committee of

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Research regarding Contingency Fund to research scholars with the subject "To consider the proposal to award stipends to MPhil/PhD students at par with the UGC scheme for Central Universities". In the meeting of 4th Academic Council held on 10.07.2013, the same was recorded. As the Academic Council had approved the contingency fund, the reimbursement is being paid to the research scholars.

However, as per noting of Finance Division in this matter "The minutes of 3rd Academic Council have been ratified in 13th Board of Management held on 11.02.2013. However, it was approved that the stipend be awarded to the non-net students at par with UGC scheme. In 27th Meeting of Board of Management, the stipend was increased to Rs.16,000/- and Rs.10,000/- which is at double the rates what UGC is awarding. Therefore, the proposal for the separate approval for payment of contingency was placed before the Finance Committee, as the rates of stipend are higher than what UGC is offering. Also there is no reference of contingency in the 27th meeting of Board of Management."

In view of the above, the matter was placed before the Finance Committee to adopt the contingency norms retrospectively issued by the UGC from time to time. After due deliberations, the Finance Committee recommended that the contingency to non-net research scholars may not be allowed.

The recommendations of the Finance Committee were placed before the Board of Management for consideration.

Decision: After due deliberations, the Board of Management considered and resolved to approve the recommendations made by the Finance Committee in its 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 29.05.2023 for not allowing the contingency fund to non-net research scholars.

## Agenda 44.10.9: To consider the Revision in Fee Structure of 2023-2024

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Finance Committee in its 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 29.05.2023 considered the revision in the fee structure of 2023-24. The Finance Committee noted that the second meeting of the Committee comprising of the following members was held on 24<sup>th</sup> May, 2023.

- 1. Dr Satyaketu Sankrit, Dean, Academic Affairs, Dr. B.R. AUD (Chairperson)
- 2. Dr Kartik Dave, Dean Planning, Dr. B.R. AUD
- 3. Dr. Santosh K. Singh, Dean, Student Services Dr. B.R. AUD
- Dr. Nitin Malik, Registrar, Dr. B.R. AUD
- 5. CMA Rajeev Talwar, Controller of Finance, DR. B.R. AUD
- 6. Mr. Ashish Patidar, Assistant Registrar Dr. B.R. AUD

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The above committee further deliberated on the revision of fee structure for the academic year 2023-24 and recommends an increase in application fee and tuition fees by 10% for the academic year 2023-2024. This increase of tuition fee in the academic year 2023-24 is recommended on the grounds that the tuition fees has not been enhanced for the two consecutive academic years (i.e. 2020-21 and 2021-22) due to outbreak of COVID-19 and considering the economic hardship faced by the students.

Accordingly, the committee decided to enhance the Application fees, tuition fees (UG, PG, & PhD) & dissertation fees (PhD) for academic year 2023-2024 as detailed below: -

a. Application fees to be enhanced by 10% for General/D-OBC(NCL) rounded off to nearest multiple of 50 & application fees for the EWS/SC/ST/PwBD candidates to be enhanced by 10% rounded off to nearest multiple of 25.

Further, in respect to the investments made in the private banks, the Finance Committee was also apprised that none of the above private banks have been debarred by the Government. The Reserve Bank of India vide O.M. No.R-23001/1/2021-GBA/CGA/243-292 dated 24.03.2021 has informed the decision of the Hon'ble FM that now there is no embargo on allocation of business to the Private Sector Banks and a level playing field for all banks may be ensured.

## Agenda 44.10.12 : To report about the efforts made towards Revenue Generation and Implementation of Economy Measure

It was submitted to the Board of Management that the Finance Committee in its 33<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 29.05.2023 noted that the Competent Authority on the basis of the proposal placed by the Finance Division had constituted a Committee to give recommendations regarding generation of internal resources, attaining the self-sufficiency and implementation of economy measures as per instructions of FD, GNCTD. A meeting of the Committee for Revenue Generation for self-sufficiency and implementation of economy measures in Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi was held on 21.03.2023 at 3.00 pm in the Room of Controller of Finance, Kashmere Gate Campus.

The committee members discussed the measures which can be adopted for revenue generation for self-sufficiency and implementation of economy measures. The committee gave following recommendations:

 Encouraging faculty to use their specialization to take consultancy services from other Universities/ organisations. The University may increase consultancy fee / overhead charges.

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- Overhead income through Sponsored Research Projects.
- Sharing of fee by collaborating with other educational institutes/ foreign collaboration for award of degree/ diploma/ certificate
- Psychometric workshops to analyses the psychology of students for the purpose of career options
- Start new short term courses, language courses for teaching Hindi to IAS/IPS/IFS, or other foreign language by engaging language teachers, etc.
- Short term sign language program/ interpreter's course
- Organisation of Heritage Walk in Delhi
- Organize conference for Government employees so as to guide them the basis processes of finance/ administration (PDP) / Training on GeM can be conducted
- Registration fee for workshops, programmes, Processing Fee
- Fee for participation in sports events organized by the University
- Opening of Sports Academy
- Fee for use of space and facilities by other organisations for conduct of exams, use of playground, renting of KPC Auditorium etc.
- Funds from International Organisations for conduct of International summer/ winter Schools
- Control of expenditure on advertisement by Publicity of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi programs by writing Letters to Principals of Government and Private School
- Arranging funds/ assets through Corporate Social Responsibility
- Savings on electricity and water bills through Installation of Solar Panels and Rain Water Harvesting in all the Campuses and discontinuing temporary electricity connection at Dheerpur and Rohini
- Savings by obtaining separate electricity and water connection for KG campus
- Developing of Course material and sale through setting up of Book Store

Apart from above, the Committee discussed the following measures related to fee enhancement, etc. However, the Committee recommended that the same may be referred to the Student Services and AES Division for consideration by an appropriate committee.

- Tuition fee and application fee received from students may be enhanced in comparison to the revenue cost per student.
- Levy of following charges on the students:
  - > Fee for entrance exam
  - > Fee for organizing Language Proficiency Test
  - Examination Fee
  - Fee for issue of Degree
  - > Fee for issue of transcripts

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- Fee for issue of various certificates
- Fee for issue of Identity Card
- Share of hostel fee being paid to IGDTUW
- Sale of Admission Prospectus
- Sale of Syllabus and old question papers
- > Fee for duplicate documents
- Sale of University's course material to students and to other organizations

The committee recommended the above measures for attaining self-sufficiency so that ranking of the University improves in NAAC and NIRF. A Circular dated 09.05.2023 has been issued to all the concerned by the Registrar requesting for the proposal on the matter.

The above was submitted for information of the Finance Committee.

After due deliberations, the Finance Committee noted the information. The Finance Committee also advised the University to explore the formation of a Section 8 company specifically for the purpose of fund raising so as to create an endowment fund. The Finance Committee also advised the University to consider introduction of a 24-credit course (minor) in Social Work/ Information Technology/ Content Development, etc. to have an impact on the life of students and to enhance their skills and employability.

The recommendations of the Finance Committee were placed before the Board of Management for information.

Now, in response to the main tender, as the work has been awarded to M/s SPS Infrabuild Pvt. Ltd. at their tendered amount of Rs.17,29,04,589/-, an amount of Rs.3,58,56,600/-(33.33% of tendered amount – 10% of the preliminary estimates already released) on the basis of work awarded has been released on 16.05.2023 to the PWD from the University Development Fund. Additional advance would be released upon award of work for other allied items.

The Finance Committee noted the information. Consultant, Campus Development updated the status of the construction to the Finance Committee. "Any test prescribed by the treating doctor should be undertaken at recognized empanelled hospitals or diagnostic centers only. Copy reports of the tests undertaken are required to be attached while submitting the bill for reimbursement."

In this connection it is submitted that despite good efforts, very few Diagnostic Labs and Radiology Centre are empanelled with Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi for providing lab/ radiology test on DGEHS rates. The locations of diagnostic lab/ radiology centre, so empanelled, are also sporadic and not available across Delhi/ NCR except Dr Lal Pathlabs which has no radiology testing facility at DGEHS rate.

Considering the difficulties being faced by the beneficiary employees of the University in Diagnostic/Radiology test only with University empanelled lab/centre, once the test as prescribed by the treating doctor, it is proposed that the beneficiary employees may be allowed the prescribed test at DGEHS/CGHS empanelled diagnostic lab/Radiology centre as well, and the reimbursement may be restricted to DGEHS rate only. The proposal was moved and after the concurrence from the fin representative, GNCTD posted with the University and the same has been approved by the Competent Authority.

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The clause 04(XIII) of AUD MAT Regulation, 2016 after amendment if approved by the BoM

"Any test prescribed by the treating doctor should be undertaken at recognized DGEHS/CGHS/ University empanelled Diagnostic Labs/Radiology Centre/ Hospitals. The celling rate of the reimbursement for such tests shall be as prescribed under DGEHS only. Copy of the reports of the tests undertaken is required to be attached while submitting the bill for reimbursement by the claimant."

The matter *inter-alia* the proposed amendment in the clause 04(XIII) of the AUD MAT 2016 was placed before the Board of Management for ratification.

Decision: The Board of Management ratified the decision taken by the Vice Chancellor in approving the amendment in Clause 04(XIII) of AUD MAT Regulation, 2016.

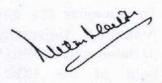

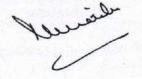

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- (4) The Vice-Chancellor shall have all the powers necessary for the proper maintenance of discipline in the University and he may delegate any such powers to such person or persons as he deems fit.

Provided that the Pro-Vice-Chancellor whose term of office has expired shall be eligible for re-appointment:

Provided further that, in any case, the Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall retire on attaining the age of seventy years:

Provided also that the Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall, while discharging the duties of the Vice-Chancellor under clause (7) of Statute 2, continue in office, notwithstanding the expiration of his term of office as Pro-Vice-Chancellor, until the Vice-Chancellor resumes office or a new Vice-Chancellor assumes office, as the case may be.

- (3) The empluments and other terms and conditions of service of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall be such as may be prescribed by the Ordinances.
- (4) The Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall assist the Vice-Chancellor in respect of such matters as may be specified by the Vice-Chancellor in this behalf, from time to time, and shall also exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be assigned or delegated to him by the Vice-Chancellor.

Deans of Schools. 5. (1) Every Dean of School shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor from amongst the Professors in the School by rotation in the order of seniority for a period of three years:

Provided that in case there is only one Professor or no Professor in a School, the Dean shall be appointed, for the time being, from amongst the Professor, if any, and the Associate Professors in the School by rotation in the order of seniority:

Provided further that a Dean on attaining the age of sixty-five years shall cease to hold office as such.

- (2) When the office of the Dean is vacant or when the Dean is, by reason of illness, absence or any other cause, unable to perform duties of his office, the duties of the office shall be performed by the senior-most Professor or Associate Professor, as the case may be, in the School.
- (3) The Dean shall be the Head of the School and shall be responsible for the conduct and maintenance of the standards of teaching and research in the School and shall have such other functions as may be prescribed by the Ordinances.
- (4) The Dean shall have the right to be present and to speak at any meeting of the Boards of Studies or Committees of the School, as the case may be, but shall not have the right to vote thereat unless he is a member thereof.

- (3) On the expiry of the term of his office the Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall be eligible for re-appointment
- (4) A person appointed as Pro-Vice-Chancellor under Clause (2) or (3) of this Statute shall retire from office, if, during the term of his office or any extension thereof, he completes the age of 65 years.
- (5) Subject to the control and supervision of the Vice-Chancellor, the Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall perform such duties and exercise such functions and powers as the Vice-Chancellor may specify generally or in individual cases and shall assist the Vice-Chancellor on all matters academic and administrative.

- (7) If the office of the Vice-Chancellor becomes vacant due to death, resignation or otherwise, or if he is unable to perform his duties due to ill health or any other reason, the senior-most Pro Vice-Chancellor shall perform the duties of the Vice-Chancellor, and if there is no Pro Vice-Chancellor, the senior-most Dean shall perform the functions of the Vice-Chancellor until the new Vice-Chancellor assumes office or until the existing Vice-Chancellor resumes the duties of his office, as the case may be.
- 4. Powers and functions of the Vice-Chancellor.— (1) (a) The Vice-Chancellor shall be ex-officio Chairman of the Board of Management, the Academic Council, the Planning Board and the Finance Committee.
- (b) The Vice-Chancellor shall chair the meetings of the Court, in case Chancellor is unable to do so.
- (2) The Vice-Chancellor shall be entitled to be present at, and address, any meeting of any other authority or any other body of the University but shall not be entitled to vote thereat unless he/she is a member of such authority or body.
- (3) It shall be the duty of the Vice-Chancellor to see that the Act, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the Regulations are duly observed and he shall have all the powers necessary to ensure such observance.
- (4) The Vice-Chancellor shall exercise control over the affairs of the University and shall give effect to the decisions of all the authorities of the University.
- (5) The Vice-Chancellor shall have all the powers necessary for the proper maintenance of discipline in the University and he may delegate any such power to such officer or officers as he may deem fit.
- (6) The Vice-Chancellor shall be empowered to grant leave to any officer of the University and make necessary arrangements for the discharge of the functions of such officer during his absence.
- (7) The Vice-Chancellor shall grant leave of absence to any employee of the University in accordance with the rules and, if he so decides, may delegate such power to another officer of the University.

- (8) The Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to convene or cause to be convened the meeting of the Court, with the approval of Chancellor, and the meetings of the Board of Management, the Academic Council, the Planning Board and the Finance Committee.
- (9) The Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to make short-term appointments, with the approval of the Board of Management, for a period not exceeding six months, of such persons as he may consider necessary for the functioning of the University.
- 5. The Pro Vice-Chancellors.—(1) Every Pro Vice-Chancellor shall be appointed by the Board of Management on the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor:

Provided that if the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor is not accepted by the Board of Management, the matter shall be referred to the Chancellor who may either appoint the person recommended by the Vice-Chancellor or request the Vice-Chancellor to recommend another person for consideration of the Board of Management.

(2) The term of office of a Pro Vice-Chancellor shall be three years or until the expiration of the term of office of the Vice-Chancellor, whichever is earlier, and he/she shall be eligible for reappointment:

Provided that a Pro Vice-Chancellor shall retire on attaining the age of sixty five years:

Provided further that a Pro Vice-Chancellor shall, while performing the functions of the Vice-Chancellor under clause 3(B) sub clause 7 of Statute, continue in office notwithstanding the expiration of his term of office as Pro Vice-Chancellor until a new Vice-Chancellor assumes office or until the existing Vice-Chancellor resumes his duties, as the case may be.

- (3) (a) The salary of a Pro Vice-Chancellor shall be as decided by the Board of Management with the approval of the Chancellor.
- (b) Every Pro Vice-Chancellor shall be entitled, without payment of rent, to the use of a furnished residence throughout his term of office and no charge shall fall on the Pro-Vice-Chancellor personally in respect of maintenance of such residence.
- (c) In addition to the salary specified in sub-clause (a), a Pro Vice-Chancellor shall be entitled to such leave, benefits and other allowances as are admissible to the employees of the University from time to time.
- (d) Every Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall be entitled to such terminal benefits as may be fixed by the Board of Management from time to time.
- (e) Every Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall be entitled to subscribe to the contributory provident fund of the University till the end of his tenure:

Provided that where an employee of the University or a college or of any other university or institution maintained by or affiliated to such other university is appointed as Pro Vice-Chancellor, he shall continue to be

The Pro 5. (1) Vice-Chancellors.

Every Pro Vice-Chancellor shall be appointed by the Board of Management on the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor:

Provided further that a Pro Vice-Chancellor shall, while performing the functions of the Vice-Chancellor under clause (8) of Statute 3, continue in office notwithstanding the expiration of his term of office as Pro Vice-Chancellor until a new Vice-Chancellor assumes office or until the existing Vice-Chancellor resumes his duties, as the case may be.

(3) (a) The salary of a Pro Vice-Chancellor shall be as decided by the Board of Management with the approval of the Chancellor.

- (b) Every Pro Vice-Chancellor shall be entitled, without payment of rent, to the use of a furnished residence throughout his term of office and no charge shall fall on the Pro-Vice-Chancellor personally in respect of maintenance of such residence.
- (c) In addition to the salary specified in subclause(a), a Pro Vice-Chancellor shall be entitled to such leave, benefits and other allowances as are admissible to the employees of the University from time to time.
- (d) Every Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall be entitled to such terminal benefits as may be fixed by the Board of Management from time to time.
- (e) Every Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall be entitled to subscribe to the contributory provident fund of the University till the end of his tenure:

Provided that where an employee of the University or a college or an institution or of any other university or institution maintained by or affiliated to such other university is appointed as Pro Vice-Chancellor, he shall continue to be governed by the same retirement benefit scheme to which he was entitled prior to his appointment as Pro Vice-Chancellor till he continues to hold his lien on that post but under this provision, the pay for the purpose of subscription to the General Provident Fund or subscription to the University Contributory Fund shall be the pay drawn by him as Pro-Vice-Chancellor.

(f) Every Pro Vice-Chancellor shall assist the Vice-Chancellor in respect of such matters as may be specified by the Vice-Chancellor in this behalf from time to time and shall also exercise such powers and perform such functions as may be delegated to him by the Vice-Chancellor. Government rules/norms, and subject to such stipulations as may be made by the Board of Management, from time to time:

- (11) The Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to employ technicians, workmen and administrative and management staff reporting to the academicians paid from contingencies involving emoluments not exceeding the approved rates of the Government, and the said staff should only be engaged against the vacant sanctioned posts;
- (12) The Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to send members of the staff for training or for a course of instruction or to attend any conference or symposium or workshop within India or abroad and pay the registration fees and sanction expenditure of the concerned staff:

Provided that his own travel outside India for any of the above purposes/ official duty would have to be sanctioned by the Chancellor before the journey:

Provided that Vice Chancellor can approve his own travels within India for the same purposes.

- (13) The Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to sanction remission or reduction of rents for buildings rendered wholly or partially unsuitable on the recommendation of the Finance committee;
- (14) The Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to sanction temporary allocation of any building for any purpose other than that for which it was constructed; but in any case it will not be for commercial use;
- (15) The Vice-Chancellor may, at his discretion, constitute such Committees as he may consider appropriate;
- (16) In emergent cases, the Vice-Chancellor may exercise all the powers of the Board of management, Senate and Finance Committee and put up in the respective Bodies of the action taken in the next meeting:

Provided that if authority concerned is of the opinion that such action ought not to have been taken, it may refer the matter to the Chancellor, whose decision thereon shall be final:

Provided that any person in the service of the University who is aggrieved by this action taken by the Vice-Chancellor under this sub-section shall, have the right to appeal against such action to the Board of Management within sixty days from the date on which such action is communicated to him and thereupon the Board of Management may, confirm, modify or reverse the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor.

- (17) The Vice-Chancellor shall exercise such other powers and perform such other functions as may be prescribed by the Statutes and the Ordinances;
- 14. Pro Vice-Chancellors of the University- (1) Every Pro Vice-Chancellor shall be appointed by Board of Management (BOM) in such manner, on such emoluments and other conditions of service, and shall exercise such powers and perform such functions, as may be prescribed.
- (2) The Pro Vice-Chancellors shall perform such duties and exercise such functions and powers as the Vice-Chancellor may specify generally or in individual cases and shall assist the Vice-Chancellor on academic and administrative matters;
- (3) The term of the Pro Vice-Chancellors shall be co-terminus with the term of Vice-Chancellor.
  - 15. The Deans- Every Dean shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor in such manner, and shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be prescribed.

Agenda 33.3: To consider the proposal for dealing with fund crunch situations anticipated due to insufficient grant sanctioned under Budget Estimates (BE) for the financial year 2023-24 and mismatch between pattern of grant release and actual fund requirements of the University.

The comparative position of Budget Estimates (BE) for the financial year 2023-24, as recommended by the Finance Committee (FC) in its 31<sup>st</sup> meeting held on 17.10.2022 & approved by the Board of Management (BOM) in its 42<sup>nd</sup> meeting held on 23.12.2022, as sanctioned by Government of NCT of Delhi (GNCTD) and grant released so far is as tabulated below:

It may be noted that the BE sanctioned by the GNCTD is on much lower side as compared with the BE recommended by the FC & approved by the BOM, and grossly insufficient in case of GIA head – General. Further it may be noted that the Government would be releasing grant in equal instalments on quarterly basis but in case of GIA head – General, bulk of expenditure is to be incurred during first two quarters of the financial year as infrastructure augmentation including essential repairs/ renovations need to be done before commencement of forthcoming academic session 2023-24. Due to this temporary fund crunch, situations are anticipated and therefore in order to deal with the same, the following proposal was submitted for consideration by the Finance Committee:

- 1. The University may demand sufficient funds under Revised Estimates (RE) for the financial year 2023-24.
- 2. The Vice Chancellor may be authorized to approve transfer of funds from Central Pool of University Development Fund (UDF) to GIA heads General and Salaries on need basis and recoup UDF upon receipt of sufficient grants from GNCTD. Such transactions shall be reported to the Finance Committee and the Board of Management.
- 3. The following four sub-heads of UDF (a) Student Travel and Exchange Programme Fund, (b) Academic Chairs Fund, (c) Research Endowment Fund and (d) Central Pool may be merged to create a single fund, namely University Development Fund (UDF) so that blockage of funds under different sub-heads is avoided, as it has been observed that fund utilization is happening from Central Pool of UDF only.

Decision: After due deliberation, the Finance Committee recommended the proposal for consideration and approval by the Board of Management. Further, the FC also recommended that the transfer of funds from the UDF to GIA Heads – 'General' and 'Salaries' should be in line with the pattern of release of Grant-in-Aid by the GNCTD.

Agenda 33.4: To consider the proposal for settlement of unspent balance at the end of financial year 2020-21 under Major Head "2203 03 102 88 00 35 – Grants for Creation of Capital Assets".

The Directorate of Higher Education, vide its letter No.F.DHE.20(74)/AUD/GIA/2021-22/Pt. File/3752 dated 13.07.2022 (Appendix-2, Page No-34) and reminder letter No. F.DHE.20(74)/AUD/GIA/2021-22/Pt. File/4418 dated 23.08.2022 (Appendix-3, Page No-35) on the subject "Regarding refund of unspent balance pertaining to the financial year 2020-21 under Major Head 2203 03 102 88 00 35 — Grants for Creation of Capital Assets" directed the University to refund in financial year 2022-23, an amount of Rs. 42,76,06,115/lying unspent with the University under the head "Creation of Capital Assets" at the end of financial year 2020-21.

Further, vide Notification F.No. DHE.20(70)/AUD/ 2020-21/1475 dated 14.06.2021 (Appendix-5, Page No-37) erstwhile Delhi Institute of Heritage Research and Management (DIHRM) was merged with Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi and all movable assets and liabilities including various funds, court cases etc. of DIHRM were merged with the University on "as is where is basis". As per Utilization Certificate of DIHRM for the financial year 2020-21 (Appendix-6, Page No-39), unspent balance under the head - Capital Assets as on 31.03.2021 was Rs. 12,34,992/-.

In view of above, the unspent balance as on 31.03.2021, which could be refunded by the University during financial year 2022-23, is as follows:

The same has been refunded by way of Account Payee Cheque no. 758227 dated 24.03.2023 drawn in favour of "PAO-IX, Old Secretariat, Delhi-110054" for depositing in the Government Account Head "Deduct refund" i.e. "2202 03 102 88 00 70".

While preparing annual accounts of the University and DIHRM for the financial year 2022-23, aforesaid amounts of Rs. 13,05,56,479/- and Rs. 12,34,992/- respectively, would be shown as Grant-in-Aid refunded to the Government of NCT of Delhi (GNCTD).

Aforesaid unadjusted advances amounting to Rs. 29,70,49,636/- pertain to different works being executed by Public Works Department (PWD), New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) and BSES Rajdhani Power Ltd. The executing agencies have already incurred expenses against these advances for respective works which are at different stages of execution. In this regard, the University is pursuing with the executing agencies for completion of the works, settlement of work accounts and refund of unutilized advances, if any. As the GIA head — "Creation of Capital Assets" of the University has been discontinued w.e.f. 01.04.2021, therefore settlement these unadjusted advances can be done in following manner:

# 1. Advance to PWD for construction of Dheerpur Campus of the University:

An advance of Rs. 15.00 crore (@2% of initially estimated cost of Rs. 750.00 crore) for undertaking preparatory work for construction of Dheerpur Campus of the University was approved by the Finance Department, GNCTD on 20.09.2017 and released to Public Works Department on 13.10.2017. Executive Engineer, Education Projects Division-2, PWD, vide letter No. 58(1)/Budget/EE/Education-2/PWD/2022-23/33 dated 21.02.2023

In this regard it may be noted that while "Major Head 2203 03 102 88 00 35 — Setting up of Ambedkar University - Grants for Creation of Capital Assets" under "Demand No. 6 — Education" has been discontinued w.e.f. financial year 2021-22, "Major Head 4201 01 203 89 00 72 — Construction of Ambedkar University Delhi (AUD) Campus — Dheerpur" has been introduced under "Demand No. 11 — Urban Development Public Works" and an amount of Rs. 5.00 crore has been sanctioned under Budget Estimates (BE) 2023-24.

Therefore it is proposed that:

- a) The "Major Head 2203 03 102 88 00 35 Setting up of Ambedkar University Grants for Creation of Capital Assets" under "Demand No. 6 Education" may be reintroduced so that aforesaid outstanding advance may be settled by booking expenditure under this head as per utilization by PWD.

- b) The unadjusted advance of Rs. 15.00 crore released by the University may be consolidated under the Demand No. 11 Urban Development Public Works, Major Head "4201 01 203 89 00 72 Construction of Ambedkar University Delhi (AUD) Campus Dheerpur". # 2. Advance to PWD for construction of Rohini Campus of the University:

An advance of Rs. 12.00 crore (@2% of initially estimated cost of Rs. 600.00 crore) for undertaking preparatory work for construction of Rohini Campus of the University was approved by the Finance Department, GNCTD on 26.12.2017 and released to Public Works Department on 28.03.2018. Executive Engineer, Education Projects Division-2, PWD, vide letter No. 58(1)/Budget/EE/Education-2/PWD/2022-23/32 dated 21.02.2023 (Appendix-8, Page No-41), has intimated that Consultancy work for the above project has been awarded and so far expenditure of Rs. 2.68 crore has been incurred for the project. Further it has been intimated that in view of committed liabilities it is not feasible to refund any amount at this stage. In this regard it may be noted that while "Major Head 2203 03 102 88 00 35 – Setting up of Ambedkar University - Grants for Creation of Capital Assets" under "Demand No. 6 – Education" has been discontinued w.e.f. financial year 2021-22, "Major Head 4201 01 203 88 00 72 – Construction of Ambedkar University Delhi (AUD) Campus – Rohini" has been introduced under "Demand No. 11 – Urban Development Public Works" and an amount of Rs. 50.00 crore has been sanctioned under Budget Estimates (BE) 2023-24.

Therefore it is proposed that:

- a) The "Major Head 2203 03 102 88 00 35 Setting up of Ambedkar University Grants for Creation of Capital Assets" under "Demand No. 6 Education" may be reintroduced so that aforesaid outstanding advance may be settled by booking expenditure under this head as per utilization by PWD.
- b) The unadjusted advance of Rs. 12.00 crore released by the University may be consolidated under the Demand No. 11 Urban Development Public Works, Major Head "4201 01 203 89 00 72 Construction of Ambedkar University Delhi (AUD) Campus Rohini". Accordingly, the University may settle this outstanding advance of Rs. 12.00 crore by showing this amount as Grant-in-Aid transferred to the Public Works Department. The Public Works Department may treat the outstanding advance of Rs. 12.00 crore as Grant-in-Aid received from the GNCTD and take this into account while seeking grant from GNCTD under Revised Estimates (RE) 2023-24.

### 3. Other miscellaneous advances:

OR

Rest of unadjusted advances amounting to Rs. 2,70,49,636/- pertaining to different works being executed by Public Works Department (PWD), New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) and BSES Rajdhani Power Ltd. may be transferred to GIA head – General of the University and expenditure may be booked under this head.

The proposal was submitted to the Finance Committee for consideration and recommendation to the Board of Management for consideration and approval. After approval of the Board of Management, the matter would be taken up with the Finance Department, GNCTD through the Directorate of Higher Education (DHE).

Decision: After detailed deliberations, the Finance Committee recommended for consideration and approval by the Board of Management and submission of the same before the Finance Department, GNCTD as under:

- The outstanding advances to PWD for construction of campus at Dheerpur and Rohini may be consolidated under respective heads of demand no.11 – Urban Development Public Works and accordingly settlement may be done as proposed.
- 2. The other miscellaneous advances may be transferred to the GIA head General of the University and expenditure may be booked under this head.

Agenda 30.5: To consider the proposal for providing free sanitary pads to the girl students at the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi.

#### Background:

The University Environment Management Committee (EMC), considering the good number of female students and also in order to minimize the hazards caused due to lack of proper disposal of used sanitary pads, initiated the proposal for installation of Sanitary Napkin vending machine and incinerator at appropriate locations on the University campus(es) primarily in the female washrooms in the year 2016-17.

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- 2. The replenishment of the Sanitary pads to the Vending Machines has been carrying out by the University and the users were availing the facility on inserting 05 Rupee coin at each time from these installed sanitary pad vending machine. The procurement cost of one sanitary pad is Rs. 4.85 only (Based on the last procurement rate). This means that no extra financial recurring burden was on the University budget on account of procurement of the sanitary pads for replenishments to the sanitary pad vending machine.
- 3. The girl's student of the University has now been demanding free sanitary pads and when opinion sought from the finance representative of GNCTD posted at University, he has opined that any such proposal having financial implications out of GIA, not included in the passed/ proposed budget of the University must have the prior concurrence and approval from the GNCTD.

#### Action taken till date by the University:

Considering the demand of the students for providing free sanitary pads to the girl students of the University, the following proposal was prepared for perusal of the finance representative, GNCTD, posted with the University who had advised that if the expenditure is out of GIA, prior approval of GNCTD is required. Accordingly, in view of the opinion of finance representative the following proposal was sent to GNCTD for consideration and approval:

- 2. Simultaneously the Universities located at Delhi were also requested to provide their policy regarding free sanitary pads and the following response were received:
  - (a) Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University (A state University) vide their letter No. F.GGSIPU/SS/1581 dated 28.04.2023: Sanitary pads are not being provide free of cost to the girl students in the University. (Appendix-9, Page-42)
  - (b) Jamia Milia Islamia ( A Central University) vide their letter F.No. C&O-3(20)/RO/2023 dated 12 April 2023: No guidelines for providing free sanitary pads to the University. (Appendix-10, Page-43)

#### Communication received from Directorate of Higher Education (DHE):

The Directorate of Higher Education (DHE) vide letter No. DHE 20(82)/AUD/Misc/2022-23/1950 dated 29.03.2023 (Appendix-11, Page-45) directed that the matter may be taken up by the University at their level only.

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Minutes of the 33rd Finance Committee Meeting held on 29th May 2023.

In view of the reply of the Directorate of Higher Education and to take lead in the matter, the proposal for providing sanitary pads to the girl students at the University with financial implication of Rs.8.94 lakh one time (including recurring expenditure of Rs.4.80 lakh and Rs.4.14 lakh for purchase of vending machines and receptacle) from the Grant-in-Aid Head – General was submitted for consideration before the finance committee.

Decision: After due deliberations, the Finance Committee did not recommend the proposal for providing sanitary pads free of cost as it was agreed that the price charged from the students is a very nominal amount.

Agenda 33.6: To ratify the decision taken by the Vice-Chancellor regarding fund transfer of Rs.5.00 crores from the Central Pool of University Development Fund (UDF) to the 'GIA Head Salaries' and 'GIA Head General' respectively.

Due to delay in release of the first instalment of the Grant-in-Aid (GIA) for the financial year 2023-24, the University is facing difficulty in releasing the salary and meeting regular nature expenditure like electricity, water and telephone bills, etc. Accordingly, with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor, the following funds were transferred as a temporary measure to manage the situation:

April 2023 - Central Pool of UDF to the 'GIA Head Salaries'- Rs.2.50 crores

Central Pool of UDF to the 'GIA Head General'- Rs.1.00 crores

May 2023 - Central Pool of UDF to the 'GIA Head General'- Rs.1.50 crores.

The funds will be returned back to the UDF from the 'GIA Head Salaries' and 'GIA Head General', once sufficient grant is received under the heads

The decision of the Vice-Chancellor was submitted to the Finance Committee for ratification.

Decision: After due deliberations, the Finance Committee recommended the proposal for ratification by the Board of Management. Further, the FC also recommended that the transfer of funds from the UDF to GIA Heads – 'General' and 'Salaries' should be in line with the pattern of release of Grant-in-Aid by the GNCTD.

Agenda 33.7: To report the progress made in laying of Annual Accounts of the University and Separate Audit Report before the Legislative Assembly of the GNCTD.

After laying of Annual Accounts before the State Legislature for the Financial Year 2008-09 to 2016-17 as informed to the Finance Committee in its 30<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 29<sup>th</sup> July 2022, the University forwarded the Annual Accounts along with Separate Audit Report from CAG for the year 2017-18 to 2019-20 to the Directorate of Higher Education on 11.01.2023 and the same were laid before the Delhi Legislative Assembly on 24.03.2023 as per the Revised List of Business at point 3.

The status of rest of the Annual Accounts is as under:

 For the Financial Year 2020-21: The translated version of the Annual Accounts and SAR for the Financial Year 2020-21 have been received and are being proof read. It will be submitted for laying before the Delhi Legislative Assembly very soon.

2. For the Financial Year 2021-22: In respect to the Annual Accounts for the Financial Year 2021-22, the Finance Division has submitted its reply to the draft Separate Audit Report (SAR). The final SAR is awaited from CAG.

The proposal was submitted for the information of the Finance Committee.

Decision: The Finance Committee noted the information with appreciation for the efforts made by the Finance team.

# Agenda 33.8: To report about the investments made on the recommendations of the Investment Committee meeting held on 24.03.2023.

A meeting of the investment committee was held on 24.03.2023. On the recommendations of the Committee, the Fixed Deposits were opened in various Banks at the maximum rate and the interest to be fetched during the Financial Year 2023-24 and 2024-25 as under is Rs. 4,16,52,732/- (Rupees Four Crores Sixteen Lakh Fifty-Two Thousand Seven

The efforts of the Investment Committee are appreciable as the University is earning more than Rs.5 crores interest through FDs.

Decision: After due deliberations, the Finance Committee noted the investments made by the University in scheduled commercial banks. Further, in respect to the investments made in the private banks, the Finance Committee was also apprised that none of the above private banks have been debarred by the Government. The Reserve Bank of India vide O.M. No.R-23001/1/2021-GBA/CGA/243-292 dated 24.03.2021 has informed the decision of the Hon'ble FM that now there is no embargo on allocation of business to the Private Sector Banks and a level playing field for all banks may be ensured.

Agenda 33.9: To report about the efforts made towards Revenue Generation and Implementation of Economy Measure.

On the proposal of the Finance Division, the Competent Authority had constituted a Committee to give recommendations regarding generation of internal resources, attaining the self-sufficiency and implementation of economy measures as per instructions of FD, GNCTD. A meeting of the Committee for Revenue Generation for self-sufficiency and implementation of economy measures in Dr. B.R. Ambekar University Delhi was held on 21.03.2023 at 3.00 pm in the Room of Controller of Finance, Kashmere Gate Campus.

The committee members discussed the measures which can be adopted for revenue generation for self-sufficiency and implementation of economy measures. The committee gave following recommendations:

- Encouraging faculty to use their specialization to take consultancy services from other Universities/ organisations. The University may increase consultancy fee / overhead charges.
- Overhead income through Sponsored Research Projects.
- Sharing of fee by collaborating with other educational institutes/ foreign collaboration for award of degree/ diploma/ certificate
- Psychometric workshops to analyses the psychology of students for the purpose of career options

- Start new short term courses, language courses for teaching Hindi to IAS/IPS/IFS, or other foreign language by engaging language teachers, etc.
- · Short term sign language program/ interpreter's course
- Organisation of Heritage Walk in Delhi
- Organize conference for Government employees so as to guide them the basis processes of finance/ administration (PDP) / Training on GeM can be conducted
- · Registration fee for workshops, programmes, Processing Fee
- · Fee for participation in sports events organized by the University
- Opening of Sports Academy
- Fee for use of space and facilities by other organisations for conduct of exams, use of playground, renting of KPC Auditorium etc.
- Funds from International Organisations for conduct of International summer/ winter Schools
- Control of expenditure on advertisement by Publicity of AUD programs by writing Letters to Principals of Government and Private School
- Arranging funds/ assets through Corporate Social Responsibility
- Savings on electricity and water bills through Installation of Solar Panels and Rain Water Harvesting in all the Campuses and discontinuing temporary electricity connection at Dheerpur and Rohoni
- · Savings by obtaining separate electricity and water connection for KG campus
- Developing of Course material and sale through setting up of Book Store

Apart from above, the Committee discussed the following measures related to fee enhancement, etc. However, the Committee recommended that the same may be referred to the Student Services and AES Division for consideration by an appropriate committee.

- Tuition fee and application fee received from students may be enhanced in comparison to the revenue cost per student.
- Levy of following charges on the students:
  - > Fee for entrance exam
  - ➤ Fee for organizing Language Proficiency Test
  - > Examination Fee
  - > Fee for issue of Degree
  - > Fee for issue of transcripts
  - > Fee for issue of various certificates
  - > Fee for issue of Identity Card
  - ➤ Share of hostel fee being paid to IGDTUW
  - Sale of Admission Prospectus
  - > Sale of Syllabus and old question papers
  - > Fee for duplicate documents
  - Sale of University's course material to students and to other organizations

The committee recommended the above measures for attaining self-sufficiency so that ranking of the University improves in NAAC and NIRF. A Circular dated 09.05.2023 has been issued to all the concerned by the Registrar requesting for the proposal on the matter.

The above was submitted for information of the Finance Committee.

Decision: After due deliberations, the Finance Committee noted the information. The Finance Committee also advised the University to explore the formation of a Section 8 company specifically for the purpose of fund raising so as to create an endowment fund. The Finance Committee also advised the University to consider introduction of a 24-credit course (minor) in Social Work/ Information Technology/ Content Development, etc. to have an impact on the life of students and to enhance their skills and employability.

Agenda 33.10: To report the progress made in respect to the construction of Semi
-Permanent Structure (SPS) (4 Storey) by PWD for additional Class
rooms at Karampura campus from the University Development Fund.

On the recommendations of the 32<sup>nd</sup> meeting of the Finance Committee held on 23.12.2022, the Board of Management in its 42<sup>nd</sup> meeting held on 23.12.2022 approved the revised estimates of Rs.21.78 crores submitted by the PWD for construction of new Semi-Permanent Structure (SPS) (4 Storey) by PWD for additional Class rooms at Karampura campus. The University released an amount of Rs.2,17,78,263/- to PWD i.e. 10% of the total estimates, as per the CPWD Manual. Now, in response to the main tender, as the work has been awarded to M/s SPS Infrabuild Pvt. Ltd. at their tendered amount of Rs.17,29,04,589/-, an amount of Rs.3,58,56,600/- (33.33% of tendered amount – 10% of the preliminary estimates already released) on the basis of work awarded has been released on 16.05.2023 to the PWD from the University Development Fund. Additional advance would be released upon award of work for other allied items.

The above was submitted for the information of the Finance Committee.

Decision: The Finance Committee noted the information. Consultant, Campus Development updated the status of the construction to the Finance Committee. It was further apprised that to proportionate with the approved new programmes by the Academic Council and Board of Management of the University, some parts of the Barracks received as is where is basis from Deen Dayal Upadhyay College is being resurrected and some parts are being used as it is.

## **TABLED ITEMS**

Agenda No.33.11: To consider the revision in pay of the employees, whose offer of appointment under one-time absorption / regularization has been cancelled and placed on status quo ante.

It was submitted to the Finance Committee that Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi has engaged non-teaching staff on Regular, Contract and Outsource basis. Under the category of contractual employees, there are following kind of contractual employees:

- i) 39 contractual employees (presently 36) whose case is detailed at succeeding paras are on the following terms and condition of service:
  - a) 33 contractual employees at BP + DA @ 7% (whose appointment under one-time absorption at university was cancelled)
  - b) 03 contractual employees at BP + DA @ 7% +HRA (whose appointment under one-time absorption at university was cancelled)
- 24 employees are presently working on six months' contract.

- 2. The case of one-time absorption of these employees was examined by the Law, Justice and Legislative Affairs Department, govt. of NCT of Delhi and DHE, Govt. of NCT and their appointment have been found "void ab initio and non-est in the eyes of law from their very inception itself." The Report of the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of NCT of Delhi, along with the observations of the Law, Justice and Legislative Affairs Department, Govt. of NCT of Delhi, was placed before the 30th meeting of Board of Management of the University held on 03.02.2021. The Board of Management has resolved inter alia as under:
  - "(i) Offer of Appointment / Appointment letters so issued to the employees under onetime Absorption / regularization of Non-Teaching staff on contract / deputation at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi be cancelled.
  - (ii) Upon the cancellation of the said offer of Appointment / Appointment letters, the status quo ante i.e. the employees appointed on contractual basis shall continue as such as per their initial contractual appointment till the posts are filled by regular appointments following due procedure for the same...".
- 3. Accordingly, the offers of appointment issued to the employees under one-time absorption was cancelled vide letter dated 06.02.2021. The status quo ante i.e. the employees appointed on contractual basis have continued as such as per their initial contractual appointment till the posts are filled by regular appointments following due procedure for the same.
- 4. The brief of the status of 39 employees (presently 36 employees as 01 Expired, 01 Retired and 01 Resigned), whose one-time absorption was cancelled, is as under:
  - (i) As per terms and conditions of offer of appointment, issued to these 33 employees in 2017, the pay of these employees was fixed at the initial pay of the Pay Level applicable to the post held by them plus applicable DA in terms of Finance (Accounts) Department guidelines vide O.M. No.F.20/40/2016-AC/DSFA/16-45 dated 20.01.2017.
  - (ii) After cancellation of absorption, 33 employees are getting minimum of the pay or the first level of the Pay Matrix applicable to the respective post + DA @ 7%, which is status quo ante.
  - (iii)After cancellation of absorption, 03 employees are getting minimum of the pay or the first level of the Pay Matrix applicable to the respective post + DA @ 7% + HRA which is status quo ante. These three employees are Dr. Sunita Tyagi, Shri Ramiz Kazmi and Shri Mukesh Singh Dangi.
- 5. Aggrieved by the above decision, 34 employees out of 39 employees filed a Writ Petition (Civil) No.1746/2021 titled as Yusuf Raza Naqvi & Ors Vs. Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi. The case is still pending and next date of hearing is 28.07.2023.

Aggrieved by the above decision, Dr. Sunita Tyagi filed a Writ Petition (Civil) No.2881/2022 titled as Dr. (Smt.) Sunita Tyagi Vs. Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi. The case is still pending and next date of hearing is 12.07.2023.

Aggrieved by the above decision, Shri Ravinder Rawat filed a Writ Petition (Civil) No.4677/2021 titled as Ravinder Rawat Vs. Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi. The case is still pending and next date of hearing is 28.07.2023.

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Aggrieved by the above decision, Shri Mukesh Singh Dangi filed a Writ Petition (Civil) No.4736/2021 titled as Mukesh Singh Dangi Vs. Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University Delhi. The case is still pending and next date of hearing is 28.07.2023.

- 6. Many of the employees have submitted representation in the University requesting implementation of dearness allowance rates as revised by Govt. of NCT of Delhi.
- It is submitted that vide letter dated 02.02.2022, the University requested for opinion to the University Counsel stating that "...the contract was for a period of one year and the employees were drawing the basic of the grade pay plus DA (the then rate). As per the directions of BoM, status quo ante is maintained..."

In this regards, the legal opinion obtained from University Counsel dated 04.02.2022, is reproduced as under:

"Hence these employees are required to be retained on the same contractual terms and conditions as on the date of the said order dated 10.02.2021".

- 8. It is submitted that another category of employees who were on long term contract and now working on six-month contract are getting minimum of the pay or the first level of the Pay Matrix applicable to the respective post + current rate of DA.
- 9. The Board of Management in 40<sup>th</sup> meeting of the BoM vide agenda Item No.40.20 "to report the fresh contract of 6 months tenure to long term contractual employees", resolved as under:
  - ".....emphasized the University to adhere with the guidelines issued by the Govt. of NCT of Delhi for consolidated remuneration to the contractual employees and as notified from time to time".
- 10. The relevant portion of the O.M. No. F.20/40/2016-AC/DSFA/16-45 dated 20.01.2017 is reproduced herein under:
- "...the consolidated remuneration payable to the persons engaged on contract basis against sanctioned vacant post with the approval of competent authority shall be calculated on the basis of minimum of pay or the first level- the pay matrix applicable to the respective post + DA, so as to ensure that the remuneration payable to the persons engaged on contract basis is on uniform rate. This shall remain same till the expiry of the contract period. However, such consolidated remuneration can be revised by adding revised DA at each occasion of fresh contract...."
- 11. The matter inter-alia with detailed facts as above was placed before Finance Committee for perusal of the representation submitted and for further deliberation. If agreed to, the Finance Committee was requested to consider recommending the annual financial implications of Rs.19,45,548/-.

Decision: After due deliberations, the Finance Committee recommended that the request of the mentioned employees may be considered only if they opt for 6-monthly renewal of contracts as per applicable GNCTD O.M. No. F.20/40/2016-AC/DSFA/16-45 dated 20.01.2017. The recommendations of the Finance Committee may be submitted to the Board of Management for consideration and approval.

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## Table Item No.33.12:To consider the Guidelines for Student Travel Grant.

The travel grant scheme is for providing financial assistance to the students of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi to participate in Seminar/Conference/Workshop/Paper and Poster Presentation.

#### Eligibility:

- 1. All <u>BA + MA (Group 1) and MPhil + PhD (Group 2)</u> students of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi are eligible to apply for the grant.
- 2. A travel grant under this fund will be made available to **Group 1** and **Group 2** as per the following norms:
- (a) For International travel only once during the student's term in a BA + MA degree programme or MPhil + PhD programme of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi;
- (b) Twice for national travel during the student's term for Group 2 students (MPhil + PhD); once for Group 1 students (BA+ MA).
- 3. Grants will be given only if the student's academic work in the form of a paper or article (or an equivalent in the case of students of SCCE, SDes) has been accepted for presentation or poster presentation by an external organization of academic reputation. Grants under this fund may not be used for any other purpose.
- 4. The student must be active in research and/or must demonstrate innovative work in the subject area with a good academic record.
- 5. The scheme is applicable for participation in Seminar/Conference/Workshop/Paper and Poster Presentation.
- 6. The proposal for attending any Short Term/Long Term training course(s) within or outside the country shall not be considered under this scheme.

#### Procedure:

- 1) The student should apply to the Dean of the School through the Programme Coordinator at least 2 months in advance of the event in the prescribed form.
- 2) The request of the student shall be duly verified by the Programme Coordinator and the School Dean. If required, the Dean may seek advice on this 'subject experts' within Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi.
- 3) The Dean will forward the recommendation to the Committee operating within the office of Student Services for a final decision, subject to availability of funds.
- 4) The Students who will be given travel grant will have to submit a report to the Dean of School and those who will be availing travel grant for International visits will have to give a seminar after they return.

**Financial Assistance:** 

The financial assistance under the Travel Grant shall be admissible on reimbursement basis as per the recommendations of the Standing Committee Student Travel Grant constituted by the Competent Authority.

The students are required to invariably adhere to the following instructions/guidelines, failing which their claims for reimbursements shall summarily be rejected:

1) Booking of tickets through any agency other than those mentioned above is not permissible.

2) While submitting the reimbursement claims of travel, the students are required to attach a printout of the rate chart of the air fare applicable on the date of journey taken from the official website at the time of booking of tickets.

## Release of Travel Grant:

The applicant shall submit the claim for the expenditure incurred duly forwarded by the concerned Dean of the School along with copies of the following documents:

- 1) Claim should be submitted to the Dean of School in the prescribed form. (Student Travel Grant Reimbursement Form)
- 2) Statement of expenditure along with the copy of journey tickets (Original Boarding passes are required in case of travel by Air/Original Train tickets)
- 3) The Students who will be given travel grant will have to submit a report to the Dean of School and those who will be availing travel grant for International visits will have to give a seminar after they return.
- 4) Receipt of the Registration Fee in original issued by the Organizers
- 5) Voucher/Bank Certificate indicating the rate at which foreign currency is purchased, if applicable.
- 6) Certificate of attendance/participation issued by the organizers.

In case the claim for releasing of Travel Grant is not submitted in the prescribed format along with the aforesaid relevant documents duly attested by the Student/Faculty Supervisor/Dean, the grant will not be released. The sanctioned amount shall be reimbursed to the applicant through RTGS in the bank account of the student on receipt of all the required documents duly forwarded by the Dean of the School. All the documents should be submitted to the office of Dean of School within one month of the return journey.

The students should also submit details of their Bank Account No., Address of Bank, IFSC Code, a copy of passbook/cancelled cheque for transferring the sanctioned amount of grant.

The matter was placed before Finance Committee for consideration.

Decision: The Finance Committee recommended the proposal for consideration and approval by the Board of Management.

Table Item No.33.13:To consider the revised policy of scholarship (w.e.f. Academic Year 2022-23)

The Board of Management (BoM) in its 43rd meeting held on 20th January 2023 resolved to approve the fresh policy of scholarship to be awarded to student's w.e.f. Academic Year 2022-23.

The revised policy is as below:

- A. 10% of the fee collected (Tuition Fee) from students in a programme during each semester be set aside for scholarship.
- B. Academic Merit Scholarships of Rs.8,000/- to Rs.14,000/- each to be awarded to students in terms of their performance in the semesters, provided that such students have

obtained a minimum grade of A or above. Accordingly, the scholarship may be awarded as per table below:-

Grade Point	Scholarship Range
O (Outstanding)	Rs.12,000/- to Rs.14,000/-
A Plus (A+) (Excellent)	Rs.10,000/- to Rs.12,000/-
A (Very Good)	Rs.5,000/- to Rs.8,000/-

- C. Academic Progress Scholarships may be awarded to students who attain substantial progress in their additional effort and motivation. Scholarship of Rs.8,000/- each may be awarded to students who have made maximum progress compared to the previous semester by showing at least 'one grade progress', provided that they have obtained a minimum of B Plus (B+) as the cumulative grade points in the programme of study.
- D. Some programmes may experience difficulty in strictly following the proposed norms of awarding scholarship as per range detailed above either due to lack of sufficient funds or due to large number of students falling within the class in terms of their academic performance; the amount may be lowered as per the availability of funds.
- E. The scholarship norms 'be reviewed every five years'.

The matter was placed before the finance committee for consideration.

Decision: After due deliberations, the Finance Committee suggested that the University may review the proposal.

# Table Item No.33.14:To consider the contingency fund for non-net research scholars

In the meeting of 3rd Academic Council held on 10.12.2012, Standing Committee of Research had put up the agenda regarding Contingency Fund to research scholars with the subject "To consider the proposal to award stipends to MPhil/PhD students at par with the UGC scheme for Central Universities". In the meeting of 4th Academic Council held on 10.07.2013, the same has been recorded. As the Academic Council had approved the contingency fund, the reimbursement is being paid to the research scholars.

However, as per noting of Finance Division in this matter "The minutes of 3rd Academic Council have been ratified in 13th Board of Management held on 11.02.2013. However, it was approved that the stipend be awarded to the non-net students at par with UGC scheme. In 27th Meeting of Board of Management, the stipend was increased to Rs. 16,000/- and Rs. 10,000/- which is at double the rates what UGC is awarding. Therefore, separate approval for payment of contingency needs to be taken from Finance Committee and Board of Management, as the rates of stipend are higher than what UGC is offering. Also there is no reference of contingency in the 27th meeting of Board of Management."

In view of the above, the matter was placed before the upcoming Finance Committee to adopt the contingency norms retrospectively issued by the UGC from time to time.

Decision: After due deliberations, the Finance Committee recommended that the contingency to non-net scholars may not be allowed.

The committee further deliberated on the revision of fee structure for the academic year 2023-24 and recommends an increase in application fee and tuition fees by 10% for the academic year 2023-2024. This increase of tuition fee in the academic year 2023-24 is recommended on the grounds that the tuition fees has not been enhanced for the two consecutive academic years (i.e. 2020-21 and 2021-22) due to outbreak of COVID-19 and considering the economic hardship faced by the students.

Accordingly, the committee decided to enhance the Application fees, tuition fees (UG, PG, & PhD) & dissertation fees (PhD) for academic year 2023-2024 as detailed below: -

a. Application fees to be enhanced by 10% for General/D-OBC(NCL) rounded off to nearest multiple of 50 & application fees for the EWS/SC/ST/PwBD candidates to be enhanced by 10% rounded off to nearest multiple of 25.

Guidelines for providing free sanitary pads.

A REPORT ON PROVIDING FREE SANITARY PADS FACILITY TO STUDENTS OF UNIVERSITY

Introduction: The facility for providing free sanitary napkins for the girl student has become one of the most important features of every educational institution, as inadequate menstrual hygiene management has been a major roadblock to education, with many girls missing out on their important classes and other academic and cultural activities due to a lack of access to sanitation facilities and products and the stigma associated with menstruation. In the light of the above genuine reasons, the medical officers put the agenda in front of the duly constituted Sub Purchase Committee for arranging a Sanitary Napkin Vending machine and free distribution of sanitary pads to the students of university and with the approval of the committee the said machine was procured.

A sanitary napkin vending machine is installed at Dr. M.A. Ansari Health Center, J.M.I. since July 2020 and provides sanitary napkins free of charge to the university students.

Funding of the Policy: The said machine was procured form the approved budget head "Student Medical Aid"- Recurring- General (2019-2020) and the ongoing purchase of sanitary pads have been procured from Contingencies head of expenditure.

### Management and Distribution:

Since July 2020, a sanitary napkin vending machine has been set up in the women's washroom at Dr. M.A. Ansari Health Center. The machine offers sanitary pads for no charge in exchange for the insertion of a token provided by the nursing staff of the health center.

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- Proper information is being displayed regarding the availability of token and napkin vending machines at the nursing station of the health center.
- Sanitary pads are being procured from the concerned vendor from time to time.

- Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Delhi (AUD) was established in 2007 by the Government of the National Capital Territory of Delhi (GNCTD) through an Act of Legislature and fully funded by the government. The University is presently functioning from four campuses located at Kashmere Gate, Karampura , Lodhi Road and Qutub Campus.
- 2. The University Environment Management Committee (EMC) considering the good number of female students and also in order to minimize the hazards caused due to lack of proper disposal ways of sanitary pads, initiated the proposal for installation of Sanitary Napkin vending machine and incinerator at appropriate locations on the University campus mainly in the female washrooms in the year 2016-17. The replenishment of the Sanitary pads has been carrying out by the University and the users were availing the facility from the sanitary pad vending machine on inserting 05 Rupee coin at each time. The procurement cost of one sanitary pad is Rs.4.85 only (Based on the last procurement made). This means that no extra financial recurring burden was on the University budget on account of procurement of the sanitary pads for replenishments to the sanitary pad vending machine.
- 3. The student of the University has now been demanding free sanitary pads and the finance representative of GNCTD posted at University has opined that any such proposal having financial implications out of GIA must have the prior concurrence and approval from the GNCTD.
