Dr B.R. Ambedkar Memorial Lecture Series was established in 2009 by the Ambedkar University Delhi. Under this series, an eminent scholar or public personality from among the best minds across the world is invited annually to share his/her thoughts and reflections through a public lecture, particularly in areas of knowledge and human experience such as democracy, constitutional law, equity, social justice, social transformation, social action and engaged spiritualities.



Professor Bhikhu Parekh is Emeritus Professor of Political Philosophy at the universities of Hull and Westminster in the U.K. He was until recently Centennial Professor at the London School of Economics, and has been a visiting professor at the universities of McGill, Harvard, Pennsylvania, Paris and Barcelona. He was Vice – Chancellor of the M.S. University of Baroda between 1981 and 1984. He is the author of several widely acclaimed books in political philosophy including, Gandhi (Oxford University Press), Rethinking Multiculturalism (Harvard University Press), and New Politics of Identity (Macmillan).

Professor Parekh is the recipient of many honours in India and Britain. He has received Padma Bhushan and Pravasi Bharatiya Samman from the President of India. He was appointed a life peer in 2000 as Baron Parekh, of Kingston upon Hull in the East Riding of Yorkshire. He has received BBC's Special Lifetime Achievement Award for Asians, Sir Isaiah Berlin Prize for Lifetime Contribution to Political Philosophy, and a Distinguished Global Thinker Award. He is also a Fellow of the British Academy, and the Royal Society of Arts, and was until recently President of the Academy of Social Sciences.

The Bharat Ratna Dr B.R. Ambedkar Vishwavidyalaya (Ambedkar University, Delhi or AUD) was established by the Government of the National Capital Territory of Delhi through an Act of Legislature in 2007.
